## Father Phil's Ramblings

Today, I would like to share with you, the parishioners, a cornucopia of events here at St. Juliana. Events which both reach back to the past and extend to the future. Many of these parish events involved many volunteers, and I thank them for their gracious and generous contribution of time and effort. Without them, our celebrations would not be a success.

✠ Last fall, our school children planted bulbs -- tulips and daffodils -- that survived the cold winter and are now bursting forth this Spring to welcome us and remind us of new life. Enjoy their beauty and celebrate the new season of life with us.

✠ Each Saturday morning, parishioner Claret Oulvey leads a large group of women - and sometimes a few brave men! - in a health and fitness program called Jazzercise. Our beautiful Ahearn Parish Activity Center is just that: a place where activities of all kinds, for participants of all kinds, take place. If you are interested in joining Jazzercise, give Claret a call.

✠ A few weeks ago, our school children presented a musical production called **Honk**, which is a takeoff on the classic tale of the ugly duckling. We have more than a few budding actors, actresses and singers. They did a wonderful job and clearly enjoyed what they were doing. When you performers reach Broadway, don't forget St. Juliana!

✠ On Sunday, March 21st, an annual act of true love for St. Joseph was witnessed when countless volunteers decorated our school hall in honor of the feast of St. Joseph. The altar to St. Joseph grows more beautiful with each year's celebration, if that's even possible. A meal was served - a most delicious meal, I might add -- to hundreds of people. Of course, the food served was all low-carb, and non-fattening. NOT. The Italian flavor of the music added to the ambiance and everyone had a wonderful time. Donations to the St. Joseph Table celebration totaled \$4,000 and will be distributed to our St. Vincent de Paul Society, the Sisters of the Living Word, who have given so much to St. Juliana, and to needy families in our parish.

✠ Our second-graders are preparing for their First Holy Communion on Saturday, April 24th. Besides their preparation in school and at home with their parents, I celebrate a Peace Ceremony with the communion candidates. Each classroom gathers around the Baptistry in church, where we ask God's forgiveness and promise to always stay close to Jesus. God bless these innocent and holy children.

✠ On Thursday, May 6th, our seventh-graders will be confirmed by Bishop Frank Kane. The young boys and girls and their parents were interviewed individually by the priests.

The interviews were an opportunity for the sacrament of Confirmation to become a more meaningful experience of faith for both the parents, the young adults, and the priests.

✠ On Wednesday, April 21st, Deacon Ed Dolan and I are inviting police officers and their spouses to an open group session at 7:30 PM in the Parish Center. This is the first of four different sessions, during which a wide range of topics dealing with and affecting police officers and their families will be discussed. We will be assisted by Gerald Bolger, retired CPD, and Rory Gilbert, both of whom are co-directors of St. Michael's House. We hope to see you there!

✠ In the near future, each registered family will receive a book of 5 tickets for our Birthday Grand Raffle, to be held on June 6th after our final Coffee, Tea & Thee of the season. The Grand Raffle proceeds are vital to our ordinary needs of revenue for the parish. Besides the opportunity to win a LOT of money, your ticket purchase also benefits the parish, so take a chance or two or three... Ticket stubs can be returned to the parish office at any time.

✠ Our parish picnic will be held on Sunday, June 26th. This parish affair is just a wonderful opportunity to celebrate our family under God's canopy. More information about the picnic will be forthcoming in future bulletins. Set the date aside and plan to relax and enjoy each others' friendship.

✠ Finally, I would like to update you concerning the progress of the construction of a new rectory. The plans have been drawn up and submitted to the city for permit approval; the contractors are ready to excavate. The lawyers for the archdiocese are working to finalize the contract details with the builder as I write this.

I was trying to wait until all the I's were dotted and T's crossed before I provided this update but I understand that parishioners are curious as to the progress. Much of the work that needed to be done was legal and it involved many people. Nothing much has changed since my last update to you, the parishioners, and the general plans remain the same: The contractor will build a new building on the vacant corner at Touhy and Osceola and upon completion, the priests will move in. The current structures and land will then become the property of the contractor. The total value of that parcel is \$810,000 and the cost of the new rectory is \$460,000. I am hopeful that in the VERY near future excavation will begin.

## “Blessed Are Those Who Have Not Seen and Have Believed...”

We say: “Seeing is believing.” It’s an old adage which seems to mean that when you have real “hands-on”, verifiable proof, then believing makes sense. Of course, we also speak of “blind faith,” a faith which does not see!  
Now waitaminit!!

Thomas wanted “hands-on” proof that Jesus was alive. But I suspect that, if the story is true, he was not a little piqued that Jesus chose to make an appearance just when Thomas was not around. Imagine keeping vigil with the disciples for hours, not to mention days, and just when he steps out to maybe run to the bazaar or do a bit of fishing, Jesus appears! I think I would have pouted in similar circumstances. It’s a little like calling up my brother Phil to tell him some really exciting news about one of our mutual friends and have him tell me: “Oh yea, I found out about that yesterday; here are all the details.”

