Father Phil's Ramblings

An anti-Vietnam protest song, Where Have All the Flowers Gone? has been going through my mind for quite some time now, but especially this Memorial Day weekend. Among the lyrics of this song is the repeated question, "Where have all the soldiers gone?" The answer is a sad reality: "Gone to graveyards, every one." During this Memorial Day weekend we should dwell seriously on that thought.

I recently saw the movie, Troy. This movie portrays the legendary war between Greece and Troy thousands of years ago. In 2004, war goes on in Iraq and men and women are dying, both American and Iraqi. "When will we ever learn?"

God the Creator sent His Son, the Prince of Peace, to show us a different way - a peaceful way. When will we learn? Flowers turn to graves, graves of men and women who died. When will we learn another way to resolve differences? We live on a small planet in a large universe, a planet that has life - human life -- and we die in war. How do you think God the Creator feels about this? Someone once said God should do something. God did. God created us. God gave us Jesus. One thing that God will not do is take away our free will. We choose war. We choose graveyards.

On this Memorial Day weekend, Masses will be celebrated at all the cemeteries in the archdiocese. We will pray for the men and women who have died in wars, past and present. They were brave, and because of them we have barbeques and cookouts this weekend.

Unless we become peacemakers in our own little corner of the world, whether it be in St. Juliana's parish community, or with our next-door neighbor or co-worker, little wars will continue and graveyards will still exist. Real graveyards and virtual graveyards, in which people's spirits will be buried.

On this Memorial Day, may we truly become peacemakers. Resolve differences with flowers and candy, rather than guns and bombs.

Today we end the Easter season in the Church's liturgical year. Spring is in full bloom and the message of Easter will have once more been proclaimed to our world. A world which so longs for signs of life, hope and peace.

Over the past few weeks, I've heard many people talk about the experience of seeing The Passion of the Christ. In reality, I have walked with many people through their Passion -- through suffering and death. Their lives and my own have been challenged to believe in the mystery of Easter and its message of life, hope and peace. When a person dies many things change in the lives of those who loved them. It takes faith to open our hearts to the "Easter" that looms ahead of us. Yes, it is OK to ask "why." Eventually we come to understand and to experience the joy of Resurrection.

May the Spirit of Jesus on this Pentecost day help us to truly experience New Life.

"The Spirit of God Dwells in You"

My brother Phil - the Grib one! - and I had occasion to participate in a family 50th wedding anniversary. Our cousin Johnny and his wife Phyllis invited us to be part of a modest celebration in their "neck of the woods," Plainfield, Illinois. We hadn't been together since Mom's death over two years ago.

I had reservations about meeting the children and grandchildren of Johnny and Phyllis since I had been out of the country for so many years and was not really a part of their growing up. My fears were allayed almost from the "get-go", as we say. It wasn't that the youngest were all effusive or free of shyness with me, but I got the feeling that I was accepted as "their own."

It is rare that my brother and I can re-connect with family, most of whom live in the "diaspora" of surrounding suburbs and states. Many warm and wonderful memories were rekindled of family celebrations: birthdays, First Communion, graduations, major holi-Holydays, and yes, wedding anniversaries. Of course the sharings and interactions with Johnny, Phyllis and "the older crowd" had their own joy and consolations. But the youngsters also were very much part of it all. One nice twist: when we returned from the restaurant for the traditional family "coffee - and," the adults were seated around a nicely decorated dining room table, while the kids were "in their own space" in the kitchen where they could "talk their talk" and leave us free to "talk" ours. We were family. We had a spirit - **THE SPIRIT**.

Funny how this family -spirit was so intangible and yet so very real. Oh, there are certainly biological factors - being "blood kin" - and psychological factors - being products of a family - culture rooted in a variety of ethnic, social, and religious realities.

As I was reflecting on this and savoring the experience of the family-gathering, a strange image came to mind. There's quite a bit of experimentation going on with the implantation of "micro-chips" in peoples' brains and bodies. Some sci-fi films have frightened us with the possibility that a villainous overlord could implant such chips and thus control the behavioral responses of people. But most of the legitimate experimentation in this area is done with the intention of making life more comfortable and productive for people.

Is it too far-fetched to compare the Spirit of God to such an "implant"? At Baptism, this "divine chip" is implanted in us so that we can live, and move, and have our being in and with God. Understand me. I do not mean to make light of the presence of the Spirit in our lives. But these human experiences: one, of the spirit of a family, the other, of an implant which brings health and newness, can help us appreciate the role of God's spirit.

St. Paul uses the comparison of a human body. And as he says to the Corinthians: "There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone. To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit."

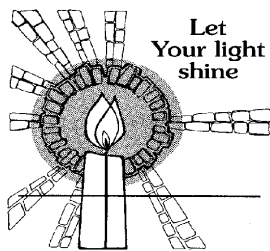
Summer Celebration At Notre Dame High School for Boys
