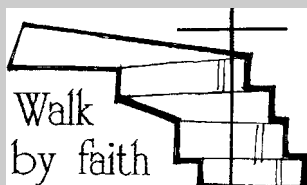

✦ Last Sunday, I spoke at all the Masses regarding the financial condition of our parish. In the days immediately following 9/11, I recall that many people went to local hospitals to donate blood. We forget that in ordinary times blood banks are perpetually in need of donations. We do not need a disaster to need blood. Please take a few minutes out of your day to help save a life.

## Exaltation of the Holy Cross

There's lots of controversy surrounding Mel Gibson's soon-to-be-released film about the Passion of Jesus Christ. It will be unusual in that the original languages of the time of Jesus will be used: Romans speaking Latin and the Jews speaking Aramaic. One of the issues people are taking exception to is the very graphic depiction of the torture and sufferings of Jesus. Some people think it will stir up anti-Jewish feelings. There are efforts to block the release of the film, some critics labeling it as too "fundamentalist" in tone and presentation, and others claiming that it makes the Jews look as if all of them, as a nation, repudiated Jesus.

Whatever be the case, Mr. Gibson seems to be doing nothing more than what others are doing on T.V. with their various "reality" programs. How utterly strange that we can be subjected to literal sex, literal promiscuity, literal feats of human endurance and, in some cases, human inanity, but find it hard to stomach the reality of what crucifixion and pre-crucifixion was all about 2000 years ago.

To show the death of Jesus as a real event with all its real, historical trappings of language and culture seems to fit right into our present age's thirst for the literal, the real.

45 years ago, when I began my novitiate with the Jesuits in Milord, Ohio, I came across a book, the title of which was something like: "A Doctor Looks at Calvary." It was written by a medical doctor who was attempting to analyze the "real" physical sufferings of Jesus. It was, as I remember - it must have had quite an effect on me to preserve its memory even after 45 years! - a fascinating book. Far from being a pious reflection on the internal sufferings of Jesus, it tried to explain the various stresses and strains on the body of Jesus, from the scourging to His last asphyxiated moments hanging on the cross.

To a believer, an 18 year old believer at that, the sufferings of Jesus became real, human pain, helplessness, and insult. Why would God choose to do it "this way"? Die like us, yes; but why this terrible painful, de-humanized way? Abandoned by His closest friends, stripped naked, beaten black and blue, pushed to the ground, kicked, and finally stretched out on two pieces of wood, tied and hammered, what was the point of it? Die, if you must, Jesus-God, but at least die with dignity!

How many sick and infirm people have said to me: "Father, I appreciate your compassion and concern, but you really don't know what I'm going through these days!" When we are sick-perhaps even unto death - the temptation is there to think that no one really understands what we are going through, "from the inside," as it were.

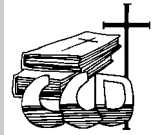
But there is Jesus; **THERE** is Jesus! **THERE** at the crosses of our lives stands Jesus. He does know what we are going through. He says to us: "Been there; done that!" In this paradoxical existence of ours, life is experienced only after passing through death. Jesus did it "the hard way" so that we would know the faith in God's love for us is the key: "Now my heart is troubled - and what shall I say? Shall I say, 'Father do not let this hour come upon me?' But that is why I came - so that I might go through this hour of suffering. Father, bring glory to your name," prays Jesus.

"Then a voice spoke from heaven, 'I have brought glory to it, and I will do so again, and again, and again, in the lives and deaths of all my children'".

Pardon me for presuming to add a bit to John's Gospel (chapter 12m vss, 27 - 28).

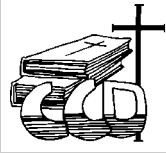

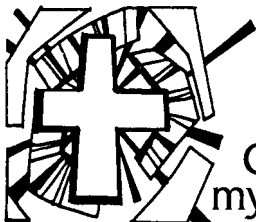

### **BEING LIFTED UP**

In today's Gospel, Jesus reminds Nicodemus how Moses had "lifted up the serpent in the desert." Then Jesus says, "So must the Son of Man be lifted up, that all who believe may have eternal life in him." The evangelist clearly saw this "lifting up" of Jesus to mean his crucifixion.

That "lifting up" of the serpent by Moses is described in today's first reading. The people were attacked by "saraph serpents," and many died. God had Moses make an image of the serpent and put it on a pole and lift it up. The people who had been bitten looked at it and recovered.

Jesus "emptied himself, taking the form of a slave." Lifted up on the cross, he was despised and seemed the most abject of people. But it was in embracing this disgrace and painful death that he became the bearer of eternal life for all of us. His "lifting up" in shame was also his "lifting up" in glory and triumph.
