*Father Phil's Ramblings*

Last week, we had our scheduled meeting for the parents of our second graders who will be receiving their First Holy Communion on Saturday, April 24th. We try to make the meeting into an adult session and provide an opportunity for parents to deepen their faith and love of the Eucharist. As adults, we take so much of our faith for granted.

Over the years, our faith and the practice of our faith (the reception of sacraments and participation at Sunday Eucharist) become very familiar. Even as a priest for nearly 43 years, the mystery of the Eucharist is one that continues to humble me. Celebrating the Mass and saying the words of consecration are not only a privilege, but also a daily challenge of faith in God's presence in my life.

As humans, it is difficult for us to fully comprehend the meaning of the ultimate mystery: God's real presence in the Eucharist. All of us who respond 'Amen' to the Body of Christ at Communion must be willing to continue the daily work of discovering its full meaning. Our second graders, the children who come up to the altar at Communion, will have their arms folded as a sign to all of us that they are preparing to join us in this discovery.

On February 15 through 18, we will be holding our pre-Lenten parish mission. Scheduling the mission just before the start of Lent provides us with a way to get ready for Lent, itself a time of preparation. The theme of this year's mission centers around the Eucharist; God's real presence in each of us; God's real presence in the Word; and Christ's real presence in the Eucharist. Fr. Jim Michaletz C.S.V. will preach the mission on the evenings of February 16, 17 and 18. Each session begins at 7:00 PM in the church and will conclude by 8:00 PM.

Have you ever participated in one of our parish missions? I am sure you all have many excuses not to attend, and I offer you a little story in hopes of stirring your conscience and inspiring you to become involved in this very important event:

The story is about an older woman who was not Catholic, and she told her Catholic friends that if she believed what we believe -- in the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist -- she would get down on her hands and knees and crawl to the altar.

We do believe in the Real Presence. Our young First Holy Communicants are beginning their preparation for the Real Presence and they are excited, as we should be each and every time we approach the altar. Let us not let familiarity get in the way and allow us to make excuses. The parish mission should be our rediscovery of the mystery of God's real presence in the Eucharist.

Get excited! Discover! Come to the mission!

## “ A Faith-Filled Future”

“Jesus returned to Galilee in the power of the Spirit, and news of Him spread throughout the whole region. He taught in their synagogues and was praised by all...He came to Nazareth, where He had grown up, and went according to His custom into the synagogue on the Sabbath day...”

This coming week we are celebrating “Catholic Schools Week,” or as I like to think of it: “Catholic Education Week.” It’s multi-dimensional celebration involving families, teaching staffs, maintenance staffs, parish finance committees, parish councils, parishioners, and, of course, those to be educated. Teddy Roosevelt’s quote might aptly apply here: “The credit belongs to those who are actually in the arena, who strive valiantly; who know the great enthusiasms, the great devotions, and so spend themselves in a worthy cause...”

What more worthy cause than a faith-filled education to insure a faith-filled future for the world?

In today’s Good News, Jesus returns to His “neighborhood.” It’s the place where His relatives lived and He received His basic education - His “faith-filled education.” It obviously initially involved His Mom and Dad and family. A value system was presented to Jesus as the “right way” to live. It was not simply taught in formal sessions but through the lives which touched Him most intimately. But there must have been school, village places of learning, where Jesus went with His neighbor-friends. There must have been teachers, perhaps not very many of them, but people supported by the families of the locality. No doubt these teachers were people of proven faith and integrity - and, yes, wisdom.

People speak with pride of their education at St. Juliana school. “You know, father, I had all my early schooling here at St. Juliana’s. My parents studied here and even my grandparents!” Former students single out teachers who touched their lives in a special way, at a particularly difficult time of life, with a ready ear or with discipline compassionately administered.

Current and former teachers from St. Juliana speak with equal pride about their students and fellow-staff members. “Oh, my! She’s getting married tomorrow, I taught her in 4th grade. You know, Father, I pray for all the students I’ve ever taught here at St. Juliana. It’s such a thrill for me to meet them later as young adults or Moms and Dads of their own families!”

