**PASTORAL COUNCIL

*Father Phil's Ramblings*

Last year at about this time, a wonderful dream started to become a reality.

Over the years, many parishioners have told me that a new home for our priests was needed. I agreed, but there were always other, more urgent needs to address. As time went by, however, and repairs and updates to the rectories became a regular occurrence, it became obvious we had to take a closer look at the situation. In particular, we needed to determine the condition and viability of the buildings, and the value and best use of the land on which they sit.

The parish finance committee requested and obtained inspection reports on the two (originally three) structures, which detailed their condition and cost of short and long-term repairs. It was estimated that the parish could easily spend \$125,000 repairing sewer, plumbing, masonry, roofing and structural problems, and still be left with inefficient and aged buildings. In addition, we consulted with a local Realtor and representatives from the real estate department at the archdiocese to help determine an approximate market value for the land.

These efforts led us to publish a Request for Proposal for the sale of a portion of the land, in return for financial consideration and the construction of a new rectory on the northernmost lot. I received an offer of \$810,000 for the property, which is a parcel 150' wide by 127' deep. The person who made the offer was David Cahill of Cahill Builders. He also offered to construct a new rectory for \$450,000. After talking to our finance committee, the archdiocese and informing the parish of these two proposals, I accepted the two-part proposal from Mr. Cahill.

Ground was broken in May, good weather and workmanship prevailed, and I'm pleased to report the occupancy permit has been approved by the city. The archdiocese has also inspected and approved the new building, and the final sale and transfers will take place on August 13th. On August 16th and 17th all five priests will move into our new rectory.

There will be a rectory sale on Friday, August 20th from 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM and Saturday, August 21st from 9:00 AM to 1:00 PM. This is an everything-must-go sale. Members of the Friendship Club have volunteered to run the sale. Come and be surprised at the good deals you can get!

The dream of a new home for the priests of St. Juliana has become a reality. On Saturday, October 2nd, Cardinal George will bless our new 'digs.' May peace and love be shown to all who enter!

## The Catholic Faith and Stem Cells

Much has been said and written in recent weeks concerning stem cell research, more specifically about embryonic stem cell research. Given the importance of this topic, I'd like to offer some basic information about stem cell research and Catholic teaching.

**What is a stem cell?** Stem cells are cells that have the potential to become many other kinds of cells depending on the signals they receive. Stem cells, in theory, provide possibilities for replacing damaged or non-functioning tissues to treat various kinds of diseases. These cells are found from the beginning of embryonic development through adult life. Sources for stem cells include umbilical cords, human blood and bone marrow.

**Is the Church against stem cell research?** No, so long as those stem cells are derived from appropriate sources. Catholic moral teaching prohibits *embryonic* stem cell research.

**What is an embryo and why is stem cell research involving embryos illicit?** After a sperm cell fertilizes the ovum there is now a new organism called a zygote. In human beings, the term embryo is usually used for the period of development from fertilization/conception until the end of the eighth week of pregnancy.

In embryonic stem cell research, scientists remove stem cells from a human embryo for the purpose of research. The living embryo is destroyed by this procedure. While an embryo has not yet reached the stage of being a fetus (eight weeks after conception) it still has an inherent dignity that must be respected.

**Are embryonic stem cells necessary for medical research?** No. There are many other sources for stem cells, principally adult stem cells that are taken from blood or bone marrow. Removing stem cells from these sources does not harm the person. These are readily accessible and ethically neutral sources for stem cells.

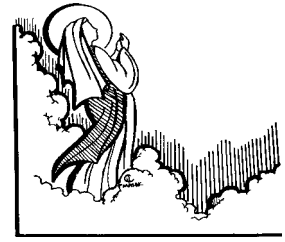
**Why does Catholic moral teaching say that embryonic stem cell research is immoral?** Human life begins at conception and is worthy of respect and protection until natural death. Catholic moral teaching holds that human dignity and rights are inherent from the moment of conception; such rights do not spring up at some arbitrary size or age in human development. Embryonic stem cell research is a procedure that destroys a living human embryo, thus violating that inherent dignity.

**But by objecting to *embryonic* stem cell research, is the Catholic Church standing in the way of scientific research and possible medical breakthroughs?** No, Stem cells are readily available from other sources. In fact, many researchers prefer stem cells from adult sources because they develop fewer complications in the research process.

All people of good will hope that medical research will be able to find cures for diseases that inflict human suffering. Yet all research must take place within boundaries that safeguard the dignity of human life at every stage of development.

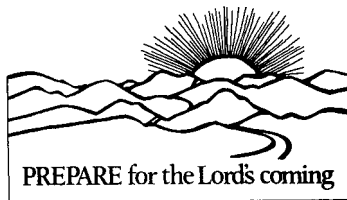

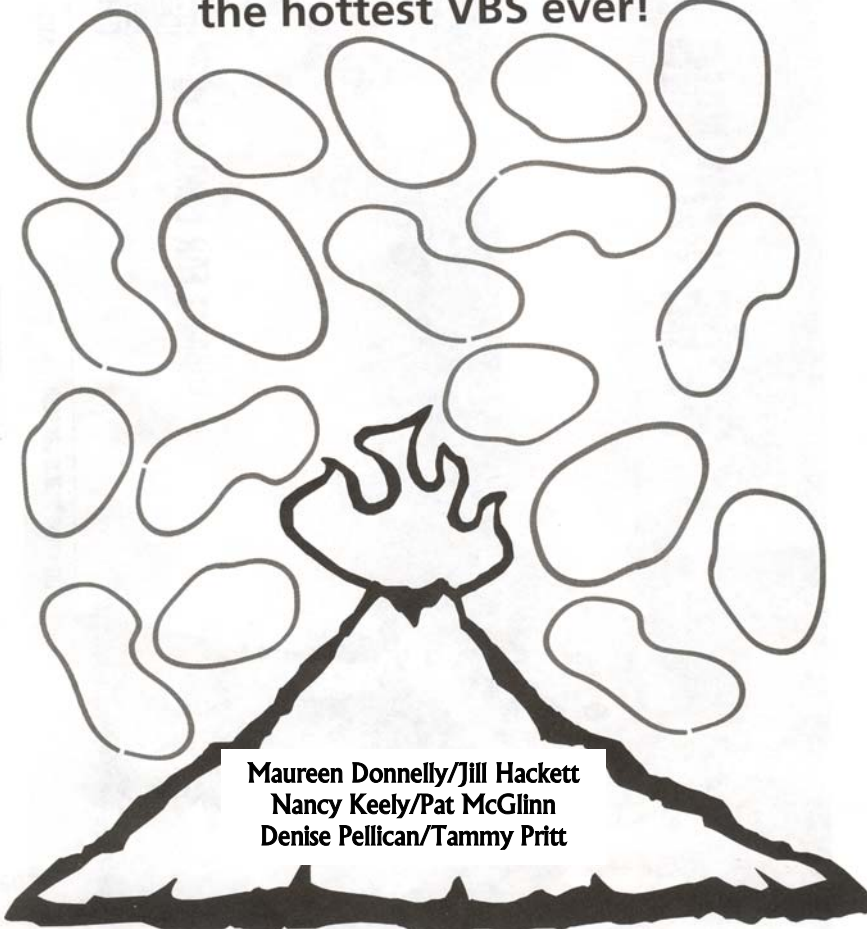
