Father Phil's Ramblings

As you read this article I will be enjoying -- God willing -- a wonderfully warm day in the Sunshine State. My friends and I attend Mass at St. Colman's Parish in Boca Raton, Florida. The pastor, a delightful Irish priest, always recognizes us publicly, providing us with yet another source of warmth.

The Gospel we will hear from him is the same one you will hear: The Sermon on the Mount; the "Happy are the poor in spirit..." talk. Jesus' beautiful words spoken to his friends and to us. I wonder if we are getting it.

The beatitudes have always been a problem for us. Have we ever felt that we really understood those words? One of the beatitudes -- happy are the peacemakers -- will always be the challenge for all of us, but most especially for Christians who live in the most powerful country in the world.

Recently I read an article written about Bishop Fulton Sheen. All of us who are old enough remember him as the Catholic "TV Bishop" who hosted a popular Catholic television program in the 60s. Bishop Sheen wrote 40-plus years ago about peace, in the days of the Vietnam War. His comments could be used in any homily, whether in the 60s, or 2005, in Florida or here at St. Juliana.

Here are excerpts from his writings about peace:

"Wars are only projections of the conflicts waged inside the souls of modern men and women, for nothing happens in the external world that has not happened first within the soul.

Unless souls are saved, nothing is saved; there can be no world peace unless there is "soul" peace.

God refuses to be a totalitarian dictator in order to abolish evil by destroying human freedom."

Blessed are the Peacemakers!

May we truly answer Jesus' challenge. Peace begins in us. Can we forgive? Can we accept others who are different from us? That is the only way!

Born to Live

Just a couple of days ago we got the tragic news of the sudden death of Father Bob McLaughlin. About the same time, I received word that a classmate of mine from grammar school was found dead in her apartment after a day or two. I couldn't believe it. She had sent me a Christmas card and I had yet to answer it. Lorraine ended her greetings written in the card with: "Think of me now and then. Love."

Are there "seasons" for dying? One wonders. By the end of this past week, I had been involved in five deaths as associate-pastor and/or friend. Sometimes we hear it said: "He or she died before their 'time.'" Or, if they are very old or have been ailing for a long time: "Her or his 'time' should have come a long time ago."

When is the "time" for dying? Well, some years ago in India there was a Medical Mission Sister, Rita by name. I don't think I've told you about her. Rita was a dynamic beautiful woman who delighted - one could say "thrived" - in the most difficult villages of North India. She dashed about on foot or cycle, slept little, and was forever "on call," as ER staffers might say.

One day Rita fell ill and no ordinary medications seemed to help her. She was sent to the sister's hospital in Patna, the capitol town of Bihar. After much testing, it was determined that Rita had some sort of congenital "hole" in her heart which was beyond surgical repair. "But most people live normal lives with this," she was told. But it did mean she could not return to her beloved village - work. Too strenuous, her superiors said.

Now I had taught Hindi to Rita somewhere along the line (her language was Konkani, a language of the south and southwestern region of India). She turned to me in grief. But she was really inconsolable; she wanted to work with and for the villagers, not in some city setting!

The weeks passed. Then one morning, before Mass, I was given the news that Sister Rita had died in Delhi. When I asked the sisters in Patna for details, my sorrow turned to quiet joy. In the morning of the day she died, Rita had a conference with her Superior who was visiting from Rome. At that time, Rita had told her that she was at peace and would happily work wherever there was a need, even in the big hospital in Delhi.

After the conference, Rita went out and played a vigorous game of volley ball with some of the nurses. In the evening, just before the Superior was going to have a general session with all the sisters, Rita came into the room - all "aglow," as her sisters later reported - sat down next to one of the sisters, laid her head in that sister's lap, and died.

She was only 28 years old. Her "time had come," because she had, I feel, learned the secret of surrender. Her gift was total.

I think of her also now and then.

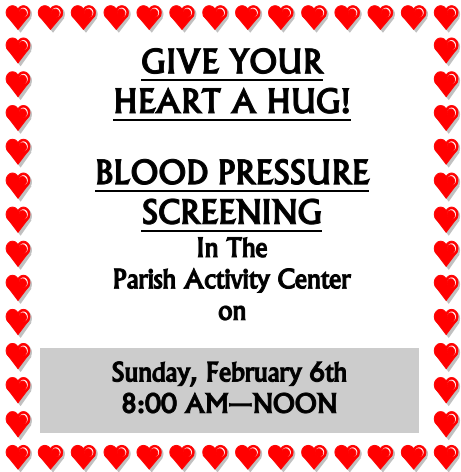

3 Year Old and 4 Year Old Preschool

The 3 year old preschool meets three days a week - Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays, from 8:15 am until 10:40 am. All children must be 3 years of age by September 1, 2005.

Please bring the following items (*certificates will be copied and returned at later date*) **for each child you are registering:**

- Original Birth Certificate (with birth number) - for Illinois, the number is on the upper right side and begins with 112 - followed by the year the child was born - followed by additional numbers.
- Baptismal Certificate
- Child's Social Security Card
- \$75 nonrefundable registration fee per child
- Church envelope

Admission into the St. Juliana Preschool Program requires parent participation in the program approximately six times a year. A parent may substitute with grandparents or other relatives.

The 4 year old preschool meets five days a week either mornings or afternoons. The morning session is from 8:15 am until 10:40 am. The afternoon session from 12:15 am until 2:40 pm. All children must be four years of age by September 1, 2005.

Please bring the following items (*certificates will be copied and returned at a later date*) **for each child you are registering:**

- Original Birth Certificate (with birth number) - for Illinois, the number is on the upper right side and begins with 112 - followed by the year the child was born - followed by additional numbers.
- Baptismal Certificate
- Child's Social Security Card
- \$75 nonrefundable registration fee per child
- Church envelope

Admission into the St. Juliana Preschool Program requires parent participation in the program approximately six times a year. Grandparents or other relatives may substitute for a parent.

Kindergarten through 8th Grade

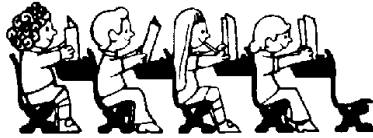
Children entering Kindergarten must be 5 years old by September 1, 2005; those entering first grade must be 6 years old by September 1, 2005; etc. The regular school day is 8:15 am until 2:40 pm. We offer a full-day and a half-day kindergarten program. Half-day students may be in the same classroom as the full-day students or in a half-day classroom. The number of students enrolled in the half-day program for a given year determines whether there will be a half-day classroom that year. Usually this decision is made by the end of June. Family tuition rates are available for families with more than one child attending St. Juliana School. New tuition rates will be available upon completion of the 2005-2006 parish budget process.
