Sin and it's opposite!

In today's short Gospel Jesus is seen as a friend of sinners. Matthew the tax collector was challenged by Jesus to follow Him. We all know how sinful tax collectors are (especially when we owe money!) Matthew was viewed as even worse than just such a sinner because to the Jewish people, anyone who handled foreign money was worse than JUST a mere tax collector.

So Jesus befriends Matthew -- a sinner. He tells the people that He has come to call sinners and not the self-righteous. Are we sinners or are we self-righteous? But what is sin? What is the opposite of sin? Do we line up with the self-righteous or with Matthew? Again, what is the opposite of sin? Rather than present answers to all of those questions, I would just like to answer the last: What is the opposite of sin?

Most people would respond that the opposite of sin is virtue. But this involves us in a lifetime of bookkeeping on God's part and God doesn't have time for bookkeeping. By being virtuous we probably would think, "Well, I was bad yesterday, I've got to be good today." This is pure legalism.

The opposite of sin is FAITH.

We cannot earn God's favor. God does not keep score. Our religion tells us that God loves unconditionally. The whole life of Jesus shows us that. (Reread the Prodigal Son.) If we recognize our sinfulness as God does, then we must also recognize what forgiveness, mercy and grace are. That demands faith. To believe in a God who loves us more than we love ourselves.

Yes, we are sinners! Hopefully we haven't forgotten that, but our faith tells us that God sees our goodness and loves as we are. So kick over the tax collector's table like Matthew did and follow Jesus!

Protecting God's Children

Recently, the media have reported allegations made concerning a Franciscan religious, Sister Benen Kent, who taught at St. Juliana School during the 1960s. Former students are alleging sexual abuse by this religious during that time. Sister Benen Kent did teach at St. Juliana; she died two years ago.

If any of these allegations are proven true, as a priest I apologize to the victims and anyone else who may have been affected. I also reassure the present enrollment of students and their families that each and every staff member and volunteer at our school and parish have been through a thorough background screening. Additionally, all employees participate in ongoing training through the "Protecting God's Children" program coordinated by the Archdiocese of Chicago.

"For It Is Love That I Desire, Not Sacrifice"

The spiritual Guru Tony de Mello, S.J. tells the following story:

"Seven crazy men were invited to festivities in a neighboring village. More than mildly intoxicated, they were staggering home toward their own village at night when it began to rain.

"So they settled down for the night under a large banyan tree.

"When they woke up the following morning, they rent the air with mourning and wailing. 'What's the matter?' asked a passerby.

"The men answered: 'Last night we huddled together under this tree and fell asleep, sir. On waking up this morning, we find our limbs all intertwined and we cannot distinguish the owners.'

"The passerby said: 'Easily solved. Give me a pin.' He jabbed the pin sharply into the first leg he saw. 'Ouch' said one of the men. 'There,' said the traveler to the man, 'that leg is yours.' Then he pricked an arm. 'Ouch!' said another, identifying himself as the owner of the arm. An so on, till the limbs were all disentangled and the crazy men went merrily back to their village none the worse for their experience."

Guru Tony observes: "**When your heart responds instinctively to other people's joys and sorrows, you will know you have lost your self and attained the experience of your ONE- BODY- NESS with the human race - and love has finally arrived.**"

Our oneness as families depends on something similar - the ability to feel the pain, anxiety, frustration, sadness of our members. It requires looking at the members of our families - I mean, really looking! Becoming familiar with how others look and sound and move when they are hurting. We live in a society which is fond of declaring: "Hey! Give it to me straight! I can take it. Go ahead, just tell me what you're feeling."

The gift of compassion ("suffering-with") is not simply a verbal art. It involves the whole person. Compassion is learning to see the hurt, hear it, and, most sublimely, to feel the hurt of another person. Expand it to a community of people, an ethnic or racial group.

Only when we feel the wounds inflicted on the **ONE BODY**, will we learn what to "suffer with" really means as a shared experience. Such was the life of Jesus with and among us: "Those who are well do not need a physician but the sick do. Go and learn the meaning of the words, 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice.' I came to call people who are hurting."

Until we can feel the pain and hunger and discrimination suffered by the whole **BODY**, we will never experience the Mystery into which God calls us in Jesus Christ.

In one sense, maybe it's better to be "tangled" up with each other like those inebriated fellows in Guru Tony's story. But it is a far, far better thing to experience our **ONE- BODY- NESS** with love for all its members.
