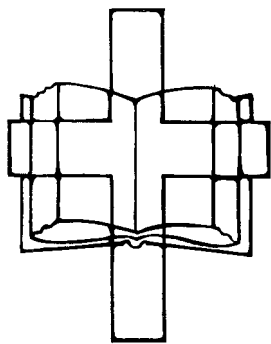

Father Phil's Ramblings

Last week our parish school was evaluated. Rather, as the marquee in front of the school stated, the diocesan improvement team, made up of various professional teachers and principals, offered recommendations and suggestions to improve our school in the future. Of course, we received high marks because we have the best faculty, under the wonderful leadership of our principal, Mrs. Kathleen Barton.

On Thursday, evaluators from the state of Illinois participated in the program, and they were also highly impressed with the faculty, the condition of our facilities, and the progress of our children. Maybe the state educational system can learn something from our school.

The final recommendations will be presented in the near future. I offer a well-deserved thank you to our school administration and staff.

Sometimes our religious formation program for children attending public schools is not recognized enough. Recently, Pam Francisco, D.R.E. (Director of Religious Education) wrote a letter to the CCD parents. I would like to quote from that letter:

"We have had a good start this year. We have 329 students from 216 families. Our students attend 42 different private/public schools. So, as you can see, we have a very large, diverse enrollment this year. This is the largest enrollment we have had in many, many years."

We are blessed to have a dedicated and talented CCD staff. There are 23 catechists and 6-10 people who help in the classrooms. I wish to also thank Pam Francisco, who wears various hats and works in various ministries at St Juliana, for the leadership and dedication she brings to our CCD program.

We have a great Catholic school and a wonderful religious education program. The Catholic Christian faith is being passed on to our children. We should all be grateful for the dedicated teachers and catechists.

“Sound the Retreat!!”

Traditionally, we have referred to the time when we leave our daily routine and responsibilities to spend some quality time with God as a **RETREAT**.

I was “on retreat”, “making a retreat”, “retreating” last week at our Jesuit Retreat House in Barrington. Before coming to St. Juliana, I had been part of the staff there. It was refreshing to return to familiar locations both within and without the facilities.

One of my favorite places to walk and reflect and pray is the path - now abundantly leaf-strewn - which runs alongside the property. Trees overhang the path which these days has a natural dampness emanating from the fallen leaves. I like paths bordered by trees because there is in them a siren call to the future, unknown and off in the distance. For some reason, such tree-lined paths have always been a source of deep consolation for me - I do not know exactly why.

It always takes me a couple of days getting “into the retreat, some time for my “engines” to wind down. It’s difficult since I tend to be a “self-talker”, analyzing what’s going on around me, reasoning, seeing the implications of events before they occur - wonderful charism, but also a “curse.” But eventually, the silence and peace work their magic and I am able to see and find God in the most ordinary things and events of the retreat days.

This is no special gift given to me; it is available to anyone who wants it. We live in a spiritual world, often enough, which consists in: “Lord, please do this for me... Lord, help me with this problem...Lord, protect my loved ones, etc., etc.” We seem to live very chaotic lives and we thirst for order and control. Often our prayers are expressions of our desire that life might come at us at a pace and in the order we would most easily deal with it. But chaos ensues and we are robbed of the control of people and events which we would like to have.

It’s necessary to retreat - if even for a few minutes - in order to **SEE** the real, **THE REAL**. The more we learn to have these “mini-retreat-moments” throughout the day, the more we begin to see that God is always with us. “The Lord be with you!” “And with you also.” So we greet each other several times in the Eucharist. Sometimes, we can get the idea that ordinarily the “Lord is not with us” and so we have to “pray” the He/She might be “with us.” The reality is that God is always with us and the art of spirituality is opening one’s eye’s, ears, and whole body to the on-going experience of God.

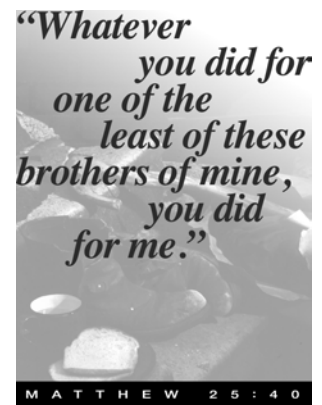
One day during my retreat, I had been reflecto-praying about God’s nearness, or rather “**IN-NESS**” in me. My eyes wandered up to the smoke-detector on the ceiling of the room. At periodic intervals the little red dot of a light blinked to assure me that the detector was, indeed, operative. Now, I never pay attention to these gadgets but there they are, blinking assuredly at me that I have nothing to fear from a surprise fire which might do me harm.

Then it occurred to me: God is like that tiny red light in the smoke detector. God is always there - blinking - and I just never pay too much attention to that. In a retreat, though, when I sit or lie quietly, I become aware of God blinking! It’s not that God become present when I become aware of Him/Her. God is always “blinking” whether I notice God or not. Now isn’t that just grand! “In the watches of the night, O Lord, you are there, aware of me, loving me, protecting me.”

Chaos itself becomes the medium for God to reveal His love and abiding presence.

And God sings: “I shall be with you, my Beloved, in good times and bad, in sickness and health - Look around, listen, feel and taste how good I am!”

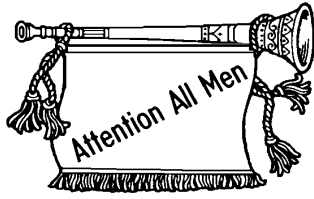
