A New Commandment

Jesus said at the Last Supper, "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another." A new commandment? Was this really a NEW commandment? Hardly. It was ancient, and prominent in the Jewish tradition. We can find it verbatim in the Book of Leviticus. So, one may ask, what makes loving one another so new?

The 'new' commandment is to love one another as Jesus loved His friends. Not only this, but Jesus said obedience to the new commandment was how his disciples -- his friends -- would be recognized in the world. By this, everyone will know that we are Jesus' followers; if we have love for one another.

We are not to be known by our spirituality, nor our piety, and certainly not by our superior knowledge. We are to be recognized by the way we love. Have you experienced how transforming it is to be loved by someone with no hidden agenda and without self-interest, simply because you are you?

That transformation is the essence of love. That person could be a spouse. How often has a husband or wife who have been married for many years say: My spouse is my best friend, with whom I can be at my worst and still know that I am loved. That's the new commandment!

In the crazy and confused world in which we love, when someone really hears and obeys the NEW commandment to love one another as Jesus loved, it really does become a NEW commandment. If we can really touch ONE person with that kind of love, and transform that person, our lives will be considered great in God's eyes.

May we truly live the NEW commandment!

Days of Obligation?

Since when is Ascension Thursday on a Sunday? Several years ago the bishops of Illinois agreed that the Ascension of the Lord, normally celebrated on the fortieth day after Easter, should be transferred to the Seventh Sunday of Easter. Why? Because over the past decade mass attendance on Holy Days of Obligation has steadily decreased and the bishops reasoned that the mystery of the Lord's Ascension is too important to be overlooked. They thought it better to transfer the mass and scripture readings to the nearest Sunday when more Catholics are in church.

While I understand the bishops' reasoning, I also regret the transfer of the solemnity to a Sunday. Why? Because I believe we are steadily losing a sense that joy can interrupt our schedules, plans, and calendars. Holy Days of Obligation traditionally require the reorganizing of our work and school schedules in order to attend mass. We do so because we believe that the mystery of God is not limited to one day per week. Praising and worshipping God is something I not only do in my private time on Sunday morning, but is part of my daily life with certain high points such as holy days. Seeing thousands of workers in the Chicago Loop swimming against the tide of commerce in order to attend mass at one of the downtown churches on a holy day says something to us (and the world) about the priority of God in life at all times.

Josef Pieper in his book "In Tune With the World" noted how western society is losing a sense of festival and has to reestablish time for public religious ritual praise of God. I agree with Pieper's concern especially when we live in a society which pushes religion more and more from the center of the public square into a corner. I would be interested in your thoughts or suggestions about how we can better observe holy days or suggestions for how individuals and families can make more of the Ascension of the Lord this year. Please contact me and I'll include some suggestions in next week's bulletin.

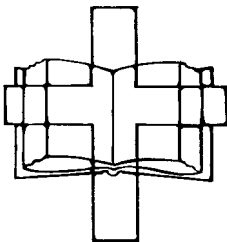

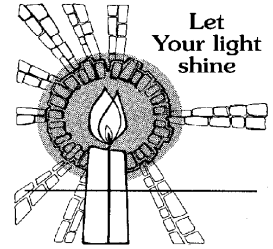
