Father Phil's Ramblings

A few weeks ago, I spoke at all the masses to explain our financial situation. Now that the first fiscal quarter has ended I'd like to provide you with a budget update. I plan to publish these updates as needed, but minimally each fiscal quarter. If you'll recall, we experienced a \$120,000 operating deficit last year; we must make sure that doesn't happen again. My hope and prayer is that by communicating mid-year analyses of our finances, I can enjoy everyone to pull together and react accordingly.

In those September talks, I stated that the parish needs an average of \$18,175 in offertory collections each week in order to meet our 2004-05 fiscal budget. For the year to date we are averaging just over \$17,000 in weekly collections, which is a weekly shortfall of \$1,000 or a projected annual shortfall of more than \$50,000.

As far as our year-to-date expenses go, the parish is running about even with its budget while the school appears to be about 30% over budget. The school incurs many of its expenses (textbooks, instructional materials, etc.) at the beginning of the year, and the current budget overage is not only expected but anticipated. As the year continues, the school's actual/budget ratio will improve.

On a very bright note, the bills have all been paid and this year's Greatest Steak Fry Ever earned a net profit of \$37,000, which was \$13,000 more than budgeted! Kudos once again to Chairman Tom Draths and his team of dedicated helpers. Steak Fry details are included alongside this article.

The decrease in offertory collections last year, along with heavy maintenance expenses, led us to our operating deficit. We were able to cover that deficit with unbudgeted extraordinary income, such as from bequests and memorials, as well as a savings withdrawal. We cannot depend upon that type of income to help us meet our operating expenses this year; it's neither realistic nor prudent.

We depend on the generosity of the many good and generous people of our parish. In order to meet our budget requirements plus make up our current YTD shortfall of \$19,000, I'm asking each parishioner to please increase their weekly offering by \$2.00. The cumulative result of this small weekly increase will certainly allow our parish to reach its goal. We have a wonderful parish, and we depend upon one another to accept and share the responsibility of maintaining the programs, facilities and education we currently offer.

Please look deeply, and if you can, increase your weekly offering on a regular basis. Thank you.

West Side Stories

Last Saturday on a blustery morning sixty parishioners joined Father Dressler and I for a rosary pilgrimage to five churches on the west side of Chicago: St. Malachy, Our Lady of Sorrows, St. Thomas Aquinas, Our Lady Help of Christians and St. Angela. Within our group we had several people with a connection to each parish.

One highlight was the personal welcome we received at the parishes from several priests and present parishioners. Another highlight was the beauty of Our Lady of Sorrows, which was familiar to many who had attended the Friday novena there. The church includes a painting of St. Juliana and a side altar dedicated to her.

But even more striking than the stained glass windows or the marble decorations in the churches were some of the memories people shared about living in those parishes. Father Dressler spoke from his heart about being a priest at Our Lady Help of Christians during the 1970s, a parish rich in ethnic groups but also struggling with racial change in the neighborhood. Others spoke about where they were on the west side the day of the fire at Our Lady of the Angels School. Several spoke about family memories that surfaced from seeing the old neighborhood.

As we recalled the joyful mysteries of the lives of Jesus and Mary while praying the rosary, our personal memories of joy and life were renewed. Memory is a gift from God, and God often works in our memories to reach us and draw us into a deeper union with Him. I believe we experienced something of that last Saturday, as we crossed the threshold of not only five sacred spaces called churches, but crossing the threshold of the sacred space we call memory. Thanks to all who shared the morning together.

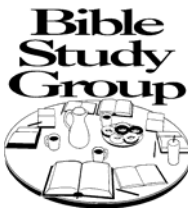
