Father Phil's Ramblings

For months now, we have been inundated with pictures of a bloodied Jesus. Without in any way dismissing the concerns raised by this media event, it should be pointed out that the actual scriptural passages do NOT concentrate on the details of Jesus' suffering. In fact as we listen to the reading of the Passion today, Palm Sunday, there are only three brief explicit references to them. "His sweat became like drops of blood;" "The men who held Jesus in custody were beating Him;" "They crucified Him."

Mel Gibson's version of the Passion came from these three Scriptural texts. But references to Jesus' Passion seem to be more focused on its effect in our lives than on specifics of the suffering itself.

As we read the Passion today and on Good Friday, may we enter into the Passion of Jesus in a way that will move us toward genuine conversation and transformation. May we recognize our own strengths and limitations in the characters of the story and not how Jesus calls us to greater fidelity. Or let us identify with Jesus. He willingly set aside privilege for the sake of others; He remained true to his calling despite the cost that was exacted; Jesus REFUSED to meet violence with violence.

If we become totally engrossed in the Passion of the Christ, we will miss the challenge to recognize the passion of Jesus today. We may be horrified at the violence and blood and never get beyond that.

On this Palm Sunday and during Holy Week, may we truly be moved to genuine conversion and growth.

My friends, Jesus, the Christ is suffering and dying today. Heal His wounds. But first and foremost, we must recognize the Christ today and recognize which Passion characters we are.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Later this week, the Chrism Mass is celebrated in every cathedral in the world in preparation for the Easter Triduum. Only a bishop can consecrate chrism, pure olive oil infused with rich fragrance, so this liturgy is a sign of the unity of the local Church and the bishop's ministry to all who will be baptized and confirmed in our parishes in the coming year. Chrism is also used in the ordination of priests and bishops and the consecration of new altars. Two other sacramental oils, the unscented olive oil for catechumens and for the sick, will be blessed in the same liturgy and transported carefully to every parish by the beginning of the Triduum.

Remember when Noah's dove returned with the sign of the world's rebirth? The dove carried an olive branch, a pledge that God was breathing the world to life again. Yet olives require human nurture. Olives are inedible unless they are cured by human labor. Olive trees grow on sunny slopes, away from the shade of city walls, so they can only be properly tended, cured, and laboriously pressed in peace time. The Chrism Mass with its olive oils expresses God's deepest desires for us, and our resolve to place our lives in service to God's saving, healing, loving plan.

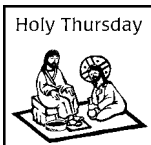

Prayer for Evangelization

While browsing through the new missalettes (Holy Week - Pentecost), I came across this prayer on the back cover. It is sub-titled "Disciples in Mission":

"Loving God, you called us each by name and gave your only Son to redeem us. In your faithfulness, you sent the Holy Spirit to complete the mission of Jesus among us. Open our hearts to Jesus. Give us the courage to speak His name to those who are close to us and the generosity to share His love with those who are far away. We pray that every person throughout the world be invited to know His all-surpassing love. May that love transform every element of our society. We ask this through Christ, Our Lord. Amen. "Mary, Mother of the Church, pray for us. St. Paul the Apostle, pray for us."

When Cardinal George first began speaking of a renewed spirit of "Evangelization" in the Archdiocese, I had mixed reactions. Maybe part of my unwillingness to adopt the term stems from my years in India where to be referred to as a "missionary" was filled with all kinds of cultural and religious "baggage." Somehow or other, "evangelization" seemed to smack of the same attitudes.

As I read the prayer on the back of the missalette, I began to think: "What else are we about? If we are not 'Good News' then what are we?" In the prayer, we say: "loving God, you sent the Holy Spirit to complete the mission of Jesus among us." That mission is more mysterious than social-uptift, racial-equality, equal rights, world peace, etc. It is all these and more because it involves connecting with God through the Person of Jesus Christ by the power of the Holy Spirit. "Eu-angelium", the Good News, is inextricably bound up with the person of Jesus Christ: "Loving God, open our hearts to Jesus. Give us the courage to speak His name to those who are close to us and the generosity to share His love with those who are far away."

Tele-evangelists "turn us off" - or rather, we tend to turn them off! - because we feel they are too explicit, too pushy, too fundamentalist in their preaching or references to Jesus. But, like it or not, Jesus is the "fundament" of what we say and do as Catholic-Christians. It's not just doing the things of Jesus but realizing that we have been Baptized into Jesus.

Some people like to ask: "What would Jesus do in such and such a situation?" Well, we must also accept the fact that Jesus was a man maligned, misinterpreted, "thorn-in-flesh". We'd have to be a little suspicious of ourselves if we become culturally and socially "acceptable." What I mean to say is: Jesus is the Alpha and Omega of our life as Catholic-Christians. We will carve that into the Easter candle: "Christ yesterday and today, the beginning and the end, Alpha and Omega; all time belongs to Him, and all the ages...":

Not matter how you slice it, our glory, our power is in the name of Jesus. We are called to spread the good News as people bearing the name of Jesus Christ. Each of us must be able to say - yes, even in public - "I am who I am because of Jesus Christ; I am a follower of Jesus Christ; the life I lead, the works I do, are inspired by Jesus Christ."

As the blessing of the Easter Candle continues: "...To Him be glory and power, through every age forever. Amen."
