*Father Phil's Ramblings***Christ the King! Christ the President!**

Today is Christ the King Sunday. It is the last Sunday in the Christian year. Next Sunday is the first Sunday of Advent, the beginning of our Christian year. Advent is a season of preparation for Christmas. Christ the King Sunday is a fairly recent addition to the Church's calendar. It was first celebrated in 1925.

~ 1925

Mussolini had been in power in Italy for 3 years. Hitler had been out of jail for one year and his Nazi party was growing. Much of the world was suffering through the Great Depression. Nevertheless, the Church announced that Christ is the King of the universe. That was a bold claim in such a world. It still is.

~ 2005

We have recently re-elected George Bush as President. It was a rather tension-filled campaign. Many words were spoken. Some say it was the worst campaign ever run, that fingers were pointed and acrimonious words were used.

I wonder what would have happened if Jesus Christ had been running for president. Actually, he wouldn't have been running, because that wasn't his style of leadership.

Imagine, though, if Jesus had been elected by popular vote. His opening address would probably be Matthew Chapter 5. I quote from Jesus Christ's famous address, The Beatitudes:

"Blessed are the poor in spirit -- Blessed are the peacemakers --
Blessed are the humble -- Blessed are the meek
You have heard it said: "An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth."
I tell you, turn the other cheek.
You have heard it said: "Do not commit murder."
I say, don't even be angry with your brother or sister."

If you would like to read more of Jesus' acceptance speech, read Chapter 5 in Matthew.

I believe that after the speech, many of those listening would be in shock, others would be very angry. Jesus' words of 'acceptance' are not what they want to hear.

Our society is always looking for ways to get ahead -- poor in spirit?! Many people want to put a stop to terrorism -- be peacemakers?! Forgive our enemies?! You've got to be kidding, Jesus! Saddam Hussein? He is a terrible person.

Probably this would have been Jesus' one and only acceptance speech because He probably would have been removed from office or put in a hospital for the mentally ill.

But my friends, Jesus is our leader. Do we accept His acceptance speech? Are we His followers?

"Thanks!..." "Don't Mention It!"

In one of the optional Prefaces (the prayer just before we sing "Holy, Holy, Holy") of the Eucharist we pray: "Oh God, you have no need of our praise. Our praise itself is your **GIFT** to us." I like that. Not because it somehow frees me from worrying about whether I've adequately, thanked God, but because it invites me to go deeper into God's love for me.

In India, it took me a long time to learn how to graciously accept the many "gifts" people gave in the daily routine of life. I'd been trained from childhood to "Say thank you!" as a verbal acknowledgement of peoples' kindness or love. In the culture of North India I began to realize that "thanks" can be expressed in many different ways - a smile, a certain kind of nod of the head, an expression of "fullness" after a family meal prepared with love and care ("Oh, I just can't eat another bite!"), keeping the little kids occupied while the Mommy of the family performs the innumerable "rituals" of cooking and serving a meal "fit for a king" - and, in a sense, guests are considered "royalty" of a sort.

For example, when I was a youngster in America, we learned that you showed appreciation for a meal by cleaning your plate - leaving food on your plate was a "no-no" because your hostess or host might think the food was not good. In India, we were taught to always leave a "symbolic" "fingers-ful" at the edge of the plate. It meant that you had eaten so much, the food was sooo good, that you just could not eat another bite - you were "full" and "satisfied." The hosts would beam!

Yes, as I learned that "Thank You" has a wide, wonderful range of expressions, the verbal expression of thanks began to seem puny and inadequate. But I also began to realize that I already had a large repertoire of such "alternate" ways of saying thanks. We all do.

It doesn't take years in another culture to teach us how to do these things, but it does help us to become "aware" of our "thanks-potential." After a short while, we see the flip-side of "thank you" and recognize it for what it is... LOVE.

Lord, you have no need of our thanks...but you have the need to know that we know the many beautiful ways of expressing it. When we begin to be aware that to "be beholden" to people is really to affirm them with love - to tell them: "You make a difference in my world," we become a thanksgiving people.

So let's practice! How's about we all spend Thursday, Thanksgiving Day, practicing the many ways of thanking each other. Maybe God "has no need," but we sure do! How wonderful to be thanked for being who you are and for doing "your thing" in this world of ours!

We invite you to bring in a basket or container of bread/rolls you will serve at your Thanksgiving meal to Mass. The priest will bless them during the Mass.

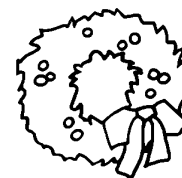
