## Father Phil's Ramblings

We are called to be Pilgrim People.

As I write this article, I reflect back upon my own life and life's experiences, challenges and priestly assignments.

We are called to be pilgrim people and not settlers. The Chosen People in the Old Testament were freed from slavery and were led into the desert to find the Promised Land. It has been said that all of life is to be lived between Egypt and the Promised Land. Upon being led into the wilderness of the desert, many of the people complained and would have preferred to return to Egypt and slavery. The point is, ALL of life is lived between Egypt and the Promised Land, not just part(s) of it. In other words, all of life is intended to be a pilgrimage – from beginning to end. As I get closer to retirement – yes, retirement – I have been praying and reflecting upon my 'priestly pilgrimage,' so to speak. On May 1<sup>st</sup>, 1961, I was ordained a priest of the Archdiocese of Chicago. How little my classmates and I truly knew about Jesus and the Church, yet we were told that we were prepared for priesthood. I was just entering my priestly ministry, and it didn't take me long to realize how little we knew of the tremendous gift of priesthood to be shared with God's people. I was truly humbled.

My first assignment was St. Ita's on the north side of Chicago. Being a young priest, I "inherited" the Teen Club. Although I had not advanced far beyond my own youth, my REAL knowledge of youth was only just beginning. At teen dances I would walk around and ask dancing young couples if the Holy Spirit could fit between them! How dumb a question, but those were the times. My ministry at St. Ita's was cut short when I found myself transferred to St. Anne's in Barrington. Not only did I not have a say in the matter, I never even thought of questioning the transfer.

Each of my assignments taught me more and more about the wonderful faith and love of the people. In 1965, St. Anne's was a small-town parish -- staffed by an old pastor and me – and it would soon grow to be a large, suburban parish. (The pastor was all of 65 years old, which certainly doesn't look quite so 'old' to me anymore!) At St. Anne's I began to get a stronger sense of church as community, as family. The Vatican Council was ending and change was exploding, in liturgy, music, family Masses, Cursillos, and teen ecumenical groups meeting in the homes of parish leaders.

In 1972, my dear friend and classmate, Tom Ventura, and I felt the challenge and need to serve in a changing parish. We applied (by this time, we no longer assigned – we could apply) for team ministry. Team ministry was another of those visionary ideas that flowed from the Vatican Council. We were assigned to Our Lady Help of Christians (HOC) on the west side of Chicago, a parish that had lacked strong leadership in the midst of racial and ethnic changes. My six years at HOC were – as I like to reflect – a Camelot experience. The staff was made up of 10 people who not only prayed together, but who together also worked 2 weekly Bingos sessions, taught in the school, and joined neighborhood organizations – all to help stabilize and strengthen the parish and the community. After six years, the urge to move on and become a pastor became the new challenge.

I applied for Immaculate Conception (IC) parish on North Park in the city and was named pastor. Shortly after beginning that assignment I learned that pastors have many other responsibilities in addition to being priests. IC was a very small parish with an equally small school; the enrollment was 88 students. To my mind, closing a school is a death experience, but it had to be done. The weekly Mass attendance came from Old Town and Lake Shore Drive. IC was like two separate parishes: a school community and a church community. As you can see, I am not a settler but a pilgrim.

**The RCIA Is Ours, Not Mine!...** You may have noticed that whenever I "sign" one of my reflections in the bulletin, I like to add to my name: "RCIA Moderator." It's not a status-symbol. Each one of you could as easily add that title to your name - and with profound implications for your life in St. Juliana Parish.

As the end of September draws near - the time for beginning the formal RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults) program, I always find myself wringing my hands and wondering: Will there be any candidates for the formal program this year? How do I advertise RCIA? Will I be judged by the numbers of people who apply? Should I, maybe, buy some T.V. time to advertise the program...radio time? Perhaps NPR (National Public Radio) would be a fitting station to advertise...? Maybe I should have handbills printed and stand at the train station and proffer them to travelers. Or perhaps I could leave some flyers on the tables at Bailey's!?

Even as I have written pithy advertisements for RCIA and had Claudette adorn them with her wonderful creativity and skills on the computer to use in the parish bulletin, I am aware that the advertising is "entre nous," as we might say. Do the advertisements get to the people for whom they are intended?

Then it occurred to me: The RCIA IS NOT MINE - NOT BOB GRIB'S. IT IS OURS - ST. JULIANA'S! Boy, was that a relief to me! Whew!

As I was reflecting on this, a comparison with our school came to mind. Our school is not just Mrs. Barton, the teaching staff, the clerical and maintenance staffs and the parents of children actually registered in the school. St. Juliana School is all of us. We all help create the "spirit" and "attraction" of our school. People might say: "Well, I heard such good things about St. Juliana School...my nephew is in the 8th grade and grandmother suggested that I enroll my daughter here because she experiences the students as so respectful and happy...hey, I went to St. Juliana's and I want my kids to have the great time I had...you can't beat it!"

RCIA is a lot like that. It needs testimonial from the Adult Christians who live here. You know how we recommend a good restaurant or a good movie or a good place to vacation. Well, RCIA has to be recommended by us who live it as a daily reality. No amount of tricky or "cute" advertising is going to get a person to comment themselves to an extended program and ultimate initiation of Easter time. The experience of Catholic-Christian life has to be seen and felt in the "vibrations" of school, liturgy, pastoral ministrations, next-door-neighborliness, smiles, handshakes, shared-standing-at-the-bus-stop, etc., etc.

Reread today's Good News (Luke 15: 1-32). It gives us a cue for our RCIA Program. Look around your lives and the lives of your extended families and friends. Maybe you want to share the good news of your life at St. Juliana Parish with someone you love, someone you care about.

You've been to one or more of Margie's concerts, haven't you? She's fond of involving the kid's in an "action-song" or two, where they act out the words with gestures and body movements. That's what RCIA is. We, the whole parish, teach candidates the "action-song" of being Catholic-Christians. Father Bob explains the song a bit, but we all DO the song and dance the dance.

There'll be an introductory meeting for interested candidates in this year's RCIA program at the new rectory (7158 N. Osceola) at 10:00 am on Sunday, September 26th. More info? Call the office or Father Bob at 631.4386.

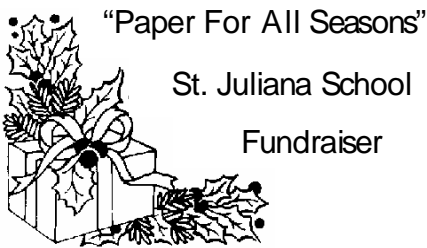
