Rectory News

On the morning of May 17th, a bulldozer began digging up our 'grassy knoll'-- the vacant lot that will soon become a new rectory, home of the priests who staff our parish.

Last June, we began to consider the condition and fate -- both short- and long-term -- of the existing rectory structures. Discussions took place with the parish finance committee, property inspectors, Realtors, parishioners and the archdiocese, regarding the remodeling or demolition of the existing buildings, and construction of a new rectory residence. The old buildings -- those south of the corner lot -- were appraised and the offer that was accepted was \$810,000. The contractor offered to construct a new building on the corner lot for \$460,000; the remaining \$350,000 will be transferred to the parish upon completion of the new building.

Our parish finance committee and the archdiocese were in favor of and agreed to the terms. After many months, contracts were signed, permits obtained and work began on Monday, May 17th. The contractor has promised that the new building will be complete in 150 days. At that time the priests will relocate from their current residences and the parish will transfer ownership of the south lots and old buildings to the contractor.

As pastor, I firmly believe that this transaction is a win-win situation. A floor plan and rendering of the new rectory is on display in the vestibule of the church. Pray for good weather and come take a look -- sidewalk supervisors are always welcome!!

Father Phil's Ramblings

In a recent article in the Chicago Tribune, it was commented that more than faith is needed to help parishes on the west side of Chicago survive. Financial conditions and church attendance are so poor that 10 parishes on the "Irish Corridor" -- the neighborhood bordered by Damen on the east, Central on the west, Madison on the south and Division on the north -- will be forced to close. One of the parishes, Our Lady Help of Christians, is where I was assigned from 1972 to 1978. Some of the other parishes mentioned were St. Angela, Precious Blood, Our Lady of Lourdes, and St. Martin de Porres (previously St. Mel's, Resurrection and St. Thomas.) Due to lack of funds and low attendance, at least 6 of the 10 parishes will likely close in the near future.

I'm hoping that my sadness -- although personal because of my connection with Help of Christians -- over the fate of these parishes is mirrored by your own sadness, for two reasons in particular: 1) Many 'new' parishioners of St. Juliana were either baptized, educated and/or married in one of the affected parishes; and 2) the Catholic Church is a church with a Gospel message that needs to be preached and lived in every neighborhood, no matter how ethnically or racially diverse, no matter how rich or poor.

The closure of these parishes reflects the rapid -- and constant -- change of the Catholic population in urban neighborhoods, and also challenges the Church to broaden its vision as to how we continue our evangelization in such areas. Many Hispanic Catholics do not send their children to Catholic schools due to the high cost of tuition, but they will have their children receive the sacraments of Baptism and First Holy Communion. Hispanic Catholics are frequently attracted to Pentecostal or evangelical churches, where there is greater emphasis placed on the Spirit and being born again, being reborn in the Spirit. On the other hand, many African-Americans are drawn to Baptist congregations, and services that include lengthy sermons and much joyful singing.

So what does this have to do with St. Juliana's parishioners? We should always be extremely grateful for who we are and what the gifts with which God has blessed us. The more we have been given, the greater our responsibility to our less fortunate brothers and sisters.

We at St. Juliana have been blessed with a fine physical plant and we are well-staffed. Yes, we do struggle to pay our bills and meet our financial needs. The closing of previously vibrant Catholic parishes in our city should be a call to always be thankful and NEVER forget the message of the Gospel: to be a clarion of God's love for all.

In the future, we -- the Church -- must broaden our vision as to how that message is preached to others. Pray for the people whose parish buildings will be forever darkened and shuttered; they must always believe that the Church has not abandoned them.

"They Worshiped Him"

A commentator on St. Luke's Good News says about this particular statement; "They worshiped Him", that it is the christological, high point of the entire Gospel. This final verse of Luke's Gospel is the first and only time that Luke says that the disciples worshiped Jesus.

Unfortunately, some translations miss the power of that line. Even the translation in our missalette seems to obscure the directness and force of "they worshiped Him" by translating it "they did Him homage."

It had been a long, hard road for the followers of Jesus to arrive at this reaction to the personality of Jesus. It must be remembered that the disciples were not disaffected from their Jewish tradition. They were not theologians or religious polemicists but people faithful to the God of their ancestors.

Jesus did not simply step into their lives as a social or political reformer. His intention was not simply to "renew" Judaism. No, Jesus was presenting Himself as the fulfillment of God's promises made to all peoples for thousands of years. The "molds" which the followers of Jesus had were broken, one by one - or perhaps many at one time! - before they could be confronted with the reality of Who Jesus was. And when that stage was reached, "they worshiped Him."

One has only to consult the New Jerome Biblical Commentary to discover - and, if you're like me, be bowled over by - the wealth of interpretations, insights, ancient traditions, and New and Old Testamental "connections" that adhere to even the smallest of texts. Often enough, one has to stand back from it all and ask: "Now, what's the point of all this?" I have read and meditated on the Gospel of St. Luke for many years, but I never "heard" that phrase "they worshiped Him" in a most powerful way with the help of the Jerome Commentary: **THE CHRISTOLOGICAL STATEMENT** to which the whole Gospel is directed.

John's Gospel is similar in intent. At the end of everything, Thomas declares: "My Lord and my God!" We are so familiar with that faith proclamation and we make it our own, do we not? But to realize that it was the central Christological statement of John's Gospel, the end-point towards which all the events and miracles and discourses are directed. And this Thomas, whom we erroneously call "the doubter," actually surpasses in faith his companions. They believe that Jesus is God!

Our own personal faith-lives follow the same pattern. We have our own personal gospels to live through, to live out. But if we do not ultimately reach the worship of Jesus, the glorious cry, My Lord and my God!, then we are still in the beginning chapters of our personal gospels.

We have yet to travel the road trod by the companions of Jesus, listening, contemplating, choosing, entering into the mystery of suffering and death. It is only in walking with Jesus, watching His every expression and move, listening to His every nuance of speech, asking questions of Him when His way is unclear, that we complete the journey begun at our Baptisms.

But it also requires a willingness to see Jesus for Who He is. Only that completes the cycle, as it did in the Gospel of Luke - **THEY WORSHIPED HIM**. Then we begin to see what really happened when "the angel of the Lord declared unto Mary, and she conceived by the Holy Spirit - my Lord and my God - they worship Him."




