Father Phil's Ramblings

There have been many rumors circulating about the situation concerning the appointment — or lack thereof — of a new pastor for St. Juliana. As of this article we do not — and I stress the word NOT — have a pastor. I would like to share with you the timeline for the search for a pastor.

January 2005: I asked to see Cardinal George concerning my retirement. Priests who reach the age of 70 are required to retire; I will turn 70 this November and I felt that June 30th — the end of our fiscal year — would be the most appropriate time to retire. The Cardinal agreed and sent me a letter of confirmation, in which he included proper words of gratitude for 44 years of ministry; the letter was well received.

March 2005: Members of the Priests' Personnel Board met with parishioners, parish staff and the priests. An exhaustive Parish Profile was prepared. The search for a new pastor was in motion and as a number of priests had expressed interest in coming to St. Juliana, I felt certain that by June 30th I would be retired and the new man would be off and running. Our parish would benefit from the new pastors fresh ideas and approach, and strong faith and love of the Lord and His family.

June 2005: In mid-June, while on vacation, I suffered a sudden and rather severe illness which ultimately resulted in surgery in early July. I also was notified that the priest who was most interested in our parish was assigned elsewhere.

Thus began a whole round of "guess who's coming to St. Juliana." There were appointments and rescinded appointments, rumors and speculation galore. Ultimately, I was appointed as temporary administrator of St. Juliana. I agreed to stay on in this role until a new pastor is appointed, one who wants to be here and actually arrives to stay.

Who will this be? I do NOT know.

I urge you to pray for the appointment of a new pastor. School starts in less than a week and many parish organizations begin their preparations to resume activity after the summer vacation.

† In your monthly envelope packet there are two envelopes, one yellow and the other green. The yellow envelope is labeled "Summer Projects." THE summer project this year is the repair of our air conditioning units both in the church and parish center. The cost of these repairs will exceed \$22,000. This is extraordinary expense and it occurred in the summer. So, as you enjoy the cool comfort of our air conditioned church, may you be extra generous with your yellow "Summer Projects" envelope.

The green envelope is for the added support of our school. We have 587 children enrolled this year and we have many added expenses and NEEDS to continue to make our school an excellent Catholic school.

So, when you see our children coming and going from St. Juliana, I seriously hope that they are polite and respectful. And may their smiles encourage you to be extra generous with our school development envelope.

"OH, THE DEPTH OF THE RICHES AND WISDOM AND KNOWLEDGE OF GOD!"

And St. Paul in his letter to the Romans continues: "How inscrutable are His judgments and how unsearchable His ways!

"For who has known the mind of the Lord or who has been His counselor?

Or who has given the Lord anything that he may be repaid?

"For from Him and through Him and for Him are all things.
To Him be glory forever. Amen."

In today's Good News from St. Matthew, Jesus asks his disciples: "Who do you say that I am?" In the Eucharistic liturgies of this coming week, we have the feasts of the Queenship of the Virgin Mary, St. Rose of Lima, St. Bartholomew, St. Louis IX of France, St. Joseph Calasanz, and St. Monica. Each of these people would have a different answer to that question of Jesus. And each of them would have a correct answer!

Have you ever had the experience of knowing someone for a long time and then discovering a quality, a strength, a beauty you had not adverted to during all those years? People always surprise us if we are attentive and aware in our relationship with them.

The problem is that we too easily form opinions about people—even people we are very close to—on the basis of initial encounters with them. Their physical appearance and personality characteristics are often "filtered" through experiences we have had with other people. For example, I might spontaneously like or feel attracted to someone whose laugh reminds me of my Mom's, or whose face reminds me of my Dad's. Even color can evoke feelings in us. Whenever I see someone who looks "Indian" I feel like talking to them or establishing some sort of contact.

What about God? We are introduced to God, most of us, when we are "lilla kids." It's a little like: "Say hello to God, Johnnie. Go ahead. Don't be shy. C'mon, shake hands with God." We know how clumsily as kids we meet adults who are not family members. We're more concerned with the "rubrics" of the encounter that with the person, i.e. the smile we should show, the extended hand, the verbal greeting we should use, etc.

As we grow older, we are invited to really know the people we meet, whether they are family members or new acquaintances. "Who is my Mom, really?" "Who is Uncle Joe?" Who is my brother?" "WHO IS THIS GOD I'VE KNOWN SINCE CHILDHOOD?" God can become a "formula" as easily as our relatives and friends or co-workers. To know someone implies investing time and spiritual energy, allowing that person to be who they really are.

Being married to someone or closely related to someone doesn't necessarily imply that we know who they are. The danger is that initial experiences can be generalized and become solidified. In knowing God, we run the same risk. In fact, it's often very difficult determining just who knows God and who doesn't.

Real love always has some form of HIDE AND SEEK in it, doesn't it? Playing with God has infinite possibilities!

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

One of the most memorable images from the reign of Pope John Paul II is not his shocked expression as he is hit by a bullet, but rather his tender meeting with his assailant, and his forgiveness. It is far more compelling because, although people are struck by bullets every day, true reconciliation is in relatively short supply. An outside observer might list attempting to kill the pope as an unforgivable sin, but of course we know that forgiveness of sin is woven deeply into our tradition of living as Christ did.

Interestingly enough, the Church took a hard line on these matters early on. Until the second century, people expected Christ's return in the near future, so they deferred judgment to him. Soon, however, bishops began to grant forgiveness for sin after baptism, but only once. What we know as the sacrament of penance takes its life from Jesus' work of reconciliation, but just as scripture shows Jesus forgiving people in one life-changing encounter, so the church granted one chance only. Great sins were the target, such as idolatry, adultery, and murder. Penance was lengthy, difficult, and public, and the bishop was in charge of the process. For the next several weeks, we'll look at subsequent creative and helpful changes in the celebration of this sacrament.
