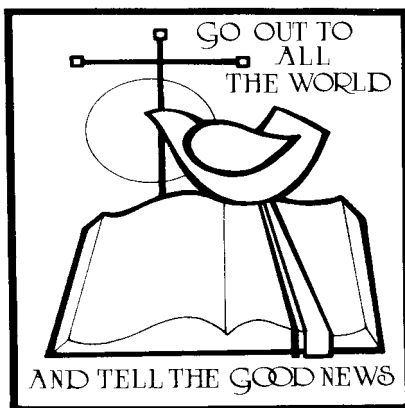

*Father Phil's Ramblings*

News stories have flourished during the past month or so regarding politicians and the reception of the Eucharist. Some bishops have stated that politicians who vote contrary to the teachings of the Catholic Church should not receive Communion. Other bishops, like Cardinal George, have said they do not want to have this conversation take place in the media. Most disturbing is a statement made by a bishop in Colorado, that citizens who vote for candidates opposed to Church teachings should not receive the Eucharist.

I find this idea to be ridiculous. The Republican and Democratic parties both hold positions contrary to the teachings of the Church. Abortion and capital punishment are examples of issues which separate the two major political parties from the teachings of the Church. Therefore -- according to the logic of the aforementioned bishop's statement -- if you or I voted for either a Republican or Democratic candidate in the last election, we should be denied Holy Communion. Unfortunately, there are bishops who are so out of touch with reality, it is frightening. Unfortunately, it is also true that the most illogical bishops seem to garner the largest share of the headlines.

I personally and most strongly believe that human life is sacred from the moment of conception to natural death. Life is a very precious gift from God. Abortion, like capital punishment, prematurely ends a human life that we have no right in taking. I simply cannot find a political party that embraces all of my beliefs.

This world, my friends, is a complicated and messy place. The way to change political agendas is to become active in the political process. Dialogue, education and prayer will help heal the differences. Heavy-handed tactics such as denying Communion to people will only move us to the fringe. It is wrong to use the Eucharist as a weapon. The Eucharist should bring us together as we are fed with the very presence of Christ, not divide us according to our voting record.

On October 11, 1962, the first day of the historic Vatican Council, Pope John XXIII gave his one and only address to the council fathers. In that address he said:

"The Church has always opposed errors. Frequently the Church has condemned them with the greatest severity. Nowadays, however, the Church prefers to make use of the medicine of mercy rather than of severity. She considers that she meets the needs of the present day by demonstrating the validity of her teaching, rather than by condemnation."

My friends, the Church is at its best when she promulgates mercy rather than severity and condemnation. May we not return to the Church at its worst.

### Why Didn't Jesus Preach to the Samaritans? Or Did He?

“On the way, they entered a Samaritan village to prepare for His reception there, but they would not welcome Him because the destination of His journey was Jerusalem. When the disciples James and John saw this they asked, ‘Lord, do you want us to call down fire from heaven to consume them?’ Jesus turned and rebuked them, and they journeyed to another village.”

Jesus did not preach there because He was not welcome. The Samaritans there were not looking for Him.

“As they proceeded on their journey someone said to Him, ‘I will follow you wherever you go.’ Jesus answered him, ‘Foxes have dens and birds of the sky have nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to rest his head’.”

Jesus did not welcome this person. Maybe this person was not looking for Him.

“And to another, Jesus said, ‘Follow me.’ But he replied ‘Lord, let me go first and bury my father.’ But Jesus answered him, ‘let the dead bury their dead. But you, go and proclaim the kingdom of God.’”

This person was looking for Jesus. But maybe he was not looking hard enough.

“And another said to Jesus, ‘ I will follow you, Lord but first let me say farewell to my family at home.’ To him Jesus said, ‘No one who sets a hand to the plow and looks back is fit for the kingdom of God.’”

This person was looking for Jesus. But Jesus was not the first on his “to-do list.”

