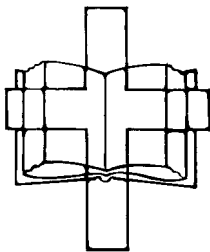

Many parishioners have been asking and speculating about who the next pastor will be and just when he will arrive. The same questions have been passing through my mind as well.

When the process began and the staff and parishioner interviews took place, the middle of June seemed a likely and reasonable time for the new pastor to be assigned. I spoke to a member of the Priests' Personnel Board last week and was told they were still "...in the process." What this tells me is the 'well has run dry,' so to speak.

Yes, we will eventually get a new pastor, but what disturbs me is the lack of men -- even in our own archdiocese -- and it's a very large problem for the Church. Recently, a parishioner told me of a situation in northern Wisconsin, where one priest is serving five parishes. For so long, we have read about this type of situation and sadly, it is finally affecting us here at St. Juliana.

Pray that the Spirit who guides the Church will send us a priest who will serve and lead the people closer to the Lord.

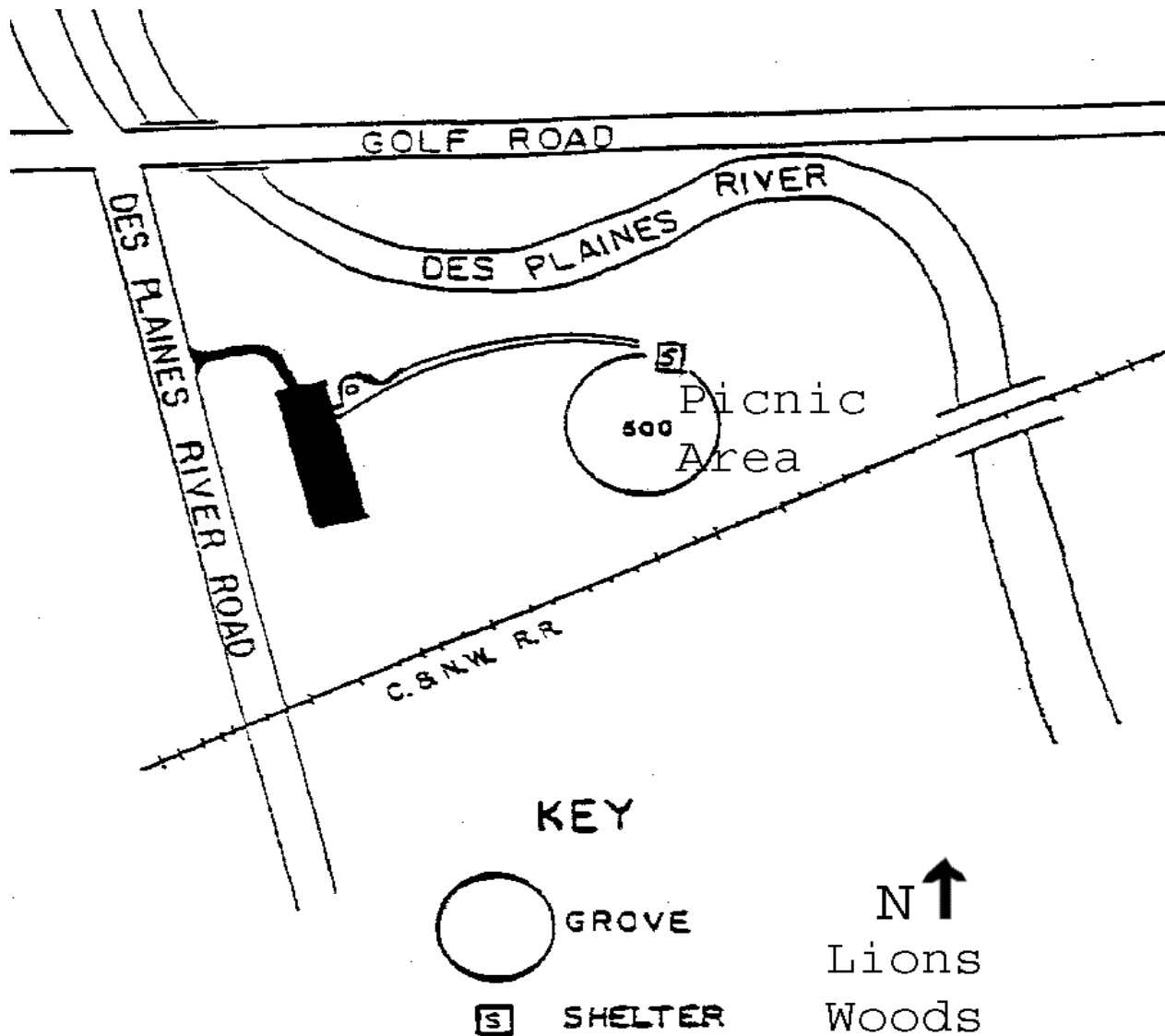

“Whoever Loves Father Or Mother More Than Me Is Not Worthy Of Me!”

