## “Pro-Life - IC”

Celebrating a “month” for this and a “month” for that may seem a bit artificial at first glance. You know, like “Physical Fitness Month” or “World Peace Month,” etc. But even the Church has recognized the benefits of annual periods of time dedicated to fostering awareness about our attitudes or behavior - Lent, the Easter Season, etc.

Once a year we celebrate “Pro-Life” month in October. Now we don’t believe that we will be able to eradicate the pro-abortion or disrespect-for-women attitude in one month of one given year. But like the liturgical seasons and other annual reminders, Pro-Life Month is an opportunity to examine our own consciences about the way we live our lives. This is not meant to be a month of stone-throwing or finger-pointing, but a time for personal and communal examination of conscience.

Do I respect my own life? It’s similar to the spiritual fact that we cannot love others if we do not know how to love ourselves. I cannot respect the life of others if I do not respect my own. How can a society which overeats, under exercises, sits in cars, breathes so little fresh air, say it is really Pro-Life? It’s a little like “Don’t do what I do, do what I say.”

Being Pro-Life is an “across-the-board” attitude. It will strike the young as hypocritical to speak of protecting life unless that protection extends to our very selves as well. Learning how to safeguard my life will mean much more than balancing my diet and getting sufficient physical exercise. The spirit also has its needs - regular prayer, moments of reflection scattered throughout a busy day, allowing love to flow into me, “stopping to smell the roses” of my life.

God is the ultimate “Pro-Lifer.” Not to have regular intimate contact with God is like saying we need oxygen to live and then refusing to breathe. We used to have a favorite expression in Jesuit formation: *Nemo dat quod non habet* (no one can give what she or he doesn’t have.)

The attitude of Pro-Life must be witnessed to on all levels of our daily lives. And, it must start very visibly in our own individual lives. We must demonstrate in word and deed that our own lives are precious to us. In doing so, we shall truly be **Pro-Life-ic** and our witness will be clear and true.

Makes sense, no?

## Upon Further Review

Last November, our parish implemented several changes in the mass required by the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM). For instance, the instruction called for more silence at various moments during the Eucharist, encouraged the procession with the Book of the Gospels and asked that we bow before receiving Holy Communion. There was, however, one requirement that we missed regarding an important gesture. The instruction calls for the people to stand at the point the priest says, “Pray brothers and sisters that our sacrifice...” Thus the people are already standing before they respond: “May the Lord accept this sacrifice...”

What is the significance of the gesture of standing at that time? In Catholic liturgy the proper position for praying to God is the standing position. Even in certain rituals when a priest or bishop has been kneeling (e.g. Good Friday, ordination rites) he always stands when he addresses a prayer to God. When the assembly offers their response: “May the Lord accept this sacrifice...”, their words are also a prayer, said in response to the priests’ invitation “pray, brothers and sisters”. Thus the people are asked to stand at this point so that we are consistent in standing when we are praying in the liturgy.

The parish priests and staff ask that we begin doing this gesture together beginning the weekend of September 25th/26th. We thank you for your prayerfulness and the opportunity to share the Eucharist together in Christ.

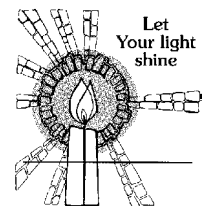

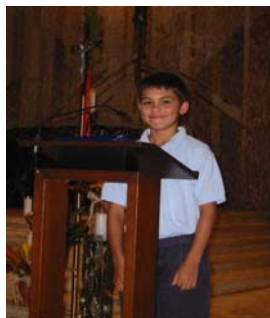
