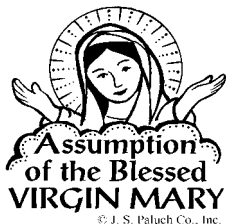

## Father Phil's Ramblings

I always have a problem with today's Gospel story, the encounter of the Canaanite woman and Jesus. Maybe you do, too! The exchange between the woman, a gentile, and Jesus seems at first to support the traditional hostility of the Jews toward all gentiles.

Yes, there is persistence on the woman's part even after Jesus tells her that He was sent for the lost sheep of the house of Israel. The woman persists and says, "Lord, help me." The dialogue continues, seemingly in a rather harsh and cruel way when Jesus refers to the woman as a dog. Imagine if you called a person, a dog. We have many harsh, cruel and ugly words that we use to describe someone's ethnicity, race or culture. Probably just as cruel and ugly as calling someone a dog in Jesus' day.

So what does Jesus mean when he utters that nasty epithet? It is almost impossible to interpret this Gospel story accurately unless we credit Jesus with a sense of humor. Here is where the story -- the dialogue between the woman and Jesus -- lightens up.

Jesus says, "Let the children first be fed, for it is not right to throw good food to the dogs." The woman's response is refreshing indeed: "Yes, Lord, yet even the dogs eat the droppings from the children's crumbs." The woman's persistence and her faith were gifts that touched Jesus' heart. If only we had such great faith and were equally persistent in our prayer life. The entire exchange between Jesus and the gentile woman was prayer.

May we pray with faith, with persistence and with a sense of humor, as the woman did in her encounter with Jesus.

**Jesus:** "O woman, great is your faith! Let it be done for you as you wish."

Sometimes we think of Jesus as having this special divine cache of knowledge which provided Him with direction and inspiration during His human life. Yes, He was conceived by the Holy Spirit. But He was, as we profess, born of the Virgin Mary, a girl "from our side," as we might say.

Jesus, like us, had to learn what it was to be Who He was. Sound confusing? It must have been for Jesus too. Jesus was not some sort of divine automaton, programmed to do and say divine things in the guise of a human personality. Jesus had to come to a gradual self-awareness of the Mystery of His Person. That self-awareness was mediated through His human body, brain and the experiences which made Him Jesus of Nazareth.

It took years of prayer and personal enquiry, years of study of His Jewish traditions and the role of God in the life of His people. All this was assimilated into His own Personal Consciousness which was not just a "given" but was "formed" by innumerable influences.

We might speak of "the Spirit being at work in Him." Where the Spirit moves and lives, there is growth and deepening. Jesus Himself experienced that - as do we. Sometimes it is startling to hear people refer to "what we were taught in School" when they are confronted with the teachings and insights of Vatican II. Jesus also was "taught" by Mary, Joseph, His family, His Jewish tradition, etc. But the Spirit of God took Jesus into Mysteries which may have challenged Him or even frightened Him. Someone once wrote: "It is a frightening thing to fall into the hands of the living God!"

Is it possible that Jesus began slowly to realize that God's will to save went far beyond the borders of Jesus' own Jewish religious traditions: that He Himself had been sent not solely to the people of Israel but to the Canaanites and Samaritans as well - to the Romans - to all people of good will? And, strange to say: to all people of bad will as well!

And we? In what direction will the Spirit of God, the Spirit of Jesus, lead us - lead me? Like Jesus, we must grow in the realization of the universality of God's will to save all peoples. Maybe in the face of the persistent faith of people, of whatever religious tradition they may be, I like Jesus, will have to acknowledge that God is out to do the whole world good - GOOD!

August 15th is the Feast of the Assumption of Mary. It's also India's Independence Day. Is it, in some sense, the assumption of India with Mary. After all, she is the patroness of India.

There I go again...
