*Father Phil's Ramblings***What IS prayer? What is NOT prayer?**

Prayer is not a negotiated deal or bargain, and it certainly is not a matter of trying to manipulate God to get what we want. True prayer is one side of an extremely intimate relationship. If prayer is not understood as a component of a growing relationship with God, prayer will never be understood at all.

Our self-help, do-it-yourself culture leads us to feel that we can save ourselves. The truth is, in order to have an intimate relationship with God we must put God at the very center of our lives. God -- Father, Parent, Friend -- must be allowed to occupy the center position. When God is Lord of our lives, other things must -- and will -- find their proper place. One way of understanding sin, is to see it as allowing anything other than God to occupy the center of one's world. This is something we need to be honest about, both with ourselves and with God.

In today's Gospel, we hear the story of two people -- the Pharisee and the Tax Collector. Both pray but only one is justified -- the one that is honest. When we acknowledge that God isn't the center of our lives, we are growing in a true relationship with God. The Tax Collector did just that, but the Pharisee made himself the center, and he left the temple further away from God.

In the craziness of our do-it-yourself culture, may we center our lives around the God who is the Lord of All. May Jesus, God's Son and our Brother, be that center. Then our prayer will be understood as fruitful and rewarding.

## “O When The Saints Go Marching In...”

In our Jesuit Ordo, the little book which contains the listing of feasts and readings, it's interesting to note that what we used to think of, and even refer to, as the “Feast of the Poor Souls,” is listed as the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed. When I was a youngster, I used to think that November 2nd was a sad sort of day when we prayed for the “poor souls in purgatory.” There was always a kind of doubt in my mind about “ordinary” people who had died; were they in heaven or not? Were they dangling in some sort of “in-between” state and in need of our prayers to “lift them up the rest of the way”?

What we celebrate these first days of November - and I use the word “celebrate” in its positive meaning - is the Communion of Saints. You know, every Sunday we profess our faith in that reality. There are the publicly declared saints held up as models and inspiration for us in our daily lives. There are the millions of “undeclared” saints who have left us the examples of human lives lived in faith, often against terrible odds. These are not just those who impressed us, but the many, many more who made no ripples in the sea of life and may even seem to have been cantankerous, moody, selfish people.

God wants to save everyone and God will bend over backwards to do that - God will bend over “forwards” and carry all of our sins, so great is God's love for us.

And we? In this Communion of Saints, we are the here-and-now saints, undeclared but on the way, led by an impressive array of “saints” who encourage and inspire us.

There's a Jesuit priest I got to know when I first returned from India and was, for a time, at Brebeuf Jesuit High School in Indianapolis. Father Al Bischoff is now doing campus ministry at Xavier U. in Cincinnati. Well, when Al roamed the corridors and classrooms at Brebeuf, he had a way of speaking to the students he would encounter: *“And how are you today, Saint of God?” “Did you have a good time over the weekend, Saint of God?”*

One youngster who loved Al dearly said one day to chide him: “Ah, Father, you call us ‘Saints’ because you can't remember our names!” Al laughed heartily, because there probably was some element of truth in what the youngster said. But I could see and hear that Al spoke the truth - “Saints of God.”

Such is our destiny because God's love will not be thwarted. And so, Saints of God at St. Juliana Parish...

### Snow Shoveling - Added Information!

Every year we have a group of seventh and eighth graders from our school that volunteer to shovel snow. They eagerly sign up for this project in the fall and look forward to serving those in our parish who need their walks shoveled. Some questions asked when parishioners call are these: when will there be notification that a student is assigned, boys vs. girls shoveling snow, and is there is any kind of fee involved.

Mrs. Lidgus, a teacher at St. Juliana has been extremely generous with her time in gathering students who would like to shovel snow. In October she obtains a list of seventh and eighth graders who would like to provide this service.

When parishioners start calling about snow shoveling, students who live nearest to the parishioner are matched to provide the service. The student is asked to contact the parishioner before the snow falls and together arrangements are made as to when he/she should come to shovel. We cannot guarantee boys or girls to shovel snow. It is most disheartening when a student goes to make arrangements and are told they are not wanted because they are female and may not be strong enough to shovel. A student is usually assigned to shovel for one person. Please let us know if you have a large area to shovel, then two students will be assigned. Students shovel after school has ended for the day, they cannot come before the school day starts. If neighbors will be shoveling please let the student know so they can be put back on the snow shoveling list for someone who has no one to shovel for them.

Concerning our students getting paid: Parishioners who call want to give our students some kind of gratuity. This is strictly up to your discretion and should be discussed when the student contacts you. When you call, I can discuss with you what the students usually receive.

Please note that it is impossible to have someone shovel for you on the day of a snow storm on weekends or on holidays when students are not in school. It is important to be put on the snow shoveling list now before the snow falls.

All requests for snow shoveling should be called in by the end of November.

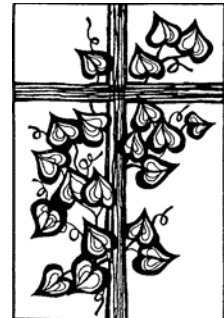