One of the themes of today’s readings from Scripture seems to be the virtue of **HOSPITALITY**. It got me to thinking about what Jesus says in the Good News. For years, my response to this statement of Jesus was: “Sure! Of course! After all, Jesus is God and God deserves to be loved most of all.” But as I began to appreciate my family and friends more and more, and realized the power and glory of human love, the statement of Jesus became more enigmatic, more in need of **WONDER** - remember **WONDER LAKE?**

Maybe it was not Jesus saying: “You must love me **MORE** than anyone else!” But rather: “You must love Me the way you love those you really love; for whom you would give your life!”

Love is God is Love.

Love is not something we parcel out to people - more to those closest to us, less to those on the periphery of our lives. There is no “more” or “most” in love. There is only Love. There is no “little way” of loving someone. Oh, we have less powerful less intimate words to express a kind of affection for people we are not “connected” with. We speak of “liking” someone, having “an affection” for someone, “thinking highly” of someone, etc. Love, we would like to think, is a special word used to express the feelings we have towards people who “really mean something to us.”

C.S. Lewis also wrote a very popular and insightful book about the different types of love. Even traditionally, theologians and saints have referred to different types of love, the most exalted to be given only to God.

Love is God is Love.

Love is like certain tubes of ointment. The instructions read: “Use only a small amount of this medication.” Wouldn’t you know it, as you open the tube, the ingredients come spurting out, far more than the “little dab that will do ya!” Well, that’s what love is like. There are no “little dabs” of love. It spurts; it oozes out; it’s aerosole!

Love is God is Love!

Maybe Jesus ought to have said: “Love Me the way you do love your dear parents; love Me the way you love your son or daughter; the way you love your husband/wife!” Oh! That much, eh? Yep! Cuz love cannot be measured out. You love, you love - total, complete, real, dynamically!

You smile at a stranger on your walk in the neighborhood...you tweek the cheek of your grandchild...you say a refreshing word of gratitude to the bus driver...you buy a ticket to a parish raffle with a friend because you don’t have enough money on you to buy one of your own...you kiss your wife/husband “good night” for the 5,327th time...you listen to a friend’s joke for the umpteenth time, etc., etc.

Love is God is Love.

When we love, we are most like God. God has given us that share in His/Her own Self just because we are God’s Children.

THE RICHNESS OF LIFE IN CHRIST

Today we have the beautiful story of the woman promised a child, the wonderful exhortation about life in Christ, and a powerful instruction from Jesus. An embarrassment of riches? Not if we take Jesus' words about "welcome" to heart. The many challenges and blessings offered to us today by Elisha, Paul, and Jesus should be cause for rejoicing, and welcomed heartily into our lives. And, like the great treat that they are, they should be enjoyed and shared generously with others.

Today's reading from Romans was chosen very early in the liturgical life of the Church to be the sole apostolic instruction received by candidates for baptism at the Easter Vigil. This illustrates its importance as a core belief, and as a means of comprehending the story of the Resurrection. Christ's resurrection is not merely a story about something that he underwent once upon a time, but it is our story, the story of how we joined the other members of the one Body of Christ, the church. We were not only dead, but we were buried; not ultimately buried, but raised to eternal life with Christ.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Confirmation is complicated, at least in its history. It arose in response to real problems deeply felt, not the least of which was the desire of the bishop to minister to all who were baptized. But it also has to do with the early crisis of how to deal with persons baptized by congregations that had broken bonds with the greater church: heretics. People reasoned that no matter how wrong-headed the minister might be, Christ would always work in the waters of baptism. No matter what, God would sweep aside all human obstacles to claim the new life in the water. They were not so sure about the ability of someone who had broken with the church to confer the Spirit.

By the fifth century, already-baptized persons coming into the church were anointed with chrism but not rebaptized. This anointing with myron or chrism was seen as an act of reconciliation by the church, and a seal upon the commitments vowed by the newcomer. Today, we preserve this ancient practice by never "rebaptizing" Christians who have been baptized in water in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We affirm the candidates' baptismal dignity, and we celebrate confirmation at their first reception of the Eucharist.
