Emmanuel: Fourth Sunday of Advent

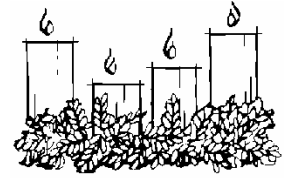
We are very close now! The age of fulfillment is about to dawn. The future of peace and tranquility is just around the bend. As the lilting Christmas carol declares: "Isaiah 'twas foretold it." However, Isaiah was simply speaking of the next king of Judah. The hopes of the people rested on that as yet unborn descendent of David (Isaiah 7:10-14). The angel who spoke to Joseph in a dream identified the real Emmanuel (Matthew 1:23). The child to be born of Mary would be "God is with us." All our hopes for a better future lie on the shoulders of this child, because he is the fulfillment of God's promise to us, the promise to be with us and for us.

Paul, too, speaks of God's promise, a promise made through the prophets of old and now fulfilled in Jesus, who is "Son of God in power" (Romans 1:4). No wonder this is a time of excitement. The whole world is about to break apart so that salvation can burst forth. We are at the peak of anticipation, on the threshold of a new day. When we open our eyes, He will be here, in our midst.

- A. "They did look nice, didn't they? And, they were acting so nice. Why, I even saw a fellow shaking the hand of a guy he hasn't greeted in weeks...some misunderstanding or other...who knows?...who cares! Smiles all around."
- Q. "Well, O.K., but..."
- A. "And did you notice that people seemed to have time to stop and say a few words? Why, I even saw adults bending down and talking to little kids, and some even kissed them! Everybody seemed to be admiring everybody else's kids. But the big thing was that they all seemed to have time. Wow! And you ask if the Messiah really came!"
- Q. So, O.K., so one night they all felt good and glad-handed and kissed each other. That's not real, fella."
- A. "Hey, did you notice the choir and musicians? What a mix of people! But what sweet music they all made together. And you ask, 'How do we know the Messiah came?' Come on!"
- Q. "You mean, that's it. I mean, the coming of the Messiah is like a falling snow-flake, a soft summer breeze, an egg fertilized to bear life - we only know it in the feeling of it and when it bears fruit?"
- A. "Boy, are you getting poetic!"
- Q. "Well, maybe it's the Messiah in me...ha, ha, ha!"
- A. "Now you see and hear and feel what it's all about. Oh, by the way, Scroogey, let's go have a drink. The Messiah has come! Now ain't that just grand!"

Fourth Sunday of Advent

The Scriptures invite us to set aside our plans and lists and open our hearts to Emmanuel, as Joseph does in today's Gospel. They invite us to recognize that God doesn't depend on us to make Christmas happen. God is with us to save us with or without presents and wrapping, with or without Christmas cards or cookies.

Whether this Christmas finds us feeling self sufficient, like Ahaz in the first reading or vulnerable and afraid like Joseph and Mary, Our God is with us ("Emmanuel") to save us. All we really need to do this week is open our hearts and "let the Lord enter" (Psalms 24:11).

The St. Juliana Parish Adult and Children's Choirs and Handbell Choirs are pleased to join the Paulist Alumni Chorale during their 100th Anniversary Season for the St. Juliana Parish Christmas Concert. Many traditional carols as well as old and new favorite Christmas songs will be performed.

The Paulist Choir was founded in 1904 by Fr. William J. Finn, and was directed from 1928 to 1967 by Fr. Eugene F. O'Malley. During this time, the Choir was based at Old St. Mary's Church at 911 S. Wabash Avenue, and became widely recognized as the finest boy soprano choir in the country, indeed the world. They performed for Popes, Presidents, and many international heads of state, and became immortalized in the Academy Award winning movies, "Going My Way", and "The Bells of St. Mary's" in which Bing Crosby played the role of Father O'Malley. Although formally disbanded in 1967, the memory of the Paulist Choir lives on through its Alumni Organization, (James Lynch, President), and the Paulist Alumni Chorale (David Hoffmann, Director), a four-part a capella chorale made up of sixteen former choristers.

EMMANUEL

To name someone or something means that we have a relationship with that person. Family names identify us with our heritage; nicknames denote familiarity or a special bond. In the Old Testament, the meaning of a name ran deep. It identified one's mission, even one's very being.

The amazing name "Emmanuel" was first uttered by Isaiah as he described to the frightened King Ahaz the promised one who would come to redeem the people. Emmanuel is not a frightening philosophical name, such as Omnipotent, Omniscient, Almighty. It does not connote distance and transcendence. It does not generate reverential fear. The name Emmanuel implies closeness and intimacy and compassion. Emmanuel is the name given to the one who is coming. It means "God is with us." God is entrusted to the care of a virgin, who will bear this child. Only God would be so compassionate to draw so near, to be so available and vulnerable. Only God could love this well.
