A lot of people feel that we should return to the spirit of the early Church. Of course, the problem is that the Spirit of the Church—N.B. the capital "S"—never stopped informing the Church at any point of its long history. But it took many years for the early Christians to learn how to discern the movements of the Spirit in the various circumstances of their lives.

It was not easy for the early followers of Jesus to arrive at the conclusion that one did not have to become a Jew in order to be baptized into Christ by the power of the Spirit. There was no "blueprint" for the early Church which was ready-made and clear of obscurities. But there was the "imprint of the Spirit", the tell-tale evidence that God was leading the faithful to new understandings, new gifts of grace.

One of the greatest temptations of the Church is to want to be "relevant." None of us likes to be a "voice crying in the wilderness." We all want to experience that we are making a difference in the history of the world and its peoples.

For 31 years I lived in India as the representative of a cultural and religious minority. I struggled with the issue of "personal relevance" in a society predominantly Hindu and Muslim and Sikh and Jain. Oh yes, Christianity also had a very ancient tradition in India, but in terms of sheer numbers, we were a small minority—even smaller if you consider us Caucasian Christians who had come from other countries and cultures.

In some respects, the Church in a country like India is very much like the early disciples of Jesus who found themselves in the midst of Jewish, Greek, and Roman culture. Where does one begin the enterprise of "spreading the Good News to the **WHOLE (!)** world"? It would seem to me that one begins with a serious **DISCERNMENT OF SPIRITS**. Of course the implication is that we have the Spirit of Jesus Christ, or at least that we know how to get in contact with Him/Her/It/Them! If we have not experienced the Spirit in a profound and unequivocal way; if we cannot recognize the Spirit in its varied manifestations, then how, indeed, can we discern!?

One does not adopt a spirituality. One does not choose a spirituality. One is possessed by the Spirit; one becomes Spiritual (yes, with a capital "S"!). Becoming a Christian in the early centuries of the Church was to become "in-Spirited." It is only from this vantage point that one can discern the spirits. A human being does not stand outside of reality and dare to judge what is or what is not the Spirit of God. What hubris!

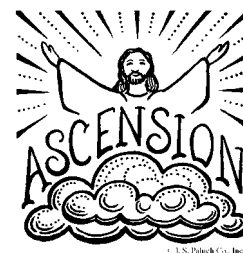
No. A human being is possessed by, suffused with the Spirit, Who, like Jesus, passes through the "doors" of our personalities to touch and leave peace and power, insight and certitude, yes, and love— always love. One does not discern love; one is or is not **IN LOVE**. "Simon, do you love me?" Simon was sure. Simon was now capable of discerning the Spirit in the early Church.

If it seems that moral decisions have become more difficult to make, the way of righteousness more difficult to discern, the future of the Church cloudy and dark, perhaps it is because we do not rest quiet and listen to the Spirit in Whom we live and move and have our being. It is not a Spirit Who comes and goes, hides and seeks.

And if, indeed, we were to hear the Spirit or feel the Spirit, how would we know? The way we know we are hungry? The way we recognize the face of a loved one? The way we experience the marvelous concatenation of our limbs when we walk or run? The way we know we are tired and in need of rest? How, indeed, do we know the Spirit of God?

Is it so very, very, difficult to discern the spirits when one comes right down to it? Ah. . . How often do we allow ourselves to **COME RIGHT DOWN TO IT**—the Spirit, that is!

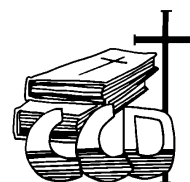

On Eagle's Wings

About a year ago, Father Michael Joncas was struck with Guillan-Barre' syndrome (GBS), an illness with an unknown cause that quickly paralyzes muscles and can cause death. Unlike polio, to which it is compared, people can recover from GBS, but must cope with its effects for the rest of their lives.

Father Joncas, best known to Catholics for his inspirational song "On Eagle's Wings", spent four months in the hospital before being released and continues his therapy today in Minnesota. In a recent interview Father Joncas was asked about his hospitalization and the fears he experienced concerning his illness. He spoke about his fears of death and pain but he also spoke about his fear of the unknown. The major way his fear manifested itself was in his wondering "Will I ever recover?"

One source of support for Father Joncas was the text from Jeremiah 20:11: "I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you a future and a hope." Father Joncas said that his religious beliefs helped him with the fear of the unknown.

I imagine the apostles and disciples in the early church also had much to fear: rejection, imprisonment, pain and death. And there were also plenty of reasons to fear the unknown. Yet the Risen Christ offered his disciples his gift of peace not as a wall that they could hide behind, but as a promise they could hold onto in the midst of all that stirred up their fears. As Christians today we are also offered Christ's peace in prayer, in the sacraments and in the community. There is much on the horizon that could frighten us and paralyze us. Yet God gives us "a future and a hope" in the Resurrection of Christ and the peace of Christ which gives us fresh hearts and the optimism to move forward.
