*Father Phil's Ramblings***Little Things Make A Great Difference**

Sometimes it's little things that make all the difference. On that first Easter, Mary Magdalene didn't recognize Jesus. She thought he was the gardener until he spoke her name. What was it about the way he spoke her name that opened her eyes? Was it the sound of his voice? Or, the inflection of the sound that awakened in her?

And then there were the two disciples (some suggested it was a husband and a wife), who encountered Jesus on the road to Emmaus. They at first, thought he was a stranger. Upon reaching their destination, they pressed him to dine with them. And, again it was a little thing that opened their eyes. They recognized Jesus in the breaking of the bread. How did this simple action reawaken their recognition?

In the first years of Christianity, that was the name given to the Eucharist. Before it was called the Mass or the Liturgy or the Blessed Sacrament, it was known as the "Breaking of the Bread".

What about us? On this Easter day, how do we recognize the presence of the Lord in our own experiences? Is there anything that causes "our hearts to burn within us," as the travelers to Emmaus said? It would be the innocence of a baby, or the beauty of a soft Spring day, or the kindness of a friend, or a kiss from a loved one, or the peaceful silence of a Church.

This Easter, pay attention to the little things in our everyday lives.

"He Lives!!"

It's a week before Holy Week, 8:50 in the morning. I have to get this to Claudette for the Easter Bulletin. We are beginning our "mourning" of the Lord's Passion and Death. The atmosphere is dreary and cold today. Some street lights are still on because there's not enough light to trigger their automatic timers to extinguish them. My room, strewn with papers and envelopes hints at a party never thrown.

"C'mon, write that definitive bulletin article about the Resurrection of Jesus! What are you waiting for?"

To myself I say: "Is this it? Have we traveled the journey of Lent with You to arrive at this?! Lent is well-nigh over and is this the best you can do on the week before Easter, Lord?"

There's an appropriateness to the weather today. It reflects my inner state. I guess every year I expect Lent to end with a flourish which will strengthen me and remove all my tiredness and doubts about myself - about life. But here we are and, paradoxically, it feels a lot like Ash Wednesday, like a "beginning"; no, WORSE! It feels like an "in-the-middle-of"!

But maybe this is the fruit, the grace of Lent. Maybe I'm being invited to enter into the experience of Mary and the Apostles and the friends of Jesus. And maybe, just maybe, it's not an "invitation," a "come-if-you-want" sort of thing, but a mysterious participation in the experience of incompleteness of seeming failure and abandonment into which we are "thrust" like it or not - "willy-nilly," as we used to say. Is this not the way Jesus discovered Himself in the garden?

All those times Jesus "disappeared from their midst." But not today. There is no consolation, no support, "save that of knowing I am doing your will, Father..."

In the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius, in the so-called "Third Week," Ignatius advises us to accompany the Lord in His Passion. We are told to set aside our requests for graces and help, so as to be more totally available to Jesus in His sufferings—to "be with Jesus in His suffering so that we might be with Him in His glory."

I think of my Mom during her last days and how my love for her was reduced to simply "being with" rather than a "doing for." Though I would have much rather preferred the latter. Now, after writing all this, it comes to me a little more clearly. My very life is this "being with the Lord" in His Passion. I do not have to strain to identify with Jesus or to commiserate with Him. It's a question of becoming AWARE of myself, my life, more and more. Each Lent brings me deeper into the mystery of my union with God in Christ; of God's union with Me! And one day, like Jesus: **"...IN A CRASH, WITH A TRUMPET BLAST, I WILL DISCOVER MYSELF, IMMORTAL DIAMOND!"** (that's from the Jesuit poet, Gerard Manly Hopkins, S.J.)

Resurrection will, I think, creep up on us and, suddenly, we shall see Him as He is, because we shall be like Him.

Blood, commonly referred to as the "gift of life" truly is just that. Blood carries gases, nutrients and waste through the body. Blood also fights infections. Heals wounds and performs many other vital functions. We all need blood to survive. There is no substitute. Volunteer blood donors are the only source for people who need it.

Who does your blood help? Donated blood is used for victims of car accidents, burn victims, patients with anemia, bone marrow and stem cell transplants, cancer patients and many other traumas and blood-related disorders. LifeSource provides blood to the hospitals, which then provide to patients in need.

Most adults are medically eligible to give blood. There are actually only a few medications or medical conditions that will keep you from being able to give. Blood donors of all types are urgently needed. Blood can be donated every 56 days (8 weeks). All donors must:

- Be in good physical health
- Be at least 17 years old (16 with written consent)
- Weigh at least 110 pounds
- Free from cold or flu symptoms
