Father Phil's Ramblings

From the Sublime to the Mundane

I have just returned from a brief but wonderful vacation. I traveled up the East coast from Savannah, Georgia to Baltimore, Maryland, and visited many historical sites along the way. Sites that memorialized events from both the Revolutionary and Civil Wars. I would like to share with you two of my more memorable experiences.

While at Colonial Williamsburg in Virginia I visited an Anglican church of the 16th century. The nobility, or rather those who were deemed of high rank, had special pews. The royal governor had his own 'box,' decorated in scarlet. The women sat on one side of the church and men on the other; those of lower class were to sit in the rear. Mandatory donations were required and if a worshipper missed a religious service once a month, a fine was assessed. If several Sunday services were missed not only was the fine levied, but a civil misdemeanor was issued, along with the threat of possible imprisonment.

The Anglican Church of the 16th century in the Colonies was rather strict, wouldn't you say? Mandatory tithing, fines, imprisonment, places of honor and segregation based on social standing, rank or gender... any of these would cause quite a controversy today. Maybe even picketing or other, more aggressive demonstrations.

The second memory took place during my stay at a bed and breakfast on the Outer Banks of North Carolina. When I introduced myself as a priest, the other diners at my breakfast table became very interested and a lengthy conversation ensued. To my surprise, they had never heard of the Vatican Council, Cardinal Bernadin, or even Pope John Paul. I found myself speaking to people totally unaware of the Catholic Church. After breakfast, I reflected on the conversation and chuckled to myself about how we all live in our own safe little worlds, forgetting that the world and life and God are much broader than even the Catholic Church.

The trip was a wonderful experience and the memories I'm sharing with you are just two among many. We all need to spend time to enjoy God's creation. We all need to have pleasant moments to relax, enjoy, and drink in peaceful and loving moments. We all need to re-energize ourselves. Vacations do just that. Thank God for such times.

And now on to more mundane matters in our own little world. As you can see, construction of our new rectory is in full swing. The builder has said that with good weather we will occupy our new home by September. The rectory will have five living suites, one on the first floor and the other

four on the second. Each suite consists of a study, bedroom and bathroom. Also on the first floor will be a kitchen, dining room, living room/study and a private 'family' room. I say family room because to call it a 'meeting' room sounds cold. It will hold a small conference table, yes, but also a comfortable couch and chairs, and will be used for meetings with our priests, such as for engaged couples or mourning families. So rather than being a family room for the priests, it is a family room for the parish. A full basement completes the floor plan. After completion of the rectory, the contractor will give the parish \$340,000 in exchange for the old buildings and land; he will demolish them and begin building new single-family homes.

The new rectory is not palatial -- the living suites are adequate rather than spacious; the common areas comfortable, not luxurious. It will, however, be much more efficient and livable. Gone will be duplication of utility expenses, and on-going repairs to aging structures.

The other mundane matter that needs to be addressed is the shortfall in ordinary income that the parish is facing. Last September we saw the trend and began publishing our weekly offertory and the amount needed in order to meet the minimum expenses of running the parish. That amount -- \$18,500 weekly -- was determined with the help of the parish finance committee and business manager. As of this date, with the fiscal year end just days away, we will have at least a \$40,000 shortfall in Sunday offerings for this year. A full financial report will be published in the bulletin once the final report is sent to the archdiocese later this summer.

During the past year we have faced many unbudgeted but necessary expenses, the majority being repairs to our buildings. Among these were: 1) replacement of the limestone slabs over the main entrance to the church, 2) roof repairs on the church, parish center and school, 3) major HVAC repairs and replacements in the school and parish center, 4) energy-efficient lighting upgrade in the school, and 5) water heater replacements in both rectory buildings. Year to date we have had more than \$160,000 in repair and maintenance costs vs. our budgeted amount of \$128,000.

It becomes harder and harder to meet present needs, so I appeal to you to look deeply into your ability to increase your Sunday offering. We are fortunate to have generous parishioners, but by increasing your offering you will be helping us continue to care for our parish buildings, and provide the necessary staff to care for our parishioners, school children and families that belong to St. Juliana Parish.

Thank you for your past gifts. May they continue with increased generosity.

“For All Of You Have Clothed Yourself With Christ”

Paul speaks of the baptized as clothing themselves with Christ. Or in another place: “Putting on the mind of Christ.” I was wondering: How does Jesus feel about me putting Him on? I mean: Does Jesus have any “say” in the matter? Suppose He doesn’t want me to “put Him on”?

You know, in British-Indian English to “put someone on” means to fool them or tease them or, at it’s worst, to deceive them. A person who suspects that he’s “being taken for a ride,” as we might say in the American idiom might ask: “Is that true, are you putting me on?” or “Aw, c’mon, man, you’re puttin’ me on!”

