*Father Phil's Ramblings***Nothing worthwhile comes easily.**

That statement is so true; things of real value do not come easily. Quite often on the golf course, after a good shot or few pass, one may feel pretty confident. But for most of us, fifteen minutes of glory lasts but fifteen minutes; we quickly fail or are ill prepared for some snowmen. (For non-golfers, a snowman is an 8.)

Unless we practice and practice, we will never improve, because nothing comes easily. After he shoots a 69 -- or less -- Tiger Woods still hits the range, because nothing comes easily. Vijay Singh takes hundreds of practice shots before and after every round, because nothing comes easily. One has to be fully committed in order to focus on one thing.

Now what does all this golf jargon have to do with today's Gospel message? Not a whole lot, really -- it was just my way to get all the golf nuts in the congregation to read further.

The cost of being a follower of Jesus demands that we practice -- practice -- practice at being a follower of Jesus, because nothing worthwhile comes easily. We all carry around much baggage. Our minds are loaded with all kinds of things that have little to do with God. Not bad things. Not garbage. But too many things. Concerns about finances, family and friends, health and security, hopes and fears. To follow Jesus, though, we must let go of our baggage. Things must become secondary.

In following Jesus, we must be willing to go against the grain; to paddle upstream; to forget about ourselves. To be a follower of Jesus -- a disciple -- may mean to listen rather than speak. It may mean accepting those we do not understand, and learning to love our enemies. It may mean leaving the comfort of our childish self-centeredness and taking up a cross of self-denial. It will mean some things, or some part of us must die before other things or the better side of us may be born.

All of the above does NOT come easily and nothing worthwhile comes easily. We need to practice -- practice -- practice.

## “Who Can Know God’s Counsel?”

And, as the reading from the Book of Wisdom continues: “Or who can conceive what the Lord intends...scarce do we guess the things on earth, and what is within our grasp we find with difficulty; but when things are in heaven who can search them out? Or who ever knew your counsel, except you had given wisdom and sent your Holy Spirit from on high?”

Hmmmm... this is a far cry from the attitude that says: “ You just give us enough time and we’ll understand all the mysteries of the universe - the black holes, the varied and marvelous effects of DNA. The depths of the oceans and heights of the upper atmospheres, etc. ” Give us enough time and we will be able to “explain” God. In fact, there will be no need to posit a “God-out-there” because we shall have understood and traced the origins of everything.

“Who can know God’s counsels?” The Good News for today tells us “...Anyone of you who does not renounce all his possessions cannot be my disciple.” Are those “possessions” only of a material, monetary kind? Or are they the things which seem to give us status and importance? More importantly, are the possessions of which Jesus speaks the things - attitudes, scientific knowledge, psychological insights, money, education, social status - which create in us the belief that we are “in control”?

Discovering God has always involved a surrender of sorts. One is, in a sense, “discovered by God,” and not vice-versa. One does not subject God to the microscope or the test-tube or experimentation, in the misguided belief that, in the end, we shall “discover” this thing, this force which we have called God or Allah or Adonai or whatever. It is to be remembered that we are always playing our game in God’s field of dreams - not ours! It is not: “Oh, God is so much like us!” But: “Oh, we - I - are so much like God!!”

“Who ever knew your counsel, except you had given Wisdom and sent your Holy Spirit from on High.” The Incarnation of God is not only the mystery of God becoming human like us; it is the mystery of God becoming man like us; it is only complete when we experience ourselves as taken up into the mystery of God. You can experience this fully only when God is all that matters for you. This is, yes, a “hard saying” is it not? I am reminded of St. Ignatius’ spiritual insight that if the gift of one’s self seems too utterly total and almost “suicidal,” one should pray for the grace to be able to pray for this grace, which is the central choice our lives.

Some people think that the choice between Good and Evil is the key issue in life. It is not. No one chooses Evil for its own sake. But of the many goods in our lives - mother, father, wife, children, brothers, sisters and even one’s own life - there is the One Good of which these others are mere revelations. “Choose me and live,” says the Lord.

When some heard Jesus talk like this, they simply shook their heads and walked away. Others, even though not fully understanding, threw up their hands and rolled their eyes at each other, and followed. In time, Wisdom and the Holy Spirit began the life-long process of helping them experience that God is truly all that matters.

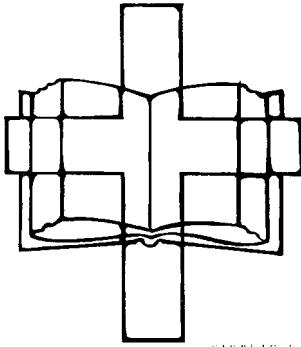

## "RCA...I"

Sometimes the "I" has to stand alone. Entering into the Rite of Christian Initiation is an "adult" thing. It's "adult" because a person is deciding to make enquiries, ask questions, mull over answers - given, maybe even engage in a little friendly controversy - and all for the sake of arriving at the truth. The motivation could come from a variety of different sources: a Catholic spouse; a chance meeting with a Catholic at the office or on the golf course; a highly critical article about the Catholic Church in a newspaper or a news item on T.V.; a reminiscence from a long-forgotten Catholic childhood; a personal or even national tragedy or any other movement of the Spirit of God who "broods over the world" in loving compassion.

C' mon! Join the movers and shakers! Or perhaps better, the "seekers." We'll begin our RCIA journey at 10:00 am, after the 9:00 am Eucharist Liturgy on Sunday, September 26th. We'll meet in the Pastoral Center on the corner of Touhy and Osceola.