Was Thomas perhaps saying: “Unless I get a personal appearance from the Lord Jesus, I’m going to continue in this pout.” So his reaction would not have been disbelief as much as disappointment that he had not been there to share the joy of his friends when Jesus appeared. In other words, Thomas wanted to feel as special as the others felt when they crowded around Him and, all talking at once, told him: “The Master is alive! He lives! We saw Him and touched Him and heard Him!”

Down through the centuries we have spoken of “doubting Thomas.” Maybe we should more appropriately speak of “pouting Thomas”!? Thomas may have felt “out of the loop,” as it were; disappointed that he had been deprived of a moment of great joy and exhilaration. Can you picture the poor man, arms folded across his chest, standing in a corner of the upper room, lower-lip curled out and down, saying:

“Unless He appears to me, I will not believe!”

But he did believe! Thomas had been friends with his companions for some three years. And there were the women whom He knew to be forthright and sincere souls. Why would he doubt their witness? These were the people he had “hung out” with as Jesus molded them into a community; as Jesus challenged their value-systems and projected the dream and power of His own in their hearts. “The Master is risen” coming from them would not have been some sort of cruel joke or “ghost-story.” from the likes of Peter? Impossible!

What Thomas did not realize at the time, was that he was chosen to be the vehicle of one of the deepest truths of our Catholic-Christian faith; namely, that it would always be based on the witness of people who had indeed experienced the Lord. In religion classes, CCD programs, families, hospitals, offices, there would always be people who would claim: “I have seen Jesus and He lives!” Thomas would be the forerunner of intelligent, informed, prayerful followers of Jesus Christ who would believe because people they trusted bore witness that “death had no power over Jesus”!

And like Thomas, we are all a little “pouty” if the witness of others is not corroborated in our own experience. “Unless Jesus appears to me...” That is a prayer; not an expression of doubt. It implies that Jesus has the power and desire to do so. It’s not a question of proving that Jesus rose from the dead. It is a question of holding ourselves ready for the time and place when Jesus will appear to us. And, to be sure, **HE WILL APPEAR!**

**Till then, don’t pout. Join the dance!**

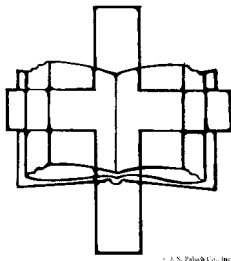

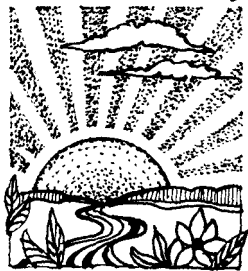

### Lenten Outreach by St. Juliana Students

The students at St. Juliana School participated in Catholic Relief Service’s Lenten outreach program, Operation Rice Bowl, as part of their Lenten almsgiving.

At the beginning of Lent, the students were encouraged to think of the ways they would personally honor Catholic traditions of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. They watched a video showing examples of the many ways Operation Rice Bowl (ORB) has helped impoverished people all over the world (including in the United States) to become economically self-sufficient as well as politically empowered to further assist their own communities.

At the Ash Wednesday liturgy the students received cardboard rice bowls and educational calendars to take home as visual reminders to give and made a pledge to contribute.

On Fridays during Lent, the eighth grade students had discussions in their homerooms about the ways they had served others or offered kindness during the week to honor their Lenten promises. They collected contributions for ORB in their homerooms. Then they were sent in teams to the younger grades to conduct the same type of discussion in those rooms, finishing with a collection for Operation Rice Bowl.

On Mondays during the school’s morning prayer, the student leaders read to us about people who have benefited from ORB. The students renewed their pledge each week. Then, one student from each homeroom came to the office in procession to put a scoop of rice in a large glass bowl to represent their service, kindness, and giving from the week before. We placed this large bowl at the main entrance of the school and watched the rice in the bowl grow along with contributions. During Lent, the students of St. Juliana School have collected over \$1,000.00 for Operation Rice Bowl.

The rice will be blessed as a sign of thanksgiving for God’s great generosity at our Holy Thursday prayer service, and as a sign of our own giving, as we pray for the people who will benefit from our contributions. Finally the symbolic rice will be used by the kindergarten class to make Easter flowers- a sign of the Resurrection.

### Students Spread Easter Joy

During the Lenten Season the Student Council of St. Juliana School sponsored a collection of children’s items to fill Easter Baskets. Some of these baskets will be delivered to a needy local family and others to families at St. Susanna Parish in Harvey, Illinois.

Every homeroom, Kindergarten through grade 8, prepared a basket filled with candy and gift items. In planning their Easter Baskets they selected treats for a child the same age as themselves. First grade students brought items that would delight a first grade child and Junior High students filled their basket with gift certificates and other items for a Junior High boy or girl.

The Student Council moderators, Mrs. Jane Lidgus and Mrs. Patricia Nelson, assist the students in packing the baskets and delivering them.

“We’re always amazed at the generosity of the at St. Juliana School students. They willingly give to others, whether it is the seniors in our community, veterans, or less fortunate children. Their service to others is what the Gospel message is all about.” commented Mrs. Lidgus.
