Father Phil's Ramblings

To Live Forgiven:

Guilt is a universal experience; it can become the heaviest burden some people will ever bear. There are unhealthy, even destructive, ways of handling guilt.

We can try to deny it, but it will continue to burn inside us like a hidden fire. We can project it onto other people, blaming them, but this only involves others in guilt's destructiveness. We can punish ourselves, hoping to atone and find relief, but this usually does little more than complicate the situation.

Last Sunday's Gospel was the parable of the Prodigal Son. A story of God's great compassion for each of us. A story not of the Prodigal Son, but of the "Prodigal" Father. The wasteful Father who loves beyond our wildest imagination. Today's Gospel story of the woman taken in adultery is actually another way of showing God's compassion and forgiveness.

Jesus shifts through the hypocrisy and self-righteousness of the Pharisees and warns those who were judging, that they were in even greater danger of being judged themselves. He says, "Do not judge so that you may not be judged."

Finally Jesus stands alone with the woman. I am sure that she had to be self-conscious and afraid, but Jesus frees her to live forgiven. He asks her, "Woman, where are they who have condemned you?" Jesus' last words to her were full of compassion, neither condemning or condoning. "Go your way and from now on do not sin again."

During this Lenten season, may we seek forgiveness and may we remove the negative guilt that kills rather than heals. God's forgiveness is always available. We must first recognize our sinfulness and then seek God's forgiveness.

On Monday, April 5th, we will have our parish penance services at 1:30 PM and 7:00 PM. Sacramentally we seek God's forgiveness, not with an unhealthy guilt-ridden spirit, but honestly and truthfully admit we do sin.

Then we can live forgiven!

Sez God Through Isaiah: "See, I Am Doing Something New!"

Sez Paul: "...Forgetting what lies behind but straining forward to what lies ahead, I continue my pursuit toward the goal, the prize of God's upward calling, in Christ Jesus."

Sez Jesus to the woman in today's Gospel: "Neither do I condemn you. Go, and from now on do not sin any more."

"Go and do not sin any more!?" easy for Jesus to say. He only had to live for 33 years with His personality traits and habitual ways of doing things! Some youngster comes up to me and says: "Look, Father Bob! I'm doing something new!" A fellow Jesuit in my support group tells me: "Bob, forget what lies behind, strain forward to what lies ahead; pursue the goal!" I stand, battered and bruised from the goings-on of my 64 years of life and I hear Jesus say: "I don't condemn you, Bob, but I've told you, time and again not to sin any more. Watsamatta? You don't get the message!?"

We're more than half-way through Lent and I'm still trying to get in gear. So many things in me need to be "worked on." Where to begin? But then again, maybe it's not so much getting myself in gear as putting myself into "neutral" so the Spirit can do the "shifting." That means I have to come to a stop before I can sense where the Spirit might want to "drive" me.

Perhaps coming to a stop would be "something new" for me. Remember the old adage which we were taught as children? I think it was connected with railroad-crossings, but it probably applied to street crossings, too.

STOP! LOOK! LISTEN! Reminds me of Robert Fulgrum's book which was entitled something like: Everything I needed for life I learned in kindergarten. How true, how true! Remember the "pauses" that refreshed; those times, only a few minutes, when we were instructed to put our heads in our arms on our little desks, close our eyes, and rest. Now when I rest, I need things to rest with: T.V., a book, some music, a drink, some congenial friends...

Don't get me wrong. These are legitimate, even essential, ways of re-creating ourselves. But the unaccoutred **STOPPING AND LOOKING AND LISTENING** of childhood seems so unreal, so impossible. You've seen babies "discovering" themselves; their toes and fingers, heads and noses, kinesthetic and proprioceptive powers. Maybe if we spend some quiet time, we could re-discover ourselves; we'd see ourselves; in a whole, new light.

Ah, there's the rub! Quiet time. A commodity more precious than pure gold in today's world. Lent is the Church's "quiet time," the "liturgical pause that refreshes." Maybe Lent is doing something new, forgetting what lied behind and streeeeeetching forward to what lies ahead, and from now on not sinning any more! Whooooa! There's a big one!

But it all starts with putting ourselves in "neutral," doesn't it? And then after stopping, looking and listening, we put ourselves in drive (moving forward to something new) or reverse (going back to what we may have missed in the past year) or leaving ourselves in "park" (savoring where we are at the moment).

There is one thing which is not an option: turning off the motor!

"God of the new and old, help us to stop, look for you in our lives, and listen to you. Help us put our heads in our arms and rest a while with You!"
