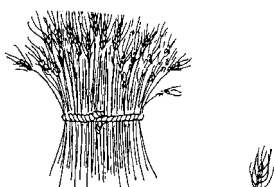

## "The Things You Have Prepared, To Whom Will They Belong?"

Soon our new rectory will be completed. This collecting my "worldly goods" for the move to our new quarters is nothing new to me, though I must admit that I have not become adept at it. In this matter, practice does seem to make perfect, or, shall we say, easy. Since I returned from India in 1996, I have moved, let's see, maybe six times.

When I returned from India, I came with two large suitcases. Now I have those suitcases plus boxes and boxes. It's true that a good bit of that "luggage" is "family possessions," inherited when Mom sold our home and moved into assisted living and, finally nursing care.

During my early Jesuit formation, we were always reminded that it is necessary to "travel light," "to be ready to go to a new assignment at a moment's notice from the superior." That's somewhat more easy to do when you are shifting from one part of formation to another. But, before you know it, you begin to "collect" things, even people (!), as you move from place to place.

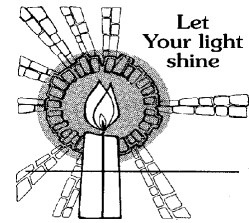
We all have basements, closets, attics where the memorabilia of years begin to collect. The value these things have is sometimes deeply personal and often involves the very core of our being. Even now, as I sift through my possessions, I wonder: "How can I get rid of these photos? How can I dispose of these precious letters or keepsakes? What shall I do with all these books which have been so important a part of my formation and growth as a priest and person?"

Today's liturgical readings remind me at this time of transition that all these things are, in some sense, "vanity." As I age, there is a desire to return to the "light cavalry" style of life I lived in my early years. Emotional attachments to things and people and circumstances of life continue, in a sense, to encumber me, to weigh me down. It is difficult to think of discarding cherished memorabilia - photos, gifts received from loved ones, even a special piece of clothing received as a gift from a close friend or relative.

It frightens me sometimes to experience loss of memory about people whom I love and know well. I need "things" to remind me of them, to remind me of the love that has surrounded my whole life. And yet, a time is fast approaching when the things I hold precious will be meaningless to a later generation of people, even within my own family. There is a 'letting go' which life itself will orchestrate. It may begin with things and memories of people, but it may even begin to encroach on my very personality. "The things you have prepared, to whom will they belong?"

But there is **ONE** who will continue to walk the road with me, even when there is only the "ME-Ness" of who I am left to me. Then the "Take and Receive" prayer of my life will be complete. Only the "**GRACE AND LOVE**" of God will remain and I will know Him/Her of Whom all these gifts have spoken so eloquently. The I will sing the "Here I Am" unencumbered, free of worry. In that time, even memory itself will no longer be needed, because I shall live in the eternal **I AM!**

## BARNES FILLED WITH RICHES

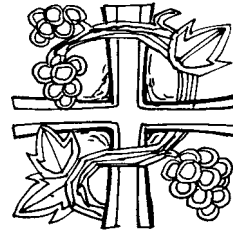

## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

When Pope Pius XII died in 1958, there was the usual buzz of speculation about likely successors. Cardinal Agagianian, Patriarch of the Armenians, was highly thought of as a likely choice. This took many Catholics by surprise, since he had never celebrated the same liturgy as Pope Pius, but followed ancient Armenian customs according to the Eastern Church, which veils the Eucharistic liturgy from sight by a series of curtains, and in which the priest kneels while the people stand for Communion.

In the years that followed, the Second Vatican Council would affirm the dignity and independence of the Eastern Churches, in complete union with Rome, yet different in patterns of life and worship. We have the same faith, the same sacraments, and the same pope. Yet everywhere in the world our separate Churches are combined into families held together by the ministry of bishops. All of this serves as warning: if you ever say, "But we've always done it this way," you are on very thin ice indeed!
