As pastor of a parish with a large constituency of police officers, I feel a strong responsibility to focus on the needs of our officers and their families. Deacon Ed Dolan, a retired policeman, and I have mutually agreed that the needs and concerns of men and women committed to and touched by service as police officers should be addressed. Gerry Bolger, a retired policeman, and Rory Gilbert, both of whom are co-directors of St. Michael's House, are assisting us.

*Father Phil's Ramblings***Jesus - The Measure of All Shepherds and Christian Leaders**

Those who represent Jesus must have some degree of integrity with regard to Jesus' words and life. True Christian leadership will always be redemptive. That means reconciling -- not alienating -- people and situations to God. Christian leaders, whether priest, bishop or lay, must strive to free people because Jesus came to free us, not enslave us. We must be so confident in Jesus' message that we allow people to freely say NO. The message -- the voice that Christian leaders speak -- must always be nourishing to the spirit, but it does not have to be merely popular or entertaining.

Using some of these guidelines, we can picture what a 21st century Good Shepherd should be and we hopefully can hear his voice and follow His call. There is one more quality that helps us recognize the voice of the Good Shepherd today and that is the willingness for shepherds -- Christian leaders -- to follow but not always live up to "The Good Shepherd lays down His life for His sheep." Christian leaders must love with a self-sacrificing love and that is not always easy. In fact, I can attest to the fact that at times it is almost impossible.

I ask your forgiveness for my own lack of love, and commitment. But there are others who must also seek forgiveness: the priests and bishops who caused pain because of the child abuse scandal; the Shepherds who kill the Spirit of Renewal; the Christian leaders who speak and act with a negative Spirit and who are unable to affirm the goodness of the people they serve.

Yes, Jesus is the Measure of All Things, but He is also the measure by which we measure Good Shepherds and Christian leaders. Pray that all of us -- both ordained and lay, men and women of faith who are in leadership positions -- may measure up to Jesus, or at least try harder.

On Commitment

Many years ago Father John Haughey, S.J. wrote a book entitled "Should Anyone Say Forever?" The book explores the making of commitments and their meaning. I often refer to this book when I meet with engaged couples preparing for marriage and ask what each person sees in the other and experiences together that leads them to say "forever" on their wedding day.

Yet we live in a culture where our understanding of commitment is changing and especially the making of a commitment that is for life. Fewer people now begin a career at 22 with a particular company and remain with the same company until retirement. Mobility, from cell phones to pension plans, is viewed as a desirable good. It can seem more difficult to say "forever".

Given the contemporary backdrop of constant change, it is important to identify what makes it possible for us to remain in our commitments and grow in them. I would suggest that the strengthening of our commitments is made possible not so much by the repetition of action but the renewal of our motivation. In other words, a married couple could renew their wedding vows every single morning over breakfast, but I don't think that would strengthen or deepen their commitment. Or a priest can be continually busy and overextended with activities, yet that alone isn't going to help him sink roots deeper into the priesthood. Rather committed people have to keep in touch with what motivated them in making a commitment in the first place.

Taking some time, pausing and reflecting on some good questions helps us keep in touch with our motives. Questions such as: What was it that led me to make this commitment? What were the graces (love, joy, happiness) that fed me and moved me in a particular direction? What was happening inside me, in my heart? What was I hoping I would discover in making this commitment? What was God saying to me? Who did I hope to become as a person? Why did I decide to make this particular commitment?

The Easter Season is a time of renewal and optimism. I hope we use this spring-time to reflect on our commitments, becoming more aware of our motives in making them and opening our hearts to the grace of God that helps us keep them.

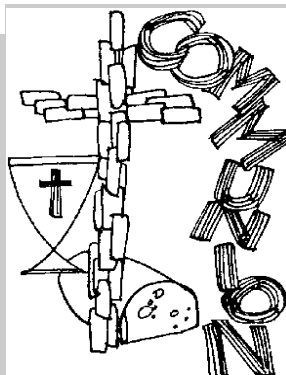

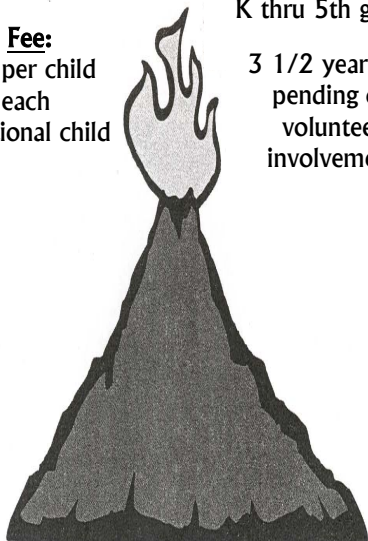

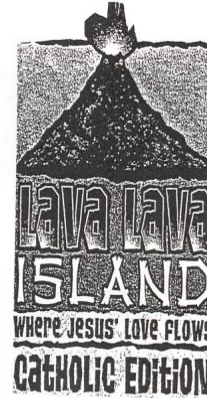
