## “Even All The Hairs Of Your Head Are Counted”

Jesus assures us that not even a hair of our heads falls without the Father’s knowledge. Not even a sparrow falls to the ground without the Father’s knowledge.

Today is the Day of the Fathers. It’s also my Mom and Dad’s wedding anniversary - they would have been married for 68 years. Kind of fitting that the Day of the Fathers should coincide with Mom and Dan’s wedding anniversary, no?

I think my Dad had all the hairs on my head counted. I even think he had a sixth-sense about when I fell down, even before I made that known. Strange to say, in my experience, Mom was often Dad and Dad was often Mom. You know what I mean, don’t you? It was not as if there was some sort of socially constructed dividing line determining when or how Mom had to be Mom or Dad had to be Dad.

It’s not difficult for me to relate to God as Mother and Father. Some people have trouble with that. I don’t. I think that’s due in great part to the way Mom and Dad loved me. Dad was never afraid to demonstrate his affective side. It wasn’t always “slap on the back” or “punch in the arm” affectivity. Very often it was damp with tears and kisses (“Ah, c’mon Dad!” sez an “I’m to old for that kinda stuff” - Bob). Yes, Dad was not afraid of his emotions. Maybe I was!

I don’t think I will ever “understand” what I meant and continue to mean to my Father. There was “macho” value systems operative when I was growing up and I think I thought that Dad’s need to show affection was some sort of weakness. Not that Dad didn’t have an array of talents and skills and personal qualities which made him a wonderful role-model for me: he was a baseball pitcher of some repute in the parish leagues of the ‘30’s; he had mechanical skills and knowledge which never ceased to amaze me; he had a playfulness and spontaneity, which to be honest, sometimes embarrassed his teen-aged sons. Oh, he was a man’s man alright. But he also had a Mother’s heart which followed the successes and failures of his family more intimately than I could ever have imagined.

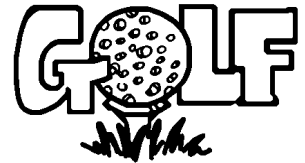
My going to India must have been excruciating for Dad. In the course of the next 16 years before his death, we would see each other for brief visits only three times. I never did get a chance to tell him “eyeball to eyeball “ that I loved him just the way he was; that I was so very grateful that he was my Dad; that he was so caring, warm, and affectionate even at times when I did not fully understand the depth of our relationship.

I’ve come to realize over the years that God is like my Dad. Maybe some people have not been blessed the same way, but my Dad’s heart was the Heart of God.

My Dad’s whole life said to me: **“SO DO NOT BE AFRAID BOB; YOU ARE WORTH MORE THAN MANY SPARROWS!”**

Go home and tell your dad you love him. Yes, even if he has died. If tears begin to flow, well, that goes with the territory. Tears are such a wonderful way to express and experience love, don’t you think?

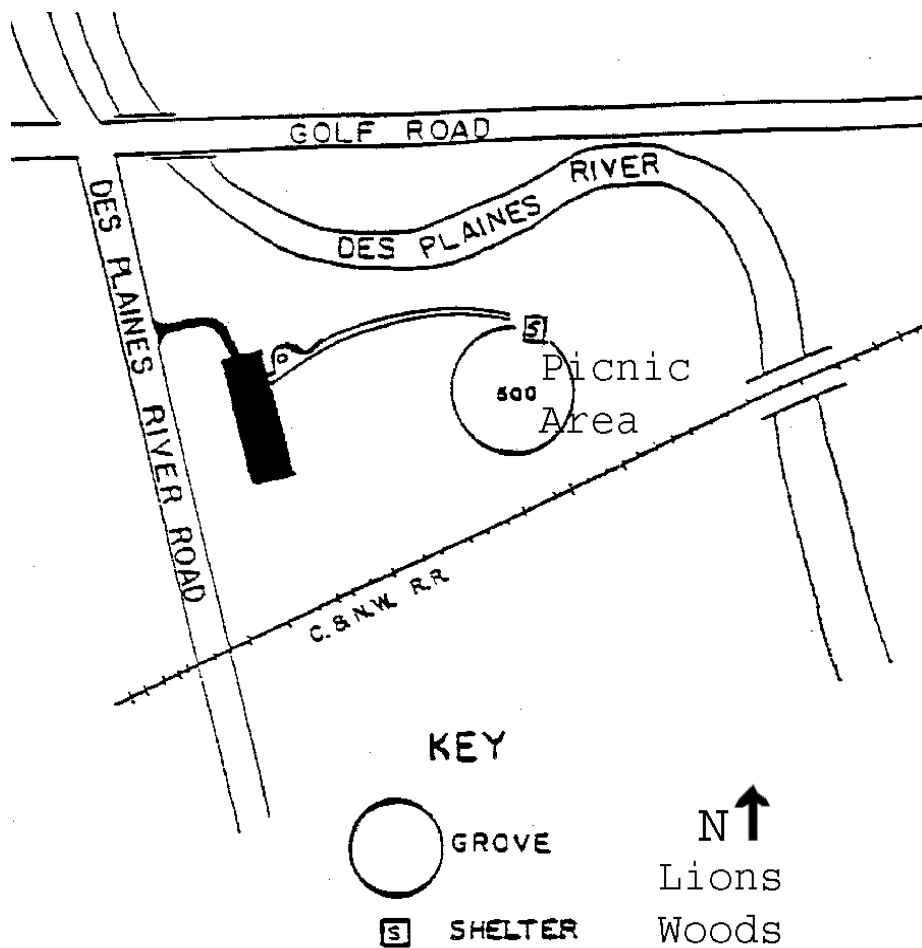
### PASTORAL COUNCIL MISSION STATEMENT

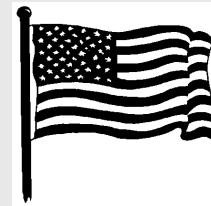

Joseph Ratzinger was the most well-known Cardinal at the Vatican, because he was head of the *Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith* for 26 years. In the first of his addresses as Pope, he said "In these hours, two contrasting sentiments coexist in my spirit. On one hand, a sense of inadequacy and of human anxiety before the universal church, because of the responsibility that was entrusted to me yesterday as Successor of the Apostle Peter in this See of Rome.

On the other hand, I feel very intensely, in myself, a profound gratitude to God who does not abandon his flock, but leads it through the times, under the guidance of those whom He Himself has constituted pastors." "I seem to see John Paul II's strong hand gripping mine; I seem to see his smiling eyes and to hear his word addressed, at this moment, particularly to me: 'Be not afraid' "



## Reading Adventure Leads to White House

After reading about the adventures of a character called Flat Stanley, the third graders at St. Juliana School decided to send Flat Stanley on more journeys around the world. Each student sent a picture of Flat Stanley in a letter to a friend or relative and asked them to care for Stanley for a few days and then return him in the mail.

Third grader, Emily Okrzesik, sent Flat Stanley to First Lady, Laura Bush, at the White House. Emily was delighted when she received a response from Mrs. Bush detailing the busy day that Flat Stanley had at the White House.
