Now is the Acceptable Time

"**Kanjoos**" is the Hindi word (Urda, actually) which refers to someone who acts in a miserly, ungenerous way. In many ways, as my life has gone on, I have begun to realize that I was trained to be a "kanjoos." No, not "trained", but rather misinformed about what Lent or Lenten behavior is supposed to be.

For me, Lent was the time for making sacrifices, giving up favorite things (food, movies, games, etc.). There is a deep truth in such "giving up." We tell God that nothing is more important in our lives than God. We do it symbolically by taking ordinarily pleasant things and giving them up, foregoing them. This is present in all the world's true spiritualities.

But there is a danger in the process of "giving up." We can become "**Kanjoos**" or miserly. I wonder if I'm using the word "miserly" in the proper way. "Giving up" is only one side of the spiritual coin. The other is "generosity", sharing what we have and who we are.

Lent is a time for us to reflect on our gifts and how we disburse them in the community in which we live. So while the giving up aspect of this season is necessary, it is aimed at making us more willing to share, to give, to be involved. In some cases, to give up something is a lot easier than using it generously, open-handedly.

Now is the time to sift through our gifts to see which ones are a little rusty or corroded from lack of use. When's the last time you sang a song - all the way through?! Just for the sound of it. How about that daily walk you've been promising yourself for months, perhaps years? When was the last time you danced with your children - not at a wedding or party but just at home, to celebrate life and your God-gifted body? Have you really looked at yourself in the mirror, appreciatively, not with the purpose of shaving or cosmeticizing your face?

Lent is a time for **DOING!** If we give up something - do penance - it should be for the sake of doing something better, more fun, more fulfilling. "I shall not eat chocolate. Ah, but I shall learn the taste of a daily apple." "I shall not criticize my wife's spending. Ah, but I shall observe her with love - without saying anything - for 5 minutes a day." "I shall not bemoan the fact that I have so many letters to answer (Oh my goodness! Do I!?) Ah, but I shall write one letter a day during Lent."

Lent should be for doing the good things we have put off the rest of the year. It's a joyful time of rediscovering our talent, aspirations, and dreams, as families and as individuals. Yes, it is the **ACCEPTABLE TIME**.

Christmas Sharing Program - 2004

On December 4th and 5th, those of you who participated in our Christmas Sharing Program this year brought your gifts to the Ahearn Activity Center, which was a bustling place with our monthly "Coffee, Tea & Thee". Again, we were overwhelmed with all the gifts, food, certificates and cash that was donated.

On Sunday, December 5th, we delivered to two different locations. First, we traveled to Roseland (113th and Michigan) to deliver the baby gifts and some of the food to the Roseland Adolescent Parent Program. This program is a Catholic Charities program for teenage parents with about 700 participants. The gifts were distributed the next week at their annual Christmas party. Those who coordinate the program have been there for many years and it is always wonderful to see them each Christmas season. They were very grateful for the gifts, food and money.

Next we traveled to Harvey (153rd and Ashland) to Ascension-St. Susanna Parish, which is one of our Sharing Parishes. Father Joe Altman, a former associate at our parish, was there to greet us. We brought them gifts for the children in their PYD (Positive Youth Development) Program and some of the food and money. The gifts were distributed at their annual Christmas celebration the week before Christmas. They, too, were very pleased with all they received.

On Monday, December 6th, the gifts for the men and women were picked up by two women who work with the Catholic Charities Shelter Program. Men and women are usually there 2-3 months until they can get back on their feet. The men and women were very grateful and said the gifts would be distributed at their Christmas party.

Our number of gifts, food, etc., were about the same as last year. We collected approximately:

150 - Men's gifts	260 - Children's gifts
150 - Women's gifts	50 - Food baskets/Hams
160 - Baby boy's gifts	\$550 - Cash donations &
170 - Baby girl's gifts	Gift certificates

Special thanks to the St. Juliana School Children. The Student Council coordinated the collection of money to purchase about 30 gifts for the program. Also, a great big thanks to the Junior High Students (under the direction of Mrs. Jane Lidgus) who volunteered to help collect, sort and bag the gifts on Saturday and Sunday.

On behalf of our St. Juliana Liturgy Team, we would like to thank you for your generosity towards our program this year. We wish each of you and your families a very Happy and Healthy New Year.

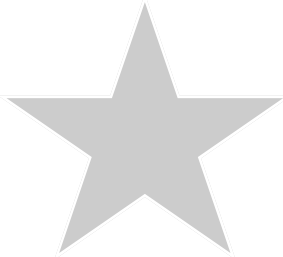
