Father Phil's Ramblings

Free at last! Free at last! Thank God Almighty, free at last!

These words were spoken by Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. in his immortal speech at the reflection pool in Washington, D.C. That speech and those words have been repeated thousands of times. As pastor at Our Lady Help of Christians, a parish that was undergoing racial changes in the 70s, it became a ritual for an 8th grader to memorize that speech and recite it during a ceremony commemorating the birthday of Dr. King. That young student felt so proud to be able to give that speech. Free at last!

Today is July 4th, the date our Declaration of Independence was signed in the year 1776. The most important statement in that document is a testament to freedom. Yet how ironic that freedom in 1776 was denied to black people, then called N...., now addressed as African-Americans, because they were slaves. And freedom was denied to women, who were not allowed to vote until 1920.

Our country has changed greatly during its 228 years of existence. Today we must become aware of our citizens who are not free: the elderly living on fixed incomes; the children who do not receive the education that can free them; those without necessary medical insurance; the new immigrants who are first-generation Americans, and many more who are not Free at last!

As American Catholics living in the 21st century, we too struggle with basic freedom. If we have been a citizen from birth and a Catholic from Baptism, we are called to be Free Sons and Daughters of the Father. We have been raised with the notion that we are called to be free. It seems that the freedom granted citizens of our country, and the freedom that is given through Baptism, may at times collide. Issues that deal with life, from conception to natural death, may be in conflict with either the State or the Church. Therefore, an American Catholic must be wise enough and strong enough to use their freedom to make the right choices.

If we believe that certain laws of our nation run against what we believe as Christian Catholics, we must use our freedom as citizens to effectively change these laws. But we must always respect the freedom of others who do not believe such laws to be wrong. We live in a confusing and volatile time, but we must always continue to strive for freedom; the freedom that allows people to follow their consciences, even if we believe their choices are wrong.

Some day, I hope that a young student will shout the words of Martin Luther King -- Free at Last! -- and truly affect our whole nation and our entire world with his wonderful dream: All men and women -- young and old, rich and poor -- will truly be human, and all death events -- war, abortion, capital punishment, poverty, euthanasia -- will be eliminated.

May that be the dream of all of us on this day that celebrates our independence and freedom.

Democracy Bless America! God Bless America!

Recently, the hubbub about whether "under God" should be in the Pledge of Allegiance rose up again. The argument being: Why should sincere atheists be 'forced' to speak of a Reality which has no place in their lives?

The new Constitution of the EU (European Union) avoids references to the role of Christianity in the development of that part of the world, i.e. avoids referring to the EU as a Christian reality, inspired by and upheld by Christian principles.

What strikes me a bit odd is that we Americans keep tossing around the word "democracy" as if everyone has the same understanding of the word - our understanding of it! In many countries of the world, to speak of "democracy" is as unintelligible as speaking of "God" is to some people. In fact, to some cultures and peoples, to say: "We are going to make you a "democratic state" is almost the same as saying, "We're going to make you Christians."

The issue is: How do we - creatures that we are - separate God from the reality of who we are as people? This is not a question merely for Americans. It challenges every culture and nation. I think the problem arises when we think we know Who God is - that is to say, when we "take God out of politics" we know exactly What or Who we are removing. But sometimes even surgeons do "exploratory" surgery because they are not sure what they are after, what it looks like, how far it has spread.

When we, "political surgeons" that we are, purport to "separate" God from God's own creation, or, as the popular parlance would have it: "Church from State; State from Church;" does it not imply that we know the "limits" of God? Uttering the words "limits" and "God" in the same breath seems to be awesomely casual! Do we think we have separated God from the politico-social structures of our life as a nation by declaring it? Do we think we are free because we have declared ourselves free?

Let's take out God but leave in Love, Friendship, Forgiveness, Equality, Compassion, Self-sacrifice. Are these not some of the "Thousand names of God" as we sing in an Indian Bhajan (hymn)?

The Prophet Isaiah provides us with a beautiful hymn for today:

"Thus says the Lord'

Rejoice with America and be glad because of her, all you who love her; exult, exult with her, all who were mourning over her! Oh, that you may suck fully of the milk of her comfort, that you may nurse with delight at her abundant breasts! For thus say the Lord, Lo I will spread prosperity over America like a river, and the wealth of the nations like an overflowing torrent. As nurslings, you shall be carried in her arms and fondled in her lap; as a mother comforts her child, so will I comfort you; In America you shall find your comfort. When you see this, your heart shall rejoice and your bodies flourish like the grass; the Lord's power shall be known to his servants."

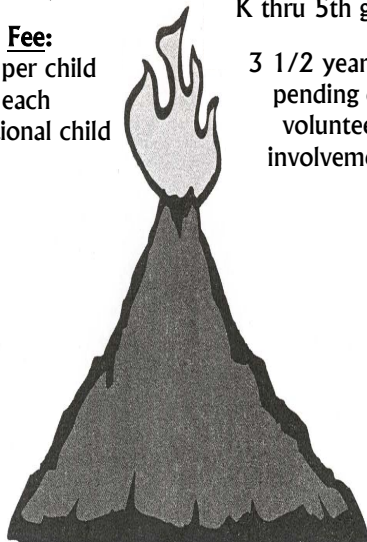

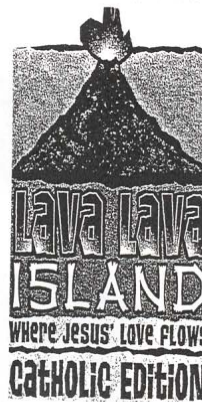

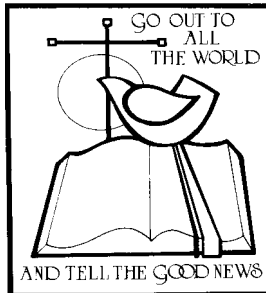
