PASTORAL COUNCIL MISSION STATEMENT

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Most parishes are now aware of the catechumenate and the journey of new faithful in the RCIA, but this form of sacramental initiation disappeared from view in the thirteenth century along with many other ancient practices. Life back then was hard, and often too short, and priests were increasingly insistent about the responsibility of parents to baptize children in danger of death. Since everyone in that society was under unimaginable threat from famine, warfare, and plague, the liturgical rites changed quickly. Everyone was in danger of death all the time. No longer were babies immersed in fonts, being lowered into the water, although the ritual books never backed down from immersion. Infusion was the new way, a simple pouring of a few drops of water on the child's forehead.

The catechumenate collapsed, being reduced to the recitation of the Creed and an Our Father at every baptism. Amazingly, any provision for adult baptism was shelved, so that as late as the 1950s, a person being baptized was presumed to be an infant, unable to answer for him or herself. Questions of creed and commitment were put to the godparents, not to the person being baptized. Even Dorothy Day and Thomas Merton, famous adult converts, remained mute at their baptisms while their sponsors answered for them. In hindsight all this appears strikingly odd, yet it was accepted as the way things were. We have good reason to give thanks for the vigorous reforms of the last forty years!

“Treasures Buried In A Field...”

Lucas, John, Alexander and Joseph.... These are the men who catechized me 40 years ago. In the eyes of some, it may have seemed that I was to help catechize them, but, in reality, it was they who taught me how the Christian faith is lived. They were all poor - not destitute, but poor. Being leather-workers by caste, they were on the lowest rung of society in North India. It did not matter that they no longer practiced their ancestral way of life, skinning dead cows and doing all sorts of work with the dried skins. They were low-caste now merely because of birth - as if some sort of DNA test had stamped them and their children and their children's children for all time.

Lucas, John, Alexander and Joseph were catechists at Koath Mission. Like many of our pioneers here at St. Juliana's, as young men in high school, they had helped Father Vince Gallagher, S.J. establish the Church in their area. Father Gal had many skills which he generously shared with his young disciples. Those skills set these young men apart from the surrounding youth. Motor-mechanics, basic English, motorcycle riding and repair, and a host of other technical skills made these youth the envy of the locality.

But while Gal was imparting the external “smarts,” he witnessed to Jesus Christ. Perhaps the loudest witness to the locality was that Gal treated these youths with respect and affection and simply presumed that they had the keen intelligence to learn many skills. This was not so universally accepted in the still-not-independent India of the early 40's of the 20th century. And what's more, Gal sat with them, talked with them like equals, ate food cooked by them, shared the inconveniences of the village life with them, and took a personal pastoral interest in their families.

But there was more than “social-uplift” going on in Koath. Lucas, Alexander, John and Joseph became men of deep faith in Jesus Christ. It was not just their technical skills which eventually gave them access even to the homes and shops of the upper-caste people. There was something about their integrity and dependability that was different from the general run of men their age. Truly, they were being “catechized” by Gal. And the more Gal became familiar with the hardships and pressures of their lives, he began to be catechized by them. He began to realize that he did not “bring Christ” to these people; he discovered Christ - “uncovered” Christ to them and through them to himself.

Though not formally ordained, these men were truly deacons, married religious! They gave their lives to the spreading of the Good News. Walking long distances, sitting up late in the evenings in the villages when people returned from the fields, speaking with day laborers who were only free late in the evenings, solving local problems with wisdom and patience, sometimes the objects of insults from upper-caste people who could only know them as “chamars” (members of the leather-working caste), these men wrote their Acts of the Apostles.

It was my good fortune - perhaps the key grace of my life - to have been catechized by these disciples of the Lord Jesus!

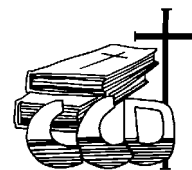
We would also like the opportunity to meet with you and drop off a small gift bag. Please do your best to make arrangements with us at your convenience.
