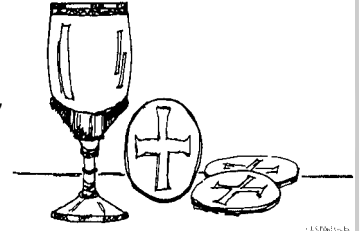

Father Phil's Ramblings

Corpus Christi - The Body of Christ

The mystery of Jesus' abiding presence in the Eucharist is celebrated today, the feast of Corpus Christi. I often reflect on the story of the agnostic, who told her Catholic friend that if she believed what Catholics believe about the presence of Christ in the Eucharist, she would crawl on her knees to receive the Body of Christ.



The Eucharist is the mystery of Jesus' abiding presence for those who believe. Faith and love are essential for the reception of Holy Communion. Respect and reverence for the Body of Christ are a prerequisite.

In the early part of the last century, Pius X changed the required age for the reception of First Holy Communion; that age was the age of reason. Before that time Communion was not received until the age of 11 or 12 years. The rules of fasting from midnight were changed within the past 40 years. Prior to that, not even water was to be consumed before the reception of Communion. I remember when I was at Quigley Seminary, the water fountains were tied with red ribbons to remind us that we were not to drink water before Holy Communion. Many of us 'old timers' might recall being taught not to chew the host out of respect.

My, how things have changed!

The fasting regulations are practically non-existent these days. Holy Communion has become a regular part of the Mass for almost all people - even if we have not gone to Confession. We have the option of receiving Communion in the hand or on the tongue. We stand rather than kneel.

So what should keep anyone from the reception of the Body of Christ? The answer is simple: complete lack of faith in the real Presence and/or a lack of love for God and/or our brothers and sisters.

I believe that the frequent reception of Holy Communion can lead to a lack of reverence or respect for the real Presence. For example: leaving church immediately after the reception of Communion; not spending any time in thanksgiving; how we approach the altar and how we receive the host. Remember the story of the agnostic.

Finally, on this feast of Corpus Christi, may we gain a deeper love of the Eucharist and may we always be grateful for the gift of faith in the ever abiding presence of Jesus in Holy Communion.

“They Did A D.N.A. Test and Discovered He Was Alive In Christ”

Medical science and the science of forensics are making quite a splash these days with the marvels they are able to perform in healing and investigation of crimes. T.V. programs like CSI or Navy NCIS reveal to us the intricate connections between the smallest pieces of evidence. One such marvel is the testing of D.N.A. to determine who the actual parents are of a particular child.

R.C.I.A. is no less marvelous! For a couple of weeks you've seen announcements in the parish bulletin about R.C.I.A. In a sense, it's a way of tracing your origins. Lots of people mistakenly think that R.C.I.A. is for “making Catholic Christians.” In reality, it's a way of tracing one's true origins. It's a “voyage of discovery,” a “reading of evidence,” an examination of one's “spiritual D.N.A.” Ask the people who have passed through the program here at St. Juliana.

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is not “turning people into” something. It is a “revealing” of who they really are. Wouldn't you want to know where you came from? Who your “real” parents are? Who your “real” brothers and sisters are?

On September 26th, 2004, we're inviting you to come and begin to have your D.N.A. tested so that you will know where your life really comes from. In the end, you'll have this strange experience of God saying to you: “Here is My Body; here is my Blood!” That's the central mystery of life as a Catholic Christian. It is, in a sense, the realization that your D.N.A. is the same as God's!

Are you one of those who live with this suspicion that God and you have a unique relationship? We can help you find the answer in about six months! Now how's that for a spectacular “come-on”? And the pay-off? You may discover that you have “flesh” and “blood” relatives right here at St. Juliana; people you never recognized before - “Jesus Body and Blood” relatives. Who knows?! You may discover that you have millions of brothers and sisters living with the same Life!

Our R.C.I.A. program meets on Sunday mornings from 10:00 am until 11:15 am. The program lasts until Easter of 2005. If you're interested in getting more information about the sessions, please contact the parish office at 7200 N. Osceola - 773.631.4127. Ask for Father Bob or one of our “friendly sales representatives” in the office. Please leave your phone number and address (N.B. we will not sell this information to unscrupulous tele-marketers!)

The Tomb and The Bread of Life

During this week many Americans watched the funeral rites for former President Ronald Reagan, culminating with his burial at the Regan Library in California. Seeing the burial of a president, many people might have found themselves reflecting on the meaning of life and death. For some people, the tomb seems to be so final and unyielding; yet for Christians the grave is a place of waiting for the Second Coming of Christ and the Resurrection of the Dead on the Last day.

Last year, Pope John Paul II wrote a series of reflections for the Stations of the Cross. His meditation on the Fourteenth Station, "Jesus is Placed in the Tomb", is quite beautiful. Reading it, especially today on the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, puts our faith in a clearer light.

The Holy Father wrote:

From the moment when man, as a result of sin, was driven away from the Tree of Life (Genesis 3) the earth became a burial ground. With as many burial places as there are men. A great planet of tombs.

Close to Calvary there was a tomb belonging to Joseph of Arimathea. In it, with Joseph's consent, the body of Jesus was placed after being taken down from the Cross. They laid it there in haste so that the burial might be completed...before sunset.

In one of the countless tombs scattered all over the continents of this planet of ours, the Son of God, the man Jesus Christ conquered death with death. O mors! Ero mors tua! (O death! I will be your death!)

The Tree of Life from which man was banished as a result of sin is set before man anew in the Body of Christ. "If anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever and the bread I shall give for the life of the world is my flesh" (John 6).

Though our planet is constantly being filled with fresh tombs, though the cemetery in which man, who comes from the dust and returns to the dust (Genesis 3) is always growing, nonetheless all who gaze upon the tomb of Jesus Christ live in the hope of the Resurrection.

May the Eucharist we receive today strengthen our faith that the tomb of Jesus of Nazareth is empty and the Risen Christ, who gives us his body and blood, will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead.

I would like to thank the parish, faculty and staff of St. Juliana, my students and everyone at Bye Bye Bette's for their support! I couldn't have done it without you all!

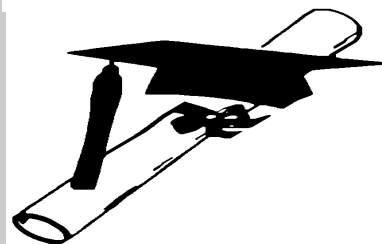


