Father Phil's Ramblings

We began a new fiscal year July 1st. A parish financial report will be issued for the year July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2004. The report will be shared in the bulletin in the near future.

For the past several months, each week we report our Sunday offerings, which is essentially the funds needed to operate our parish efficiently. The amount projected for last year was \$18,500 weekly. As you can see from our weekly reports, we ran close to \$40,000 under that amount for the year end.

The expenses of running our parish are very large, but about 85% of our total income (Sunday, Easter, Christmas, and school tuition) is needed for the salaries of teachers and staff. Therefore, we only have 15% remaining to take care of operating expenses. Some of these are foreseen, but many others occur on an emergency basis.

Last year we spent nearly \$160,000 on necessary repairs and maintenance; we could easily have spent another \$160,000 and still not be in top-notch shape. Many of those were regular and budgeted expenses, but much was not. One glaring example of an unanticipated expense was the repair of the limestone façade of the church.

As in every business, a cost of living increase is needed each year. This year our parish staff is no exception to that rule. Some parishes have reduced staff and eliminated salary increases. At this point we have not done either.

Through that all, our Sunday offerings have flattened out, so to speak. That means we have NOT increased our weekly offerings in line with our increased expenses. I know that 80% of the donations come from about 20% of the parishioners. That saddens me, and I appeal to 100% of the parish, to do your part by increasing your weekly offering to the parish.

We have a great parish and generous parishioners and we want to continue to be such but I need your financial support. Please continue to be generous and if you can, increase your weekly gift to the parish.

--Summer Projects--

There is an added yellow envelope in your offering packet during the summer months. That is our Summer Projects envelope. Each summer we try to complete some much-needed repairs to all or some of our buildings. This summer we are focusing on repair of the roof on the church annex and bell tower, and the junior high wing of the school. Your generosity with your yellow envelopes will help us complete

these repairs on schedule and prevent further damage from rainwater and melting snow.

⊕ A special word of thanks to our parish picnic committee. We had a wonderful day and everyone truly enjoyed themselves. This was our third annual picnic. Tom & Marie Dombai along with their committee which include: Debbie Babich, Pat Moran, Cathy Okrzesik, Michael Pechnick, Julie & Bob Pellegrino, Colleen Sanchez, Melody & Todd Steffen & Pete Stolarski have done a bang-up job, AGAIN!

† The completion of the new rectory will happen very soon. The builders have told me that the new rectory will be finished before September and the priests will be able to move in at that time. This new building will make rectory living at St. Juliana's quite a bit different. We won't be in separate houses and the efficiency of the new space will ultimately save us quite a bit of money.

Priests are men who keep things, so before we move, we will have a rectory sale, so to speak. Books, used furniture, glassware, etc. will go to the highest bidder.

⊕ A sad item that I wish to share with you concerns the vandalism that is taking place in our parking lot. Last year alone we spent over \$3,000 to replace broken windows. Recently, a neighbor reported to me that much activity takes place in the parking lot after 9:30 pm.

We have many police officers in our parish. I appeal to you to be the "watch dog" so to speak and police our lot - rather your lot.

A Good Samaritan With a Small "s"

"For this command that I enjoin on you today is not too mysterious and remote for you...Not up in the sky...Nor is it across the sea. No, it is something very near to you, already in your mouths, and in your hearts; you have only to carry it out."

The command was specified by Jesus: "Love your neighbor as yourself." He made it even more clear when He said: "Love one another as I have loved you!" The extent of this command, i.e. who does it include, is clarified by the Parable of the Good Samaritan. You notice I capitalized "Good Samaritan." That makes that character someone special, a personality etched into our Catholic Christian tradition: THE GOOD SAMARITAN.

We can easily put the Good Samaritan on a pedestal, as we sometimes do with the canonized Saints, and then have this feeling that to imitate him requires special graces. But in the Kingdom everyone is a good samaritan, albeit with a small "g" and small "s". In other words, being like the Good Samaritan is the ordinary lifestyle of the Catholic Christian. No need for the "wow-effect" when we see kindnesses rendered by a brother or sister to a person or persons of another ethnic, racial, or religious persuasion. That's what Catholic Christians are supposed to do!

That Jesus chose a Samaritan as the hero of His story had dramatic import for His Jewish listeners. It was not just a story-statement that "all people are equal." To use a Samaritan as the main protagonist was to cut through all the cultural and religious reasons both Samaritans and Jews had for despising one another, for not being "nice" to one another.

Once the dust and politicizing of the conflicts in Afghanistan and Iraq settles down - as it will have to for normalcy to begin to return to that region, there will be many stories of "samaritans" among the troops on both sides and the ordinary people who live in ordinary time. People will be shocked, even scandalized, when they hear stories of the many samaritans who acted in kindly, fashion, perhaps even at the risk of their own or their family's lives in order to show kindness or compassion.

To speak of kindnesses of Iraqis towards our military personal - our own brothers and sisters - may strike some the same way Jesus' story of the Good Samaritan struck His Jewish listeners. Perhaps initial shock and disbelief. But maybe, just maybe, tears welling up form hearts whose faith in God's power to touch the hearts of ALL PEOPLE, has been revitalized.

And perhaps we will turn our attention to the "samaritan acts" of our own daily lives: the smiles, cups of coffee shared, visits to sick neighbors, "thanks" said to bus drivers and crossing guards, a cool drink to a mail carrier on a hot day, patience shown to children noisily celebrating summer vacation, staying in Church until the end of Mass to say a word or two to the priest or a neighbor not seen since last week, controlling uninformed opinions about particular racial or ethnic groups in the parish and city, respecting elderly citizens as they move a bit more slowly through life, etc., etc.

And Jesus will ask each of us: "Which of the characters in my parable was neighbor to the person in difficulty? Are you neighbor to the people of the world?"

And we'll be happy to say: "You bet, Lord!"


