Father Phil's Ramblings

A Quick Quiz: When Does Lent End?

Many of us think Lent begins on Ash Wednesday (this is correct) and that it ends at Easter (this is incorrect!) Lent ends on Holy Thursday at sunset. And the Paschal Triduum begins.

The words "Paschal Triduum" are a tongue-twister! This phrase is pronounced "PASS-kull TRID-do-um" and means "three days of Passover." Christians keep their Passover festival for three days. This year the Paschal Triduum begins at sunset on March 24th (Holy Thursday evening) and ends at sunset on March 27th (Easter Sunday).

Easter Sunday always falls on the first Sunday after the first full moon after the spring equinox. Easter is early this year because the first full moon after the equinox (March 20th) falls on Good Friday, March 25th. The following Sunday is March 27th.

What's so special about the equinox? That's when day and night are equal length. This balance of night and day reminds religious poets of the creation of the world, when God first created day and night. The poets thought that certainly God must have made day and night equal. The first reading on Easter Eve is the creation story, because we celebrate Easter as the anniversary of that glorious moment when God said, "Let there be light." It seems that every spring, God re-writes the book of Genesis.

During Lent, a big part of our getting ready for the Triduum involves cleaning our homes and fixing the food and clearing our schedules so that by the time Holy Thursday arrives we are ready to keep the next three days without distractions. This is hard work. We are getting ready to show the world that Good Friday, Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday are the holiest days of our year.

Please arrange time to participate in the services of these three days. Please keep them free from work, shopping, classes and entertainment. (Yes, that may mean explaining to the boss or the coach or the club that you need to take time off.)

Time is precious to us. During these days, our time is precious to Christ. We are needed by Christ. Our coming together to pray with one another during the Paschal Triduum is like a gift we give to each other and to Christ.

These are the days of the death, burial and resurrection of the Lord, the days of the re-creation of the world! Please make them holy days. Help others make them holy. And please come to all the services. That is where we belong.

On January 7th I spoke to Cardinal George about my retirement. The date was set for June 30th, 2005. The archdiocesan regulations require that pastors retire at 70 years of age. Retirement from the pastorate does NOT mean retirement from the priesthood. On May 1st, I will celebrate my 44th year of ordination. Those 44 years have been filled with countless numbers of faith-filled people who touched my life in a most profound way. I have been blessed.

I have been a pastor in three parishes: Immaculate Conception (North Park), Queen of Angels and St. Juliana. Twenty-eight years of pastoring is a lifetime. When I was first ordained, they told us that we most probably would not become a pastor. How things have changed! I will leave further ramblings for future bulletin articles.

On April 4th, the Priest Personnel Board (PPB) will send representatives to St. Juliana to interview the present staff. On that evening there will be an open meeting during which parishioners are invited to offer suggestions and hopes concerning the needs of the parish. In preparation for these face-to-face gatherings, we are completing an exhaustive parish profile questionnaire report that covers every aspect of our parish and school. These meetings are opportunities for the PPB to gather additional information about parish life at St. Juliana, to supplement the data in the report. After that, our parish will go on an "open listing." Priests will be allowed to apply for the position of pastor here, and a final recommendation will be sent by the PPB to the Cardinal.

General Parish Meeting

In accordance with archdiocesan policy regarding the recommendation of priest candidates to the pastorate, representatives from the Priest Personnel Board will meet on **Monday, April 4th at 7:00 PM in the church.** The purpose of this meeting is not to name a new pastor, but to give PPB members an opportunity to meet with parishioners to discuss the needs of the parish and what they would like to see in a new pastor. Everyone is encouraged to attend. Current parish and school staff members will not be in attendance at this meeting.

Please mark your calendars -- Monday, April 4th at 7:00 PM in church.

Reconciliation

We thought we had solved the problem by changing the name. Then we thought we had solved the problem by changing the structure and formula. But, somehow, what we thought was supposed to happen didn't. The Sacrament of God's forgiveness of us just didn't sell - or "fly", as the youngsters might say. Where's the problem?

A lot of things have fallen into disuse. Things like: "Excuse me," "I'm really sorry I hurt you by what I said (or did);" "You know, I've thought about it and it was my fault...forgive me, will you?" Just listen to ordinary conversations. Often though, in some contexts, phrases like: "Please pass this or hand me that..." or "Would you be kind enough to..." are just not heard that often among us.

