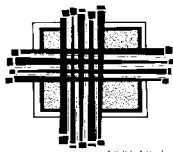

Father Phil's Ramblings

Asking and Receiving

Prayer was very important to Jesus. It influenced the ebb and flow of His daily life. If prayer was important to God's Son, is prayer important to you and me?

I offer these questions in regards to prayer:

1) Does prayer change things?

Prayer does not change God but prayer should change our position to God. Allow me to explain. The sun does not change its position in relation to the earth; the earth changes its position in relation to the sun. Because of that wonderful (God-given) order of nature, we have four seasons. Prayer should put us more in contact with the Son. If the events of the day make you dour and gloomy, move out into the bright 'Sunlight' and be refreshed. Prayer does not change things in God; prayer should change us.

2) Why do we pray?

Whatever we may believe about prayer, we pray. Make the situation desperate enough, or traumatic or extreme enough, and anyone will pray, spontaneously and naturally. There are no atheists in fox holes. Prayer often springs from a crisis or a happening. A situation does not have to be negative for us to cry out, "Oh God!" At the birth of a child or a good report from a doctor we may spontaneously shout, "Oh God! Thank you!"

3) How should we pray?

Two suggestions:

- 1) Listen; don't speak; contain yourself; calm down.
- 2) Keep it simple.

I am reminded of an example of how those two suggestions can be used to help us pray. A rather elderly man was seen praying in a country church. He sat in the last pew and remained there, praying, for hours on end. The pastor was rather intrigued by the man's devotion and stopped to ask for what the gentleman was praying. Tears welled up in the old man's eyes and he said he was struggling to say the "Our Father" but was unable to finish the prayer. He never got past the first two words, "Our Father..." as the thought and magnitude of those two words never allowed him to go further. What a wonderful example of prayer.

May we all pray that way. May God be so real and present to us that our prayer will be so deep and beautiful.

Finally, may our prayers always conclude with: "Not my will but Thine be done."

"The Father Will Give The Holy Spirit To Those Who Ask Him"

Last Sunday my brother Phil and I traveled to Elgin to help celebrate the graduation from high school of our cousins Johnny and Phyllis' grandson Brad. It has been quite some time since we've been able to enjoy such a family gathering. As a result, many of our teen relatives are still unfamiliar to me since I was out of the country for so long.

Brad is a strapping young man, about to head for basic training as a Navy Seal. In addition to him, there were a number of other "grandchildren" at the party. Some of them were classmates of Brad's and his sister Laura. Mark and Jennifer were there too, Johnny and Phyllis' other grandchildren.

My brother Phil remarked to me on the way home: "It's been a long time since we were in the midst of exuberant young people like them." I had the same sort of feeling. We were the "grandparents" of those 15 or more teens there.

One thing that caught my attention was the way the "real" grandparents and grand children interacted with each other. Subtle sort of things: a hand on the shoulder, a touch as a grandma or grandson passed by in the food line, a grandchild just standing next to or behind a grandparent's chair, a shared familial laugh, teasing about a grandchild's latest date, serious talk with the other grandchildren about their work or some new development in their lives, shared love expressions passed across the yard or outside deck, grandparents' look of glowing pride as a grandchild said something humorous. It was family at its best.

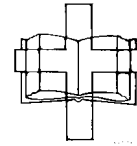
And then I thought of Joachim and Ann, the grandparents of Jesus. As Jesus grew from toddler to teen to young adult, the love of Joachim and Ann must have been well nigh palpable. Just see Jesus standing behind Joachim and playing, even as a teen, with Joachim's gnarled hands and fingers. No big deal. Just doing what grandsons do with their grandfathers. Maybe some playful teasing. But always, always trust and a deep, unspoken respect and love.

When Ann started turning arthritic in her later years, Jesus would be there to help her sit down or stand up. She would lean heavily on him, not so much because she actually needed all that support, but just because He was her dear, dear grandson. Whenever Mary complained that Jesus was spending a lot of time up in the hills, sometimes leaving his chores, it was Grandma Ann who rushed to His rescue to say that the Boy needed some time for Himself. And Jesus, aware of her great love for Him, would squeeze her in his teen arms and bend down and kiss her.

When it's a question of grandparents: "Every grandchild who asks, receives; every grandchild who seeks, finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will open by Grandma and/or Grandpa. What grandparent among you would hand her grandchild a snake when he/she asks for a fish? Or hand her a scorpion when he/she asks for an egg? If you then, who are grandparents, know how to give good gifts to your grandchildren, how much more will the Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask?"

"Daddy, please give me the Holy Spirit...pleeeeeease!"

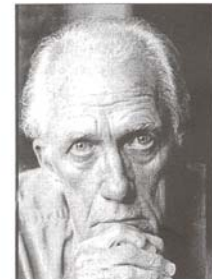