Today’s Good News seems to imply that Jesus Himself engaged in a constant discernment. He seems to have a more pro-active approach to certain people rather than others. Keep in mind that this is not a question of salvation; that is absolutely intended for everyone, should they want it. But Jesus is looking for fellow workers in the vineyard of the Lord. Jesus goes out of His way to call certain people to the possibility of greater intimacy and responsibility in spreading the message of the Kingdom, God’s love for all.

Where there is no obvious willingness for such intimacy, Jesus moves on. This is not unfair or discriminatory on the part of God. It is simply a reality of friendship and love. We all have certain friends in our lives - maybe they are our spouses - on whom we can depend in any and every crisis. There are other good friends but we know there are limits to what we might ask of them - the intimacy is just not there. Friendships are determined by a mutual sense of self-gift. In a sense, no one “makes a friend” against the will of another.

If Jesus is my friend because He can do something for me, reward me, save me from the fires of hell, then it’s hard to think that Jesus can, in any sense, rely on my friendship.

I guess the distinction could be expressed by thinking of relationships which are biological (family) or based on proximity (neighbors, office companions), or based on need (store-owners, doctors, etc.) and relationships which we have consciously chosen in which we are ready to invest ourselves (as people are fond of saying these days, “100%”).

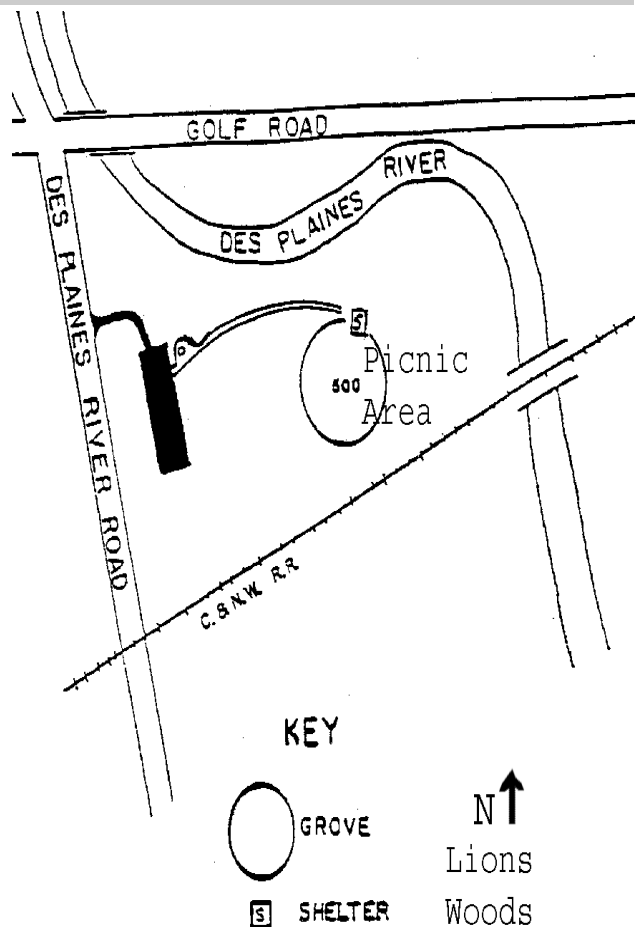

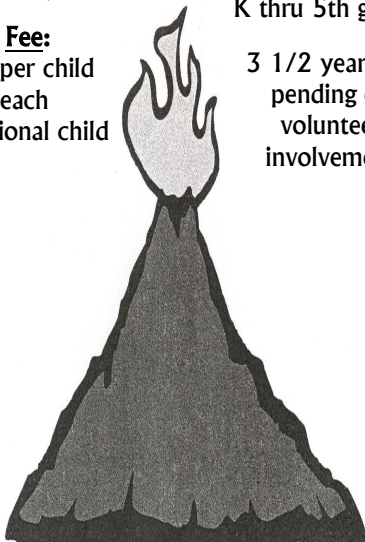
