## Father Phil's Ramblings

### Assumption of Mary

In 1947, Pope Pius XII made the assumption of Mary, body and soul, into heaven an article of faith. The Assumption of Mary has also been known as the Dormition or Sleep of Mary. Every article of faith, besides being that which we must believe, offers us a deeper understanding of ourselves. The Assumption of Mary does just that.

Our faith tells us that our bodies and souls have been redeemed through Jesus' death and resurrection. In the face of death, which is inevitable for all of us, is the beginning of new life. We all believe that, but do we believe that our bodies have also been redeemed?

Our bodies are not evil, but are good, and our bodies are the means of love and laughter, peace and friendship, joy and wonder. Too often we misuse our bodies, and use the gift of humanness to mistreat others; offering not peace but war and terror, and killing the spirits of others with abusive and slanderous words.

There is a beautiful picture of a young African-American boy standing on a dusty road with his shoes untied. Under the image is the caption, "*God don't make junk!*"

In the beginning of creation, in the Garden of Eden, everything was beautiful and good. God saw that all of creation was good and the creation of man and woman was very good.

But man and woman - Adam and Eve sinned and turned away from God and Goodness.

Jesus, came to restore the goodness and life to all of creation. That restoration extends to both our bodies and souls.

Mary shared in that redeeming act of her Son and her reward was the Assumption - body and soul into heaven.

We share through our Baptism in that same redemptive act. Therefore life is good and we are to be people who have been redeemed to enjoy life and be vehicles of love and friendship.

May we, with every fiber of our being bring goodness and love to all.

## “Torn”

I couldn't think of a title for this reflection but the word that popped into my mind was “torn”. Besides being the solemnity of the Assumption of Our Lady, the 15th of August is also Indian Independence Day. On the 14th Pakistan celebrates its independence too. Independence from British rule. So I'm “torn” between our liturgical feast - a great one in the Church's calendar - and the national feast of India.

Indian Catholic-Christians rejoice with great pride that the feast commemorating the independence of their country coincides with the Feast of the Assumption of Mary. It's a double-barreled holiday of India's Christians. It's on a day like today that we realize how “young” India and Pakistan are in the history of the world's nations. They have been independent for only 57 years, having been subjected to British rule for over 200 years.

“Bharat Mata ki jay (pronounced ‘jeye’)!” “Mother India be praised!” How significant that Indians think of their country as feminine as “Mata-Mother!” She is for them the Mother who brings to birth, nurtures, protects, loves with an almost fierce tenderness. “Bharat Mata”, Mother India.

Is it simply a coincidence of history that India's and Pakistan's freedom should be celebrated at this time of Mother Mary's Assumption? A mere chance that Mary's own “independence” from this human life should be the model for Indian-Pakistani independence? What message is being given to the millions of Indian-Pakistani women, young and old, by this feast of Mary?

We Americans are quick to judge peoples with our norms of development and independence. Since Independence, Indian women have made great progress in the fields of education and employment. Since that often seems like “baby-steps” to our Western point of view, we are often tempted to think of Indian or Pakistan as “backward” or “masculine societies.” Such is surely not the case. As role-models, Indian women have always had the divine qualities of God personified as female aspects of the divine. The unreflective mind might label these divine attributes as “goddesses”. A cursory reading of reports about the consecration of the Hindu temple in Bartlett recently can easily mislead the Western mind with its references to “idols” or “gods and goddesses.”

Let us keep in mind that there were movements in the early Church which attempted to speak of Mary as a “goddess.” She is totally “from our side” in this magnificent mystery of God's Plan of Salvation. But in her purity of heart and single-minded devotion to God's will, she reveals to us how divine qualities are lived out in human life. Sin has no place in her heart. She is, after all, the “ark of God's covenant and love” with the universe!

The women of India and Pakistan, as do the women of the world, celebrate the call and response that Mary is. She is “Miriam, the mother of Jesus” of the Muslim tradition. She is the woman of all cultures and times: mother, wife, friend, revealer of God's face and person.

“Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you. Blessed are you among women and blessed is the fruit of your womb, Jesus.

Holy Mary, Mother of God. Pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen (“So be it!).”

## Saying Yes.

By the time people read this on Saturday afternoon, I'll be driving to Michigan to attend the vow ceremony of two friends who have completed their novitiate and are taking vows in the Society of Jesus on Sunday. Such a generous response to God's call is not free of difficulty, confusion or even pain. But every baptized person can look to Mary for inspiration; Mary's “yes” to God cost her “not less than everything” (T.S. Eliot). Yet as we contemplate her assumption into heaven, we see that every sacrifice she made for the sake of God's call was rewarded with an incredibly beautiful gift, a share in the resurrection of Christ her Son.

This Sunday let us pray in gratitude for those religious who are starting out and those who have entered their heavenly home. Mindful of Sr. Remy and the beauty of a life dedicated to the Lord, let us ask the Lord to inspire a new generation of men and women to hear and answer Christ's call: follow me.

## Welcome School Year 2004/2005

Welcome to the 2004/2005 school year at St. Juliana School. The teachers and staff are looking forward to meeting the students and their families, and working with each of you to continue our ministry of Catholic education. We remain committed to our mission of hearing and following the gospel message, providing an excellent academic program and assisting our students in accepting responsibility for themselves and others. I hope you will join me and the staff in praying for one another as we strive to provide *"life-long learning in a faith-filled community"*.

**Please Note:** School Hours are 8:15 am to 2:40 pm.

First tuition payment was due in June. Child's room number will not be assigned unless account is current.

**Morning Arrival:** The first two days of school the students will gather in the school parking lot in the area of their grade sign. The teachers will be there to help organize them into correct homerooms. Please respect our **"NO TRAFFIC ZONES"**. On school days only, our school parking lot and parts of Oketo and Osceola Avenues will be closed to all car traffic from 7:55 to 8:20 am, to provide the necessary safety for all students. After the first two days of school, the children may enter the building from any door on Osceola or the parking lot. The doors will open at 8:05 am. Bike riders may lock their bikes on the bike racks located on the Oketo side of the parking lot by the Junior High entrance.

**Dress Code:** Students come in the traditional uniform with solid black, brown or navy blue shoes. Uniform shorts (not gym shorts), light blue uniform shirts (boys) or white blouses/polo knits (girls) may be worn until October 15th. Gym shoes are to be worn for gym classes only.
