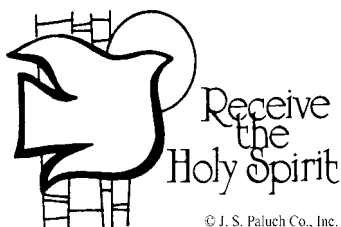

## Father Phil's Ramblings

How quickly time passes! A mere 44 years ago I was ordained a priest at St. Mary of the Lake Seminary. I wasn't even dry behind my ears, as my late father often said at the time. At ordination, though -- especially back then -- we were told that we had all the answers. Wow, were they wrong.

I recall it only took a few short weeks in my first parish assignment -- St. Ita's -- to know that I didn't know much about life, or about what it means to be a follower of Christ. I remember well my first "sick call." When I left the rectory, I made a wrong turn in my haste to administer Last Rites, as it was called in those days.

After 44 years of priesthood and hundreds, maybe even thousands, of anointings, I still am humbled by my vocation. Just last week, I anointed Mary Plewa. Her family had gathered around her and in their closeness, showed me a faith that was truly an inspiration.

Next Sunday at the 10:30 mass, I will celebrate 44 years of priestly memories, the last 10 years being wonderful memories of my life St. Juliana. Your faith and your love continue to inspire and sustain me. Thank you. Please come and celebrate with me.

## Parish Council

## “They Were Confused Because Each One Heard Them Speaking in His Own Language”

One of the greatest marks of respect we can pay someone is to speak their language — even if it’s only a few words or phrases. Of course the tone of your voice and the look on your face are very important to the overall effect of language. In India, when I first arrived there, I was irritated by the little kids who would run up and spout off some English expressions they had learned in school. Often their inflection and intonation was influenced by their own languages.

But after some time, I began to realize that I myself must have sounded similarly inept in my first attempts at speaking Hindi or Bhojpuri. I often regaled the kids with my stumbling Hindi and sent them into convulsions of laughter when they lured me into saying something “off-color” or utterly nonsensical.

The youngsters looked at me and expected me to be “phoren” (foreign) because of my looks and mannerisms. But as I became fluent in Hindi, I was able to joke with them and reveal my true self to them. Also, I was able to appreciate them for who they were. Language is not just the vocal sounds that we make. It is communication on so many different levels: visual, kinesthetic, etc. For true communication to take place, you must “speak the language.”

Sometimes people who speak the same language do not really communicate. Real communication - communion - union of minds and hearts - requires sharing the same spirit. **THE SAME SPIRIT!**

The challenge for me in India was not simply learning grammatical structures which would trigger certain behavioral responses. “Learning the language of the people” meant imbibing their spirit — being filled with their spirit. This was, no doubt, the work of the Holy Spirit, the power behind and within all communication. The question before me was: How does the Spirit of God utilize this culture, this language, to create community?

“And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them...each heard the others speaking in his own language.” It boggled their minds that true communication was taking place since they had thought of themselves as “foreign” to each other. In amazement they asked, “How does each of us hear them in his native language? We are Parthians, Medes, and Elamites, inhabitants of Mesopotamia, Judea, Cappadocia, Pontus...we hear them speaking in our own tongues of the mighty acts of God.”

And so begins the fulfillment of the Church’s Mission to all peoples — the Mission of Communicating the Good News of Jesus.

Is it no less astounding in our own millennium that we are enabled to communicate with the power of that same Holy Spirit?! “How does each of us hear each other in our own language and culture? We are Irish, Polish, Germans, Arabs, Blacks, Indians, Italians, Philipinos, Scots, Danes, Swedes, Mexicans, etc.

“No one can say, ‘Jesus is Lord,’ except by the Holy Spirit.” No one can say love except by the Holy Spirit.

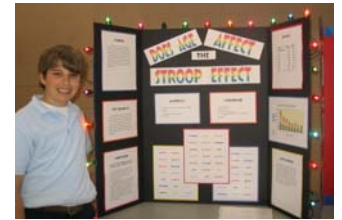
