*Father Phil's Ramblings*

As we begin our new school and fiscal year, I believe it is very important to give you a brief 'state of the parish' report. So this weekend I will be speaking at all the masses for a few minutes and yes, part of the talk will center on the financial condition of the parish. I admit I'm hopeful I can convince you to increase your Sunday donations. Revenue has been decreasing while operating costs continue to rise. The reasons for our rising costs are many.

First and most important, in the same way that a homeowner has to maintain his or her home, we must do the same to St. Juliana, our spiritual 'home'. Lately we have been making repairs to both our school and parish buildings. Unless we make such repairs, our buildings will deteriorate and become unsafe, unsightly, and more costly to repair in the long run.

Secondly, we have a large and well-grounded staff that helps serve the parish community. We are blessed to have two full-time associate pastors in Fr. Bob Grib and Fr. Mike McGovern. Many parishes throughout the diocese have been forced to cut back on staff due to a lack of revenue. Making such decisions is very painful but necessary, and we're fortunate -- thus far -- not to have been put in that uncomfortable position here at St. Juliana.

At our recent finance committee meeting a new member was surprised to learn that 87% of our total revenue is retained to keep the parish operating. If he was surprised, there may be many others who also believe that large sums of money are 'sent downtown'. Another figure shared at the meeting was the steady decrease in offertory collections over the past 3 years. Between this decrease and the escalating costs of repairs and salaries, we were under-budgeted to the tune of \$65,000 last year.

Therefore, one of my reasons for speaking to the parish this weekend is to beg you to increase your Sunday offertory by \$2 per week, per family.

We share our weekly collections in the bulletin, and they average \$16,000 per week. If that could be brought up to \$18,500 per week, we would balance our budget. We have 1,200 families who regularly use their weekly envelopes, and if each family increased their Sunday offering at least \$2 per week, our revenue would return to averaging \$18,500 weekly.

Special kudos to the Steak Fry committee. Our annual Steak Fry is the parish 'kick-off' to another school year. You guys do a great job each and every year! So thank you for this weekend and I hope that someone who needs a car, wins that beautiful Cruiser.

Finally, a member of the parish Blood Drive committee asked me to make a special plea for volunteers to give blood next weekend, September 21st. There is always a great need for blood and your willingness to give blood will help keep the blood banks running.

So remember September 21st -- St. Juliana Blood Drive. The vampire speaks!

## “Show No Partiality”

St. James writes for our times, doesn't he?

“For if a man with gold rings and fine clothes comes into your assembly, and a poor person in shabby clothes also comes in, and you pay attention to the one wearing the fine clothes and say, ‘sit here, please,’ while you say to the poor one, ‘stand there’ or ‘sit at my feet,’ have you not made distinctions among yourselves and become judges with evil designs?”

This was a very, very touchy point with Jesus, because he seemed to prefer the “common folk.” Was He, perhaps, more at home with them because of His own origins? Whatever! Jesus did seem to gravitate toward the ordinary people. He even calls out “Woe!” to “you who are rich and now...you who are full now...you who laugh now... you who are spoken well of now.”

Jesus also said: “It’s easier for a camel to pass through the Eye of the Needle (a very narrow gateway in Jerusalem) than for a rich person to enter the kingdom.”

Even the followers of Jesus exclaimed: “Then, who can be saved!?”

James in his letter to the early Church gives us consolation in knowing that it is not the mere possession of wealth that condemns a person. “Partiality” is what raises the problem for us as individuals, a parish, a community, a nation, a geographic area of the world. “Show no partiality,” advises James; don’t play favorites when it comes to social status, respecting people, greeting them, not generalizing about them, not generalizing about them, not paying attention to how they are dressed or “ornamented.”

Ah, but we carry around with us the “baggage” of our respective cultures and families. Most of it is good and enables us to move smoothly through life and interact with people. But some of it leads to a sense of “partiality” which tends to isolate us from others and others from us. Wealth, economic success, living in a certain neighborhood, sending our children to a certain school or college, being a “mover and/or shaker,” all these things can lead us to “life in the partial lane,” as we might say. Almost before we realize it, others are judged by norms we have imbibed from the entertainment media, then news media, or family prejudices (“pre-judgments”). It almost begins to seem “natural,” to fit.”

It’s a struggle to remain “impartial” on the level of peoples and societies. It’s always been hard to do. Even James writes in the first century: “Listen, my beloved brothers and sisters. Did not God choose those who are poor in the world to be rich in faith and heirs of the kingdom that he promised to those who love him?”

## Helps For Prayer



Developing a regular habit of prayer is part of our Christian life yet sometimes finding the time or the quiet for prayer can be a challenge. Here are some suggestions that might be helpful for developing your prayer life:

**Monday Evenings:** Each Monday evening at 7:00 pm a group of parishioners gather for prayer before the Blessed Sacrament in the chapel. Beginning September 8, I'll open the prayer time with a brief reflection about the person of Jesus Christ and how we can know Him better. There will be 20 to 25 minutes of silent prayer, followed by the opportunity to pray the rosary. If you can't remain for the full hour, try coming for fifteen minutes of half an hour.

**Books That Help You Pray:** St. Juliana has many good books about prayer and the spiritual life located in the library in the vestibule of the church. I've placed twenty books on a shelf marked "prayer". Stop in on Sunday and browse through the titles. All are welcome to borrow books for three weeks. I've found books by John O'Malley, S.J., Thomas Green, S.J. and William Barry, S.J. very helpful. Take a look and see what might be useful for you.

**Prayer And The Internet:** Helpful aids to prayer can also be found on the internet. I highly recommend a website developed by the Irish Jesuits, [www.sacredspace.ie](http://www.sacredspace.ie). In recent years this website has received 7 million hits. Following the format is simple, taking about ten minutes to lead you through a prayerful reflection. High school and college students will find this a great help for praying at anytime day or night.

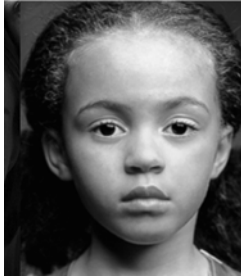

The expression "911 call" will always remind her of that morning. At 8:37 a.m. Central Time the telephone rang. It was Mark calling from Brooklyn. "Hi, Mom." "Mark! How sweet of you to call me on my birthday!" "Oh, yeah. Happy birthday. Are you watching the news?" "No, why?" "I'm looking out my apartment window. I can see--and smell--the World Trade Center towers burning."

Even now, two years later, it is all too easy for us to feel afraid and vengeful when we think of the lives that were lost on 9/11/2001. Yet, today's Scriptures simply will not allow it. The first reading calls out to us: "Be strong, fear not! Here is your God [who] comes to save you." The psalm praises the Lord who "sets free, raises up, protects, and sustains" all who are in need. In the Gospel God's glorious power works through Jesus. Finally, the letter of James issues a 9-1-1 call to all of us. God saved us through baptism; now we must "adhere to the faith" and come to the rescue of all the "poor ones" in our midst.

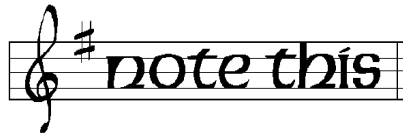


