But deep down there's an eagerness to test it all out in “ordinary” time. Somewhat akin to the feeling we have about trying out that new golf club the wife bought us, or wearing for the first time that great looking shirt Auntie Sophie gifted us with, or trying out the new computer software Uncle George gave us.

Yes, there's something mysteriously joyous about Christmas beginning in real life. We're eager to test what “God-made-human means for us in our prayer and inter-relations with each other. A lot like the gift when it's freed from the wrappings and cardboard, plugged in, and ready to roll.

The taste of the Christmas pudding is in the eating, as they say. “O.K., you Christians! Let's see what all the hoopla was about!” Here's our chance to put Christ back into Christmas. Ordinary time! Now Christmas is ours! The stores and media have other things to occupy them. We'll show them that there's no waiting until next year for Christmas. **WE HAVE THE SPIRIT!!!**

The baptism of Christ inaugurated His public life. The baptism of Christ inaugurates our ordinary time. The two are essentially the same: to be the Christ, the Messiah, in one's world. God says of each of us: **THIS IS MY BELOVED: LISTEN TO HER/HIM!**

But what shall we say? Jesus said: “Don't ask! My spirit will be with you and will tell you what to say, what to do.” Each human being has a personal Christmas to be lived out.

It is a daily affair, a moment-by-moment affair lived in the shadow of the Spirit. Lived by the Spirit in us.

Take the tinsel away, the colored wrapping paper, the lights, the trees and the flowers and what have you? You have the extra-ordinary ordinary time of each of us. We are not called to simply adore the Christ, but to enter into the mystery of God-Human. If there really was and is a Christmas, why search elsewhere for the Good News?

Hear and resonate with the Word: **YOU ARE MY BELOVED IN WHOM I AM WELL PLEASED!** Positively embarrassing, isn't it?


Dear Fr. Dressler

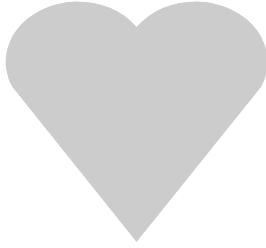

## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Through the centuries, artists and craftspeople have depicted Jesus' baptism in the Jordan River by John. At first in mosaics and frescoes, and later in tapestries, stained glass, and paintings, the scene is familiar. Jesus is standing waist-high in flowing water. Above him, standing on dry land, John the Baptist pours water over Jesus. The first artists to depict this were sketching from memory. This is exactly how most people were baptized in the early days: as adults, standing or kneeling in the water, with water poured over their heads.

This method of baptizing, called immersion, is the favored way today. An adult enters a font, or an infant is lowered a bit into the water supported by a parent's hand, and water is poured or splashed over them. The treasures of baptistry art attest that submersion, or plunging beneath the water's surface, is not really in our tradition, and that "infusion," the mere pouring of a few drops of water, yields too narrow an understanding of what it means to be plunged into Christ's life. Jesus Christ has gone before us into the water, and waits for us there with abundant gifts. No wonder the tradition calls for abundant symbols!

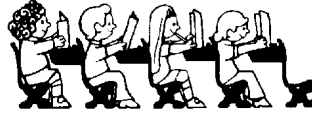
