“You Are My Beloved Son/Daughter: With You I Am Well Pleased”

I wonder when I stopped being cute? When people stopped “ooooohing” and “aaaahing” over my simplest, most ordinary accomplishments: toothlessly smiling, gurgling, walking a few stumbling paces, waving my hands in obvious delight in the direction of an adult person, babbling incoherently to the pride of relatives standing around, their attention fastened on my slightest mood-swing.

When did I stop being “such a pretty baby,” such and intelligent little man,” “such a darling baby”? When did I begin to feel like some sort of “unfinished symphony”? When did the “ooooohs” and “aaaaahs” fade into the background to be replaced by: “We have great expectations of you. You have so much potential; what a pity if you do not use it all!”

Now that’s an obvious exaggeration, but I must admit that sometimes I am very dissatisfied with myself, with what I have been able to accomplish in my 63 years. I am so in need of the affirmation of friends and family. Sometimes, I hanker after those days long ago when even a baby-sneeze or a drunken few steps taken with my baby-bowled legs could evoke rapturous comments from Mom, Dad and others.

When did it begin? The reminders that: “You’re a big boy now, Bobby. Big boys don’t cry over a little ‘ouchie’ like that; “You can handle that, Bob. You’re an adult and have plenty of resources, C’mon! Get your act together.”

Of late, I have been on a quest, the spiritual dimensions of which go so deep and are so salvific that I wonder whether I have the courage to surrender to it. I think what I would like to hear in the depths of my heart are the words Jesus heard as He ascended from the waters of the Jordan River. As a 63 year old adult, I think I want to hear God say to me: **“You are my dear son; with you I am well pleased.”**

And you know how I want to hear that? I want to hear it the way I used to hear all those wonderful comments when I was a child. Not that I am the center of the universe or the most “perfect” baby-child-teen-young adult-adult-old adult in the world. I just want to experience that what my beloved parents and relatives and neighbors said to me and of me was really true: is really true.

It’s God Father-Mother saying deep in my heart: **“You are my beloved, Bob. I loved you into existence and love you with an everlasting love. You are the best Bob Grib that I have created.”** I would like to hear that more loudly than my self-doubts about my worth, productivity, or image; more loudly than my self-recriminations that I am not the person I should be. I would like to nestle in your arms, O God Father-Mother, and feel that your love for me is greater than my greatest unworthiness; that, in some strange way that only a Father or Mother can know, even my sins call forth your love and compassion and you hold me tighter in your embrace and will let nothing separate me from your love - your abiding love.

You are my beloved Father-Mother God: With You I am Well Pleased!
How could the feelings not be mutual, O God of my heart?!

Deposits for the trip are due by January 20th.

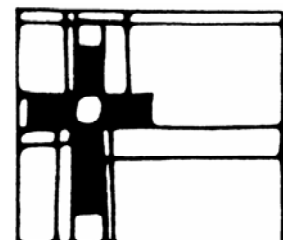
Youth Mass

Archdiocese of Chicago

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

You have heard and read much over the last two years about the Church's response to the tragedy of child sexual abuse by Catholic clergy. Now, two comprehensive national reports concerning this tragedy will finally be issued by the U.S. Catholic Conference of Bishops' Office of Child and Youth Protection and the National Review Board in Washington, D.C. I know the information contributed by the Archdiocese of Chicago to each report, but I do not have and have not seen the final comprehensive reports. I am looking forward to the information and perspective these reports are expected to provide.

Let me update you on what I know now:

On Tuesday, January 6, the first national report will be issued and will detail the findings of an independent compliance audit of every Catholic diocese and eparchy in the U.S. The audits were commissioned by the Office of Child and Youth Protection and conducted between June and November of 2003 by The Gavin Group, an independent firm, in order to assure the compliance of dioceses with the articles of the bishops' Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People. The report covers the period between June 2002 (when all U.S. Bishops approved the Charter in Dallas) and November 2003, and will contain an overview of the Charter, individual audit summaries for each diocese, a summary of the trends of the findings, and some recommendations for next steps. The Archdiocese of Chicago underwent the audit process during the last week of July and was found to be in compliance with the Charter. We will be able to offer further specifics about our individual archdiocesan audit when the entire report is released on January 6. Our archdiocesan audit report will be published in *The Catholic New World* and posted on our website (www.archchicago.org).

In coming weeks, I will share additional information about a second national report, a statistical survey concerning child sexual abuse by Catholic clergy over the past 50 years, known as the John Jay Study. It is scheduled to be released on Friday, February 27. This report will offer aggregate data and statistics from all U.S. dioceses related to child sexual abuse allegations made since the 1950s. It is designed to provide us all with the base-line national data which will help us better understand the causes of the scandal.

I ask that you continue to pray for all who been victimized by sexual abuse and for all those affected by this scandal. You and those you love are daily in my prayers; please keep me in yours.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Merry Christmas! Share that cheerful greeting with some folks today. They may wonder if you have had any Elvis sightings lately, attended Star Trekkie conventions, or were Cleopatra in a previous lifetime. Despite the skeptics, today is solidly within the Christmas season. In fact, in some strands of the Christian tradition it represents the clearest manifestation of the mystery of the Incarnation. On Christmas Day, for example, the Gospel reading is the Prologue of John's Gospel, which reveals the glory of Christ shining through our humanity precisely in his baptism.

At any rate, this is an ancient feast, celebrated first in Egypt sixteen centuries ago. More than most other ancient people, the Egyptians understood the life-giving properties of water. On this day, they drew water from the Nile, so central in the history of their people, and reserved it in honor. Many other places copied the custom, so that St. John Chrysostom wrote of people in Antioch gathering at midnight to collect flowing water into vessels they brought from home since "today there is a blessing on the water." At home for dinner tonight, decorate the table with beautiful bowls of water and white candles, toast one another with goblets of sparkling water, and light a Christmas candle in the window one last time.

CALLED TO SERVE

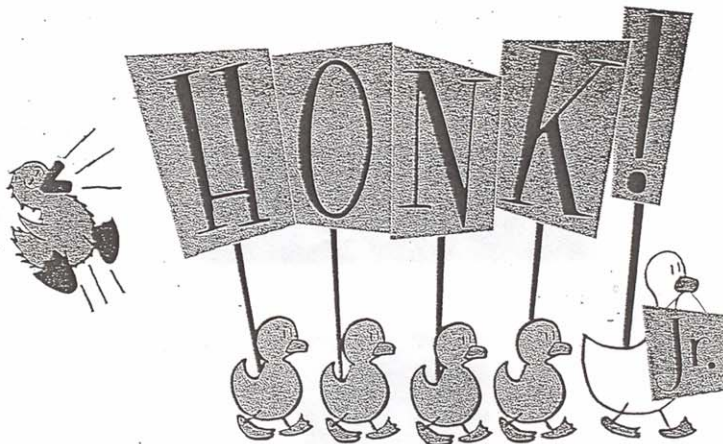
For many weeks now, we have been celebrating the appearance of the divine presence in human form. As a child, he came to Mary and Joseph, was seen by the shepherds, and then by some wandering magi from the East. Today we celebrate another showing, later in time, to a group gathered at the Jordan River.

John hesitated to baptize Jesus, whom he recognized as "one mightier than I." But he did as Jesus asked, and the "Holy Spirit descended" and heaven's voice spoke to Jesus, "You are my beloved Son." Jesus was beginning his public life of teaching and service. Soon he would start calling others to join him.

Peter was one of the first to be called by Jesus. In today's second reading, he announces the heart of the message, "peace through Jesus Christ, who is Lord of all." Peter was called, and you and I are called to spread that message and to serve God's word.
