Father Phil's Ramblings

Summer is almost over and we begin another school year. Tomorrow, we celebrate the last holiday of summer, Labor Day. On this day, we are fortunate to rest and enjoy ourselves. We should be grateful to live in a country that urges us to rest on "Labor" Day.

Tomorrow, though, we should be truly grateful to be able to work; to receive a day's just wages; to have a work environment that is healthy. The RCIA Is Ours!

You may have noticed during the course of the year, that whenever I "sign" one of my reflections in the bulletin, I like to add to my name: "RCIA Moderator." It's not a status symbol. Each one of you could as easily add the title to your name - and with profound implications for your life in St. Juliana Parish.

As the time for beginning the formal RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults) program draws near, I always find myself wondering if there will be candidates for the program. How does one "advertise" RCIA? T.V. time, National Public Radio, a huge advertising-blimp hovering over the neighborhood, hand-bills, etc., etc.?

Last year, I had written pithy advertisements for RCIA and had Claudette adorn them with her wonderful creativity and computer skills for the parish bulletin. But, as I discovered, our bulletin is an "in-house" newsletter.

Relief came to me when I reflected, as I had last year, that: **The RCIA is not mine. It is ours.**

We all help create the "spirit" and "attraction" of our 'faith.' And more fundamentally, we all help reveal the movements of the Holy Spirit in all our parish activities. St. Juliana Parish, at every level, is a people on a mission. It is not an "accident" of history that we find ourselves in these Faith-circumstances at this time of our lives. We are the "incarnated" invitation to "seek the Lord Jesus."

RCIA needs testimonials from the adult Christians who live here. You know how we recommend a good restaurant or a good movie or a good place for a vacation. Well, RCIA has to be recommended by us who live it as a daily reality. No one will commit herself/himself to an extended catechetical program (a little more than six months!) and ultimate initiation in the Catholic-Christian faith-tradition unless that faith-life is seen and felt in the "vibrations" of parish organizations, Liturgies, bereavement ministrations, marriages, next door neighborliness, smiles, handshakes, etc.

Look around your lives and the lives of your extended family and friends here at St. Juliana. Maybe you want to share the Good News of your life here with someone you love, someone you care about - a son or daughter-in-law, a spouse, a person who once was a Catholic-Christian but who, for some reason drifted away, perhaps even in anger or with hurt feelings.

The RCIA is catechism by the whole parish for the whole parish. Catechists can only point to a living reality. Ultimately, the Holy Spirit moving and grooving in us and through us is the only real "moderator" of the RCIA.

The RCIA Program will begin on October 2nd at 10:00 am. Sessions will be in the Pastoral Center (Northwest Corner of Osceola and Touhy).