“You have clothed yourself with Christ.” The mystery of the Incarnation is the reciprocal side of that statement, “Jesus has clothed Himself with me!!” I wonder how He feels about that?! We often think of “being clothed with Christ” as something of a responsibility, i.e. I have to act like Christ because I am clothed with Him. But how does Jesus feel about being clothed with Bob Grib!? Oooooooph!

I may think of it as difficult going around being Jesus for my family, friends and everyone I meet. It’s a little like wearing a “pancho,” one of those heavy rain-coats which cause us to really sweat even though they keep us dry from the outside. They are cumbersome and usually have just a hole in the middle through which we put our head. Imagine walking around all day long wearing a “pancho,” imagine walking

around all day and night long “clothed with Christ!”

But how does it seem to Jesus? How does Jesus like trying to “wear Bob Grib” all the time, 24 - 7, day in and day out? I’m sure it’s an embarrassment for Him every once in a while. Maybe more often than I’d care to think! If it’s often so hard for me to be me, how difficult it must be for Jesus to be me.

In some sense, we “wear” a lot of people in our lives, don’t we? I wear my family and they wear me; I wear my friends and they wear me; I wear my country and my country wears me. It can be very embarrassing at times. Think of a time when someone very close to you has done or said something in public which has been, as the youth say, “un-cool.” But because there is a relationship of love and friendship, you put up with the “un-coolness”, maybe even many times.

“Wearing Jesus” means to put on His value-system and stretch your love to include absolutely all the people of the world. Sometimes that can feel very burdensome. But imagine how much Jesus has had to stretch Himself to “wear you.” It is marvelous what love can do in a relationship. People bear with each other, “wear each other” for decades. It is good to remember from time to time that Jesus has “put me on, that Jesus “wears me” more perfectly than I wear Him.

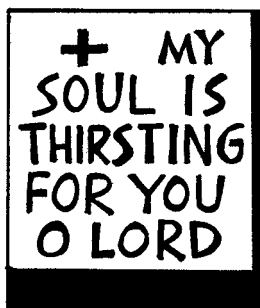

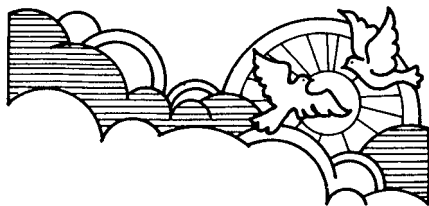

Sister Mary Nick taught at St. Juliana School for many years and was loved by all. Our love and prayers go out to her, as she celebrates this special time in her life.

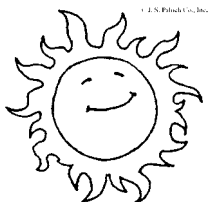
St Juliana Preschool Celebrates "Sailing Into Kindergarten"

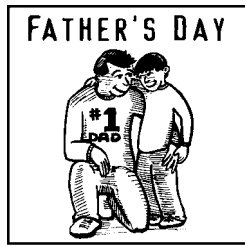

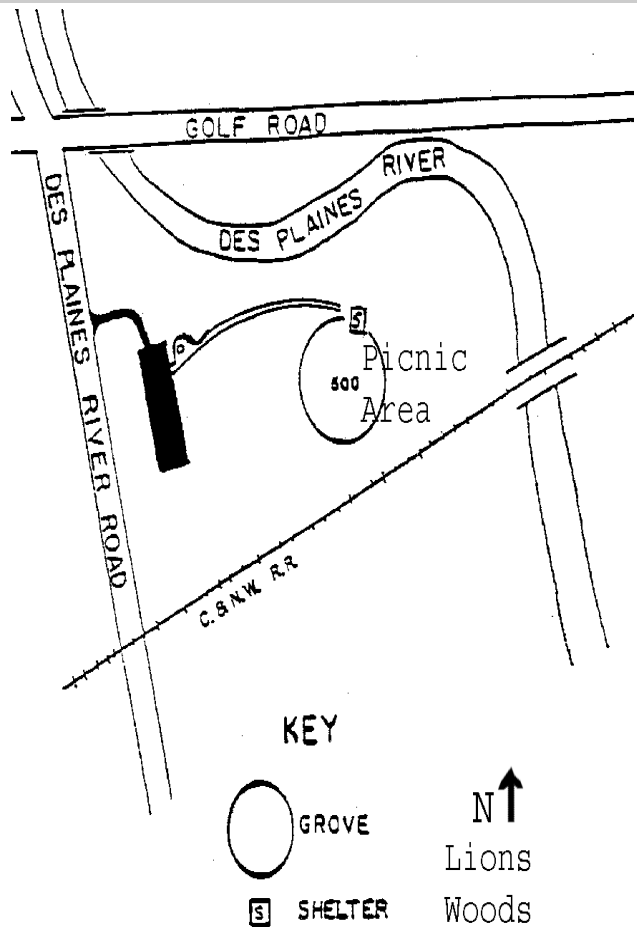
