Father Phil's Ramblings

Who is Jesus? AND Which Jesus will I follow?

In last week's Gospel, Jesus asks Peter, "Who do people say that I am? AND Who do you say that I am?" The same questions should be asked of each of us, "Who do you say that I am?" What is your answer? Do we say that Jesus is the Lord? Do we answer that Jesus is God's Son? Each of those answers is correct if answered in the affirmative.

But the answer that I believe in firmly is, "Jesus is my Brother." That answer makes today's Gospel story much more challenging. "Which Jesus will I follow?" Jesus as my Brother challenges me to love, care for and serve men and women in God's family.

But Jesus has many faces -- many sides. Throughout the centuries since Jesus presence, He has been continually misinterpreted, often in the image of the secular culture of the time. Scholars have made Him a wandering Stoic philosopher, a Jewish magician or a day dreamer. People bend Him left and right, activist and pacifist, pro life or pro choice.

But the question still remains, Which Jesus will we follow? And how do we know we are following the real Jesus? Quite a few questions, but questions that should be answered by all those who profess to be Jesus' followers.

If Jesus is our Brother then we should be willing to go to Him when we are hurting and when we are doubting, but we should also be willing to accept His challenge to change our self-centeredness and question our values.

Which Jesus do you follow? May it be the Jesus that we recognize as a true and loving brother who loves us and challenges us because of that love.

“What Can One Give In Exchange For His Life?”

“Do not conform yourselves to this age but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that **YOU MAY DISCERN** what is the will of God, what is good and pleasing and perfect.” (St. Paul to the Romans)

Ah, there’s that word again - discernment. That’s a keynote of Ignatian spirituality - to discern the various spirits at work in us as individuals and as a culture. The presupposition is that spirits do move us towards good or evil. The question is not about the reality of the devil but how we are able to sift the **SPIRIT OF GOD** from the plethora of other “spirits” which seem to motivate our age, our society, our culture.

“Do not conform yourselves to this age...” Why not? It’s a heck of a lot easier to do that, because then we are always “cool” or “with it” or “popular” or “up to date” or “trendy” or, and this may be the most important of all, **RELEVANT!!!**

It’s hard to swim upstream (just ask a salmon!) to be the “odd man or woman out.” And especially when something is couched in scientific terms or statistical survey-results, it’s very difficult to be the person who “needs more time or reflection or investigation” to reach a personal opinion about something.

Or, it could be that reaching a personal opinion about some things is **IRRELEVANT**. Hmmmmmm....

“...Be transformed by the renewal of your mind.” Now often enough, that takes study, enquiry, discussion, dialogue, debate, and silent reflection. In today’s world, we are given answers to questions we haven’t even asked yet! Or, we are told that if we are going to ask a question it should be asked in this or that particular way, if it’s going to be **RELEVANT**.

From the time we, as youngsters, become aware that it’s necessary to be acceptable in order to be part of the “in” group, we are searching for relevancy. Learning or practicing discernment is not easy in today’s world, where the media can convey to us all sorts of opinions and beliefs and rumors and conjectures and “scientific truths.”

“...That you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and pleasing and perfect.” No, it’s not easy, but it is too precious a thing to leave to people who have no experience of God and God’s **CONSOLATIONS**. To discern God’s will is to move with God’s rhythm, to know the romance of God’s Heart - to know that God lives and is the beginning and end of all human history and culture.

A society that denies God’s intervention in human history cannot discern what is the will of God. And why would it even make the effort?
