Father Phil's Ramblings

I know it's hard to believe, but as this bulletin heads off to the printer there's still no official word on a new pastor. Life must go on, however, and we cannot just sit in limbo while the lazy, hazy days of summer float on by. We don't have much opportunity to be lazy, anyway, as our summer projects keep us occupied. Here's a list of what we're working on this summer:

- Roof repairs on the church bell tower and annex. In addition to new roofing, the bell tower also requires a great deal of masonry work to rebuild the uppermost brick section. Roof repairs on the school will include a new roof on the center section of the western face of the school along Osceola, as well as major repairs to the junior high roof and gutters.

As you may be aware, petroleum products are a major component of roofing materials and the recent spike in gas prices has impacted the cost of these roof repairs as well. We have \$100,000 put aside from the sale of the rectory property dedicated to these projects.

- Recently we experienced major failures of the cooling systems in both the church and parish center. The repair to the parish center unit also required updating the refrigerant to current standards. Together, the two repairs will cost the parish nearly \$21,000. We are planning to use Summer Project collection funds to cover these expenses.

Additionally, there are always special maintenance issues in the school that we address during the summer break. This year these include: maintenance to various floor surfaces, including the activity center; painting as needed (but nowhere near what we'd like to do); repainting parking lot markings; reconfiguring the kitchen, and others.

To date, our Summer Projects collection totals just over \$4,400, leaving us almost \$17,000 short of what is needed to cover the costs of repairing the air conditioning systems in the church and parish center.

There are still several weeks left in the Summer Projects collection drive and your generosity is greatly appreciated.

GRACE IS EVERYWHERE

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Over the last several weeks, the history of confirmation has been set out as a rite following baptism and preceding First Communion. Eucharist was a sacrament of spiritual maturity, attuned to the legal age of majority, which was considered to be fourteen years or so. Medieval bishops were often generous, if not especially pious, in seeing to it that children were confirmed before adulthood.

A pattern more familiar to us surfaced in the Diocese of Toulon in France in 1748, where it was decreed that "children are to be confirmed only after receiving First Communion." This was an amazing shift in practice that undermined centuries of theology and tradition by which confirmation was seen as a bridge between font and table. The innovation swept through France and across Europe, despite constant complaints from Rome. French-trained bishops like Cheverus of Boston and Carroll of Baltimore, founders of the American church, established the practice here. The order of the sacraments was thus disrupted in France and in the United States, and remained an eccentric exception to the rule until big developments in 1910.

MORNING ARRIVAL

During the first two days of school, August 25 and 26, students will gather in the school parking lot near the sign indicating grade levels. The teachers will help students organize into correct homerooms. Please respect our "NO TRAFFIC ZONES" around the school. On school days only, our school parking lot and parts of Oketo and Osceola Avenues will be closed to all car traffic from 7:55 to 8:20 AM to provide the necessary safety for all students.

After the first two days of school, students may enter the building from any door on Osceola or the parking lot. The doors will open at 8:05 AM. Bike riders may lock their bikes on the racks located on the Oketo side of the parking lot by the Junior High entrance.

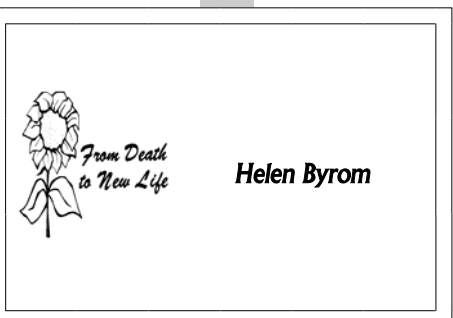
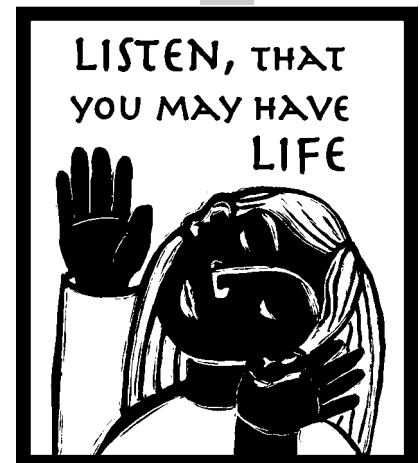
