The last two months have been quite a roller coaster and believe me when I say I am as confounded and disappointed as you. Countless parishioners are wondering, why is it proving so hard for the right man to be found? As I've said before, the well of available and qualified priests is running dry. There are many 'open' parishes at the moment and the Priests' Personnel Board and Cardinal George are challenged to find mutually agreeable matches. Rumors are running rampant, some based in truth and others pure speculation, but the fact remains we are certainly a desirable parish and the Board is working diligently to ensure an experienced and interested priest is appointed. Ultimately, of course, the decision remains with the Cardinal.

While we're all anxious to see a new pastor appointed, it's not a decision that should be made hastily, just to fill the vacancy. In hopes that a bit more time will allow the Board and Cardinal George the opportunity to find the best possible pastor for St. Juliana, I've offered to remain as administrator. The board accepted, and I'll be here until the new pastor is named.

Please pray with me that this extra time will enable the Good Lord to reveal to the Board an interested and qualified candidate, of whom Cardinal George will approve.

"Let The Spirit Do It!"

"The Spirit comes to the aid of our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but the Spirit intercedes with inexpressible groanings. And the One Who searches hearts knows what is the intention of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the holy ones according to God's will."

What a wonderfully consoling statement of St. Paul! Oh, we all have our favorite ways of praying, our favorite prayer-devotions. We learned of them from our Moms and Dads and perhaps in school or from a retreat or some spiritual author - maybe even a personal Guru (Mentor)! But sometimes the questions may arise in the depths of our hearts: "Am I praying the right way? Is God happy with the way I pray?" Or maybe: "I don't really pray much; should I begin to pray?

People who don't pray might take a kind of false encouragement or corroboration of their 'prayer less' way of life. You know: "I don't have to pray because God knows better than I what I need. Why try to second-guess God!?" That's what we call in common parlance a "cop-out." We find Scriptural proof that it's better not to pray, because God will take care of us anyway.

I'm not sure that that's what Paul had in mind. Scripture tells us in another place: "Pray always!" But, admittedly, there are times in life, perhaps moments of great grief, inner confusion, or depression, when praying seems impossible or even useless. There might even be moments of great anger against God at the loss of a loved one or the recurrence of a life-threatening ailment. To pray in a "formal" way or in a "centered" way at such times is well-nigh impossible.

It is at these difficult times, when God seems at a distance or even to have abandoned us, that we need to be reminded - by someone of the stature of St. Paul! -that "the One Who searches hearts knows what is the intention of the Spirit - the Spirit who intercedes for us in inexpressible groanings." It's so very consoling to know and believe that even our "moanings and groanings" are prayer. To whom do we complain the most? Our closest friends. Those to whom we can reveal our worst selves.

To know that the Spirit "translates" our prayers into what we really need and places them before God - what a tremendous consolation! But it is an act of "translation" and not "substitution." That is to say: there must be some element of communication with God on our part for the Sprit to have something to understand and, as it were, "translate." Prayer has such a variety of expressions: moans, groans, sighs, body postures, songs, humming, spoken thoughts, imagination, feelings, Scripture, cries, laughter, silence, etc., etc. And, joy to say, the Spirit understands them all! No need to pray: "What I really mean to say, Lord, is..."

Ah, but the intent must be there. Prayer is not "blogging with God" or sending God "spam." From beginning to end, it must be **INTENTIONAL**. No one prays "by mistake." But what it is we are really praying about, well, the Spirit will "intercede for the holy ones according to God's will."


