Father Phil's Ramblings

I recently read an article from St. Eugene's parish bulletin. I definitely feel that the message was relevant for St. Juliana's as well as St. Eugene's.

"More than one person reported to me the lady who roller skated up to Communion last Sunday on one of the side aisles at the 11:00 Mass. If I had seen it, I would have looked for her after Mass, asked her name, smiled widely, and asked her to leave the skates home next time. That's certainly not the best way to go to Communion. Still, I admire her joy. I hope I do not have to mention it, but...no skate boards, either."

As regards the reception of Holy Communion, in most churches in the United States, including St. Eugene, the common practice is to receive Communion standing. As you reach the front of the Communion line, the minister of the Eucharist holds the host and says, "The Body of Christ." The communicant reverently bows their head and says, "Amen." She or he may receive with hands folded and extending the tongue - or the communicant may extend the hand with which she/he eats forward and flat with the other hand flat across the lower hand in the form of a cross. Immediately upon receiving the host, the communicant should consume the Body of Christ before moving away. Always you receive Communion; you do not take Communion. Only a priest celebrating or concelebrating the Mass, is permitted to give Communion to himself. Therefore, anyone else who receives Communion never grabs the host with her/his fingers. Cardinal George, in a recent letter to pastors and liturgists, emphasized the importance of reminding folks that they should devoutly consume the host before beginning to walk away. “There Was A Tiny Whispering Sound...” When my brother and I go polka dancing, one of our complaints is the **LOUD VOLUME(!!!!)** of the music. Most of the bands have phenomenal sound-systems just like any of the current rock groups. I guess it was a gradual thing; either that, or we are aging and our ears cannot stand the increased decibels. When the bands are playing, it’s difficult having a conversation or even resting up a bit before the next dance.

“Louder is better!” that seems to be the order of the day. There are even some people my own age who tell me: “Oh, Father, you’re just getting old. We like the music this way.”

But when I listen to music, whether it’s polka, jazz, classical, opera, etc., there’s something more to it than just **PLAIN VOLUME (!!!!)**. Don’t get me wrong. Volume certainly is part of the overall enjoyment of music. But there is such a thing as **MODULATION** and **TONALITY**.

When God first revealed Him/Herself to the Israelites, it was often with the crashing of cymbals, flashing of lightening, rumbling of the earth and such-like attention-getting techniques. In the beginning, the Israelites, that rag-tag band of survivors from Egypt, were a not so delicate people. They were “earthy and “boisterous” and needed to be contacted in the same way - **BOOM, CRASH, BOING, WHAMMO!**

And God said : “Listen to me, you jokers! I am your God and there’s no one else! Got it!?” Hardly the language of love and intimacy, no? In speech class in the Jesuit novitiate and juniorate, we were told that one of the first things we must do in giving a speech is to “render the audience benevolent” - “**reddere benevoles.**” But even more primary is to get their attention, “go in their door,” speak their idiom.

It’s the same with God and us:

God says to Elijah: “Go outside and stand on the mountain before the Lord; the Lord will be passing by.” Scripture continues: “A strong and heavy wind was rending the mountains and crushing rocks before the Lord - but the Lord was not in the wind. After the wind there was an earthquake - but the Lord was not in the earthquake. After the earthquake there was fire - but the Lord was not in the fire. After the fire there was **A TINY WHISPERING SOUND**. When he heard this, Elijah hid his face in his cloak and went and stood at the entrance of the cave.

There is an expression: “When the disciple is ready, the Guru will appear.” The real communications with God come in the “tiny whisperings” of life - those moments when we can hear the fall of a leaf, feel the breeze on our faces, hear the breathing of a sleeping child in the next room. It is at moments such as these that **THE WORD BECOMES FLESH** and God whispers intimacies of profound love and joy to our ears, and we have some sense, some experience of Emmanuel - God with us.

“Hey, you guys! Tune down the volume! I can’t hear the clarinets.”

Oh yes, God can rock and roll with the best of them. But then again, there are those love songs, whispered in the ear of the beloved - God’s Melodies of Love.

Sounds like a cue for a song to me.

MORNING ARRIVAL

During the first two days of school, August 25 and 26, students will gather in the school parking lot near the sign indicating grade levels. The teachers will help students organize into correct homerooms. Please respect our "NO TRAFFIC ZONES" around the school. On school days only, our school parking lot and parts of Oketo and Osceola Avenues will be closed to all car traffic from 7:55 to 8:20 AM to provide the necessary safety for all students.

After the first two days of school, students may enter the building from any door on Osceola or the parking lot. The doors will open at 8:05 AM. Bike riders may lock their bikes on the racks located on the Oketo side of the parking lot by the Junior High entrance.

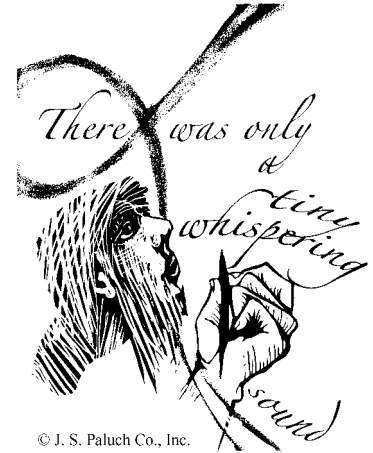

PRESENCE

It is difficult to be truly present to another. We speak of putting in an appearance or showing up. Even when we arrive, we are often distracted. We think ahead, or we review an unsettled past. Nonetheless, we are at our best when we truly show up. We are most fully ourselves when we are absorbed in something worthy of us: creative work, good conversation, prayer. In these instances we are wholly ourselves and wholly outside ourselves.

Elijah knew this kind of engagement. He was one of God's great prophets. In today's first reading, he follows God's command to journey to that most holy place, Mount Horeb. And there in great silence, Elijah encounters God.

As for Peter and the apostles, they discover the presence of God after the storm at sea. They and the sea and the winds are stunned into silent reverence.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

In many church buildings constructed in the early twentieth century, there is a window or statue of Pope St. Pius X. Often, these windows were purchased with coins collected by grateful children, since in 1910 a decree admitted much younger children to First Communion. Before then, only teenagers were customarily confirmed and then admitted to the Eucharist. What we often think is ancient practice in fact sometimes has fairly shallow roots, in this case fewer than ten decades. For centuries, Communion had marked the end of formal religious education, but a hundred years ago, Pius X located it at the point at which a child could express a desire for the sacrament and receive it with understanding. In 1917 a new code of canon law determined that age to be about seven, and this practice was observed almost everywhere until the beginning of the Second Vatican Council forty years ago.

In a growing number of dioceses, recent practice has restored the sacramental order Pius X's generous decree upset, and increasingly confirmation is celebrated before First Communion. But the gift Pius gave to the children of the Roman Church remains firm: everywhere we admit children to the Lord's table. Where the traditional order has been restored, seven-year-old children are confirmed before First Communion.
