Father Phil's Ramblings

My history teacher at Quigley Prep was a wonderful priest, Father John McMahon. Father McMahon died at the age of 90. He had been pastor of St. Joan of Arc in Skokie. One of his favorite quotes was given on the first day of class. He said that his name was mentioned in the first chapter of St. John's Gospel. Of course we all thought, "St. John's Gospel? John McMahon?" He was being very facetious. In the first chapter of St John's Gospel, we are reminded of the profound truth of the Incarnation of God (God becoming Man). St John starts with "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word became Man." (becoming man - McMahon).

Father John was trying to be humorous but the lesson of that passage and today's gospel are connected. In the first chapter, we have the prologue, the introduction to the Good News -- God becoming Man and living and dying. And the Epilogue -- the conclusion -- what now? In light of Jesus' life, death and Resurrection, what are we to do? The prologue -- becoming Man -- the foundation and the future of all who believe.

As you listen to the conclusion of John's Gospel, one word sings out loud and clear: LOVE. Jesus asks Peter, "Do you love me?" three times. If you love Him, then tend and care for the future followers who believe in Him.

Jesus became Man to show us His love. He died and rose so that we may believe and now what all of us should do is love one another as He did.

Yes, sometimes we love but sometimes we fail to love -- to forgive -- to accept -- one another. If that happens, you are in good company: Peter himself, denied out of fear. But the beat goes on...If we love one another.

Jesus -- The Word -- became Man to teach us how to love.

Father John Mc Mahon, rest in peace.

“He Tucked In His Garments And Jumped In The Lake!”

Can you remember when telling someone to “Go jump in the lake!” was considered a really nasty remark? It had implications of “You’re all wet!” or “You’re really dumb!” or “Go drown yourself!” or “Get outa my face!”

Of course “jumping in the lake” can be an act of heroism too. Suppose someone is drowning and in need of help or has fallen through the ice and can’t swim needs immediate assistance.

But telling someone to “Go jump in the lake!” still seems to fall into the category of “bad-mouthing.”

Now here’s Peter, fisherman, swimmer, lake-side athlete. Peter can easily get emotional, especially where his friends are concerned. We see that several times in the Gospels, no? He does impulsive things like falling down in front of Jesus after a catch of fish which should not have been in that part of the lake at that time of the day, and saying: “Depart from me, Lord! I’m a sinful man!” Or again, he protectively reacts to Jesus’ talk of suffering with: “Far be it from you, Lord, that you should suffer in that way!” Or again, he whips out a small sword and in a rather clumsy attempt to defend Jesus from His captors: “The others may run away, Lord, but I’ll never leave you!”

Some might say that Peter was a “hothead.” But the truth of the matter seems to be that he was a “hoheart.”

“Hohearts” are the stuff of heroic deeds. They’re not “lukewarm” people. Really, when you come right down to it, if you can’t feel “hot” about an issue or about people, you can’t really fall in love, can you? The disciples returning from Emmaus after recognizing Jesus in the breaking of the bread said: “Were our hearts not burning within us when He talked to us on the road!” The Sacred Heart Devotion uses the symbol of a heart on fire with love for us.

Peter didn’t jump into the water when someone cried: “look, there’s a big fish!” He jumped into the water - fully clothed at that! - when John exulted: **“IT IS THE LORD!”** All sense of shame at his denial, all guilty hesitation and doubt as to whether Jesus would accept him was burned away by the love Peter had for Jesus. “It is the Lord!” As soon as Peter had the direction, he leapt. There was no sense of unadult - like behavior - jumping into the lake with his clothes on! Neither the catch of fish nor the laughter of his friends could deter Peter from this “hohearted” act of love. “It is the Lord!”

Peter had learned that when he was sure it was the Lord, then the only option for him was a total response, a “whole-hearted” response, a wild, exuberant, jumping-in-the-lake response. Ah, how to be sure it is the Lord in the various circumstances and events of our lives? One must breed a familiarity with the Lord, a sensitivity to His voice, the breath of His Spirit, His actions during His life on earth. In concrete terms: a familiarity with Sacred Scripture, regular moments fostering our interior lives, discernment of spirits to determine where the Spirit is leading.

Of course, to top all this off: a willingness to jump in the lake when we know the Lord is calling.

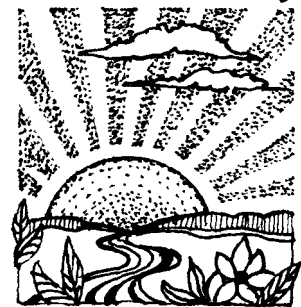

Patrick Zajac I want to receive my First Communion because I want to receive Jesus.

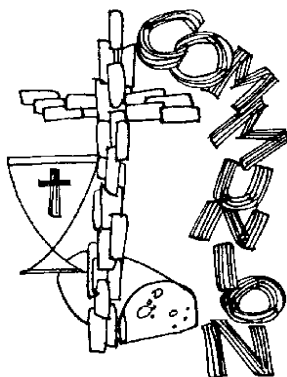

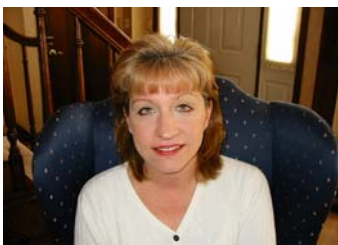

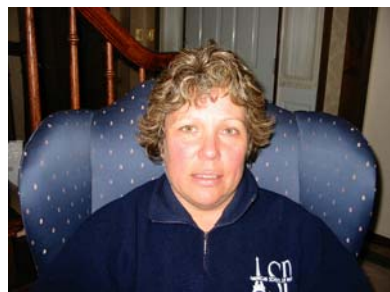
