Father Phil's Ramblings

My dear friends,

I write this issue of my Ramblings as a letter of gratitude and as a letter of encouragement.

First and foremost, I thank you for the love and support that you have shown me in countless ways throughout my ten years as your pastor. I truly feel that I have been blessed by being here at St. Juliana's over these years. One knows that one has been accepted when people laugh and cry with you; when you make mistakes and are still accepted; when you are allowed to disagree and not be rejected.

Secondly, on Monday, April 4th at 7:00 PM, representative from the Priests' Placement Board (PPB) will be here to hear your suggestions for the selection of a new pastor. I believe that St. Juliana's is a parish that will interest quality men. I hope and pray that the changes I have made will make it easier for the transition of new leadership. But there are issues and needs that must be addressed to help make our parish a more Christian community in the future. Certainly, the most obvious is the shortage of clergy to staff such a large parish.

I believe that many of you have very wise and strong suggestions to help our parish grow both in faith and love. I urge you to come to the meeting in the church on Monday, April 4th at 7:00 PM and share those thoughts with the PPB representatives. An outline of the meeting's agenda, as provided by the PPB, is included in this bulletin issue.



THE CONSULTATION

A general Parish Consultation concerning the needs of the parish is open to all parishioners. We DO NOT invite the clergy or parish staff to this meeting lest anyone feel inhibited in voicing his or her opinion about the parish. It gives the members of the Placement Board an opportunity to gather additional information about the parish in a face to face situation.

In accordance with Archdiocesan policy regarding the recommendation of priests to the pastorate, representatives of the Priests' Placement Board will meet with St. Juliana parishioners on April 4th at 7:00 PM in the church.

The purpose of this meeting is not to name a new pastor but to give the Board members an opportunity to meet with our people personally to discuss the needs of the parish and what they would like to see in a new pastor. Everyone is welcome to attend.

The meeting is divided into four segments and usually lasts one and a half hours. The Vicar and/or Dean may be in attendance.

1. As the meeting is conducted in an atmosphere of prayer, a designated representative will offer the prayer to begin the consultation. Introduction of persons conducting the meeting takes place after the prayer and an explanation of diocesan policy regarding pastorates is given.

2. In the listening segment, parishioners are asked to speak about their parish, its needs, present concerns and the qualities they are seeking in a new pastor. This portion of the meeting takes the longest time and is most interesting. Most people have very definite ideas about their parish and the kind of priest they want to serve as their pastor.

3. A question/answer period follows. Generally the people are interested in how long the process will take, what they can do if the new pastor is not all they had hoped for and whether they can interview applicants before a decision is made.

4. For the written segment, a form is given to the attendees asking them to:

- a) List the qualities they want in a pastor;
- b) name the top three strengths of the parish;
- c) name the top three areas of greatest need for their parish;
- d) evaluate parish programs;
- e) make other comments. The parishioners may wish to name a priest they would or would not like to see as their next pastor.

The meeting concludes when people have finished writing and talking privately with Board members.

Spirituality "A La Madison Ave."

All right! Now that that's over, let's pull out those Mother's Day cards and paraphernalia!

Probably our "American-ness" is no more evident than in the "speed" with which we celebrate our feasts. We set them up and take them down like well-trained circus workers who can "mantle" and dismantle the big top within hours.

To savor, to taste a feast or even a meal is a lost art for us, or at least some of us - O.K., for me anyway! One of the phrases which seems to have vanished from my language is: "I'll take the time to..." Strange as it may seem, I looked out my window the other day and found that birds had begun to inhabit the trees and even some sturdy trees ere beginning to bud! When did that happen? "The flowers that bloom in the Spring, tra la, tra la!"

It seems that a few weeks ago I was singing: "Where have all the flowers gone?" And now it's: "Where have they all come from?!"

The major spiritual feasts of the liturgical year can be like that too. Easter is finished. Let's move on to the next celebration. Madison Avenue is ever looking forward and wanting us to do the same. **NO LOITERING!** No stopping along the spiritual way to "smell the roses." There are profits to be made, goods to be sold, new economic areas for the U.S. of A. to establish its hegemony. Are we really what money-minded, or, like the children in Jesus' example in the Gospel, are there "children piping a tune," and we dancing to it?

It's a little like praying for something. A wise priest once told me: "Once you've gotten what you are praying for, you must spend the same amount of time thanking God for it." A kind of spiritual-justice, no?

In the same way, when Easter has come, we must spend the same amount of time (at least) celebrating it as we did preparing for it and anticipating it. Whatever the malaise, I think I have it bad. Often people tell me I've given a good homily or made the Eucharist meaningful for them, or some such thing. Instead of allowing myself to, as it were, "wallow" in the joy of the compliment, savor it, praise the Lord for what has been done through me. I pass it off and look to the next thing I have to do. I used to think that to continue the joy of such experiences was a waste of apostolic time: "There are works to be done, 'souls' to be saved, plans to be made, poverty and injustice to be eradicated, etc., etc."

That smacks of "Madison Avenue," never being able to celebrate what we've been preparing for, but always "de-decorating, cleaning up, putting things away."

Easter, the Resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ, is never finished. We don't leave it in the dust of late March or April and gallop on to the next feast. It's the reason raison d'être of a; the other feasts we celebrate and commemorate all through the year. What Jesus said to the Good Thief is said to all of us at Easter: "This day you will be with me in paradise." The rest of the liturgical year is a "BEING WITH" Jesus which is itself the paradise He spoke of. Easter is Jesus alive and we with Him.

"Will you also go away now that Easter is finished?" "Lord, to whom shall we go; You have the words and power of Eternal Life!"

Let's stay here and rest awhile for the journey is long.