So here’s Jesus in Nazareth. Can you imagine what it was like for Him to return “home”? Mary would have been taking Him around by the hand to all their own neighbors and His old teachers, some of whom were probably retired by then. Local women “ooo’d and aaa’d”: “Oh Mary, what a nice young man your son turned out to be! We’re all so proud of Him. Little did the people of Nazareth know or realize that they all had a role to play in educating Jesus. He was theirs. To the more insightful among them it was clear: “The Spirit of the Lord is upon Him, because He has anointed Him to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent Him to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord.”

And maybe there were a very few who remembered Simeon, the old man - some called him a prophet - who said that Jesus would bring fame to Nazareth.

Many people said that **JESUS HAD A FAITH-FILLED FUTURE!**

### Retreat for High School Students:

the University of Notre Dame is sponsoring five-day retreats for high school students this summer (start dates 6/14, 6/21, 7/5, & 7/12). 400 high school students participate in each retreat on the university campus in South Bend. The retreat focuses on God’s call and unique vocation for each person, posing the question: ***How will your gifts change the world?***

One way we can help one another pray is by choosing one of the stations and preparing a piece of artwork expressing the action in the station (e.g. Jesus condemned to death, Simon of Cyrene helping Jesus carry the cross, etc.) Artwork could be in different mediums (e.g. charcoal, paints, photography). We’ll incorporate the art into our prayer service tentatively scheduled for Sunday, March 7th. Please let me know if you would be interested in helping put this together.

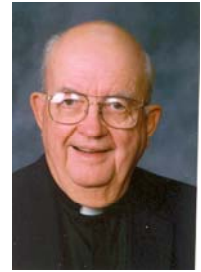
**TIME**

The holidays are well behind us; the year stretches out ahead. And what sort of year will it be? To judge by the words of Jesus in today's Gospel, it will be "a year acceptable to the Lord." And Jesus surely didn't mean only the next three hundred sixty-five days facing his listeners at that time.

When Jesus announced the "arrival" of God's favor, it was a message for all time, for every year. Similarly, we read today in Nehemiah how the people gathered with solemnity to hear God's word as though for the first time. They listened, and then fell to the ground and wept. But the prophet said, "Today is holy do not be sad, and do not weep."

The "year acceptable to the Lord" is this year. The day that is "holy" is this day. The time to listen is now. What sort of year will you have? What sort of day? God's help is always here. What you do with each day can be holy and acceptable to the Lord if you but listen to and act on God's word.

### 3 Year Old and 4 Year Old Preschool

The 3 year old preschool meets three days a week - Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays, from 8:15 am until 10:40 am. All children must be 3 years of age by September 1, 2004.

**Please bring the following items** (*certificates will be copied and returned at later date*) **for each child you are registering:**

- Original Birth Certificate (with birth number) - for Illinois, the number is on the upper right side and begins with 112 - followed by the year the child was born - followed by additional numbers.
- Baptismal Certificate
- Child's Social Security Card
- \$75 nonrefundable registration fee per child
- Church envelope

Admission into the St. Juliana Preschool Program requires parent participation in the program approximately six times a year. A parent may substitute with grandparents or other relatives.

The **4 year old preschool** meets five days a week either mornings or afternoons. The morning session is from 8:15 am until 10:40 am. The afternoon session from 12:15 am until 2:40 pm. All children must be four years of age by September 1, 2004.

**Please bring the following items** (*certificates will be copied and returned at a later date*) **for each child you are registering:**

- Original Birth Certificate (with birth number) - for Illinois, the number is on the upper right side and begins with 112 - followed by the year the child was born - followed by additional numbers.
- Baptismal Certificate

- \$75 nonrefundable registration fee per child
- Church envelope

Admission into the St. Juliana Preschool Program requires parent participation in the program approximately six times a year. Grandparents or other relatives may substitute for a parent. Extended Day is available for AM preschool students for an additional fee of \$125 a month.

### Kindergarten through 8th Grade

Children entering Kindergarten must be 5 years old by September 1, 2004; those entering first grade must be 6 years old by September 1, 2004; etc. The regular school day is 8:15 am until 2:40 pm. We offer a full-day and a half-day kindergarten program. Half-day students may be in the same classroom as the full-day students or in a half-day classroom. The number of students enrolled in the half-day program for a given year determines whether there will be a half-day classroom that year. Usually this decision is made by the end of June. Family tuition rates are available for families with more than one child attending St. Juliana School. New tuition rates will be available upon completion of the 2004-2005 parish budget process.