If I were a sociologist - maybe like Father Andrew Greeley - I could safely hazard an opinion as to what this all indicates. God, it's hard to say "I was wrong and you were right!" The other day on the phone with a friend I tried all sorts of verbal contortions rather than say she was right and I was wrong. I've gotten pretty good at that really. Somehow I have become a master of the "yes, but" technique which allows me practically never to be wrong about anything. As my Mom used to tell us kids: "Taint funny, McGee!" (Molly used that line on her husband, appropriately named "Fibber" on an old radio show - radio, wazzat!!)

I wonder whether the reason the Sacrament of Reconciliation is not frequented is because, deep down, we even "yes, but" God. All sorts of reasoning's have flowed out of the discovery that God loves us totally and forever. If such be the reality, then why am I not treating God the way I treat any of those I love deeply? I stumble all over myself - in word and deed! - trying to make sure a remark I've made or something I've done has not hurt them or perhaps strained the friendship, even in the least! Would it be wrong to say that real loves makes us more sensitive to ways - even small ways - we may have hurt our beloved? Of course, maybe that's just MY experience. And I do admit that I tend to be, perhaps, overly sensitive to such things. The Bible's admonition not to let the sun set on our anger or misunderstandings applies to God as much as it does to humans, I would think.

Anyway, where there is love, there is sensitivity to the feelings of others, even God's! But it is an interesting phenomenon that, often enough, we are more polite and pardon - seeking with strangers than we are with wife or husband or parents or children or co-workers. With unknown people, my "yes, but's" are far fewer than they are with my closest companions - check it out for yourself!

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is, yes, to hear God tell us: **I LOVE YOU, ALWAYS.** But it is also my opportunity to tell God: **I'M BECOMING MORE SENSITIVE TO YOUR FEELINGS, O GOD, AND THOSE OF MY BROTHERS AND SISTERS BECAUSE I LOVE YOU AND THEM!**

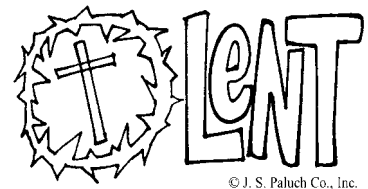

Passion Sunday "Be Reconciled"

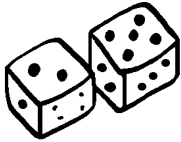

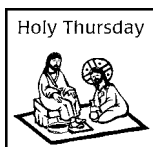

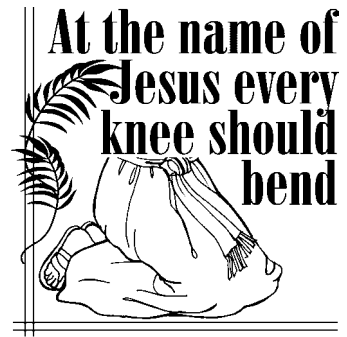

THE ATTITUDE OF CHRIST JESUS

The Lenten cycle brings us to this "mixed" Sunday of palm branches and painful suffering. Our liturgy opens by recalling Jesus' triumphant entry along the main road into Jerusalem, then moves quickly to the back streets of betrayal and humiliation, the courtyards of torture and abandonment, the hill of execution.

Isaiah's strange and gripping "Song of the Servant of God" was to become the song of Jesus. It is the song of one who strides forward consistently in the face of criticism, even scorn: "I have not rebelled, have not turned back." It is to become our song, as faithful followers of Jesus Christ.

How are we to react when we hear the account of the passion and death of the Lord? Paul tells us that our attitude must be Christ's, who "emptied himself, taking the form of a slave." We pray that we may absorb the attitude of Christ, and face life squarely in its triumph and its pain.

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TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Most Christians today receive a bunch of palm fronds, olive branches, pussy willow, or forsythia (a relative of the olive) to carry in procession and to bear home in blessing. Some even offer sprigs of palm or other branches as a gesture of peace to those they have offended. The desire is to make a clean sweep of your spiritual house before the Easter feast.

Accepting the branch is a token of the bearer's willingness to journey with the Church through a grateful remembrance of Jesus Christ's passion, death, and life-giving resurrection. Traditionally, the plants associated with today's feast are planted in cemeteries as a sign of Christ's victory over death and the promise of new life.

The joy of this day's opening procession soon gives way to a solemn reading of the Passion, this year according to Matthew. The ritual is meant not only to strengthen us to hear this account, but to stir us up to accompany the Church on this journey through Holy Week. It also prepares us for next Sunday's joyful renewal of our baptismal vows.
