Father Phil's Ramblings

When I was thirsty... You gave me a drink!!

Those words were spoken by Jesus in his parable of the Judgment Day. I always like to believe that we will be judged by just such words and feeling; providing a drink or caring for the sick, or welcoming strangers, or freeing prisoners. Such actions are real and down to earth. Yes, we should pray, go to Mass and make novenas, but eating and drinking are essential for sustaining life.

Over the past two weeks we have seen countless people in storm-ravaged New Orleans begging for a drink of water. Without water we quickly die a painfully slow death of dehydration. When I saw people lining up to get cases of water and ice and when I hear of one man who was rationing his supply of water, I could not help but hear Jesus' words, "When I was thirsty..."

Have you ever been thirsty for a cool drink of water? I am sure that most -- if not all -- of us have experienced thirst at some point in our lives. On a warm day in the 80s, nothing would be better than a glass of cold-cold water.

As you are transfixed before the television set watching people -- young and old and little babies, too -- surrounded by water, neck-deep in water, yet desperately waiting in line for water, say a prayer of thanks. And if you have not yet done so, send a check to Catholic Charities for the victims of the hurricane.

We never know when we will be thirsty again, but all **WE** have to do is turn on the tap or reach into the refrigerator for a bottle of cold, clear water. When we are thirsty... May someone give us a drink of cool-cool water.

"RCIA...and I"...Sometimes and the "I" has to stand alone. Entering into the Rite of Christian Initiation is an "adult" thing. It's "adult" because a person is deciding to make enquiries, ask questions, mull over thoughts and feelings; maybe even engage in a little friendly and controversy - and all for the sake of arriving at the Will of God.

The motivation for entering into all this could come from a variety of different sources: a Catholic spouse; a chance meeting with a Catholic at the office or on the golf course; a highly critical article about the Catholic Church in a newspaper or a news item on TV; a reminiscence from a long-forgotten Catholic childhood; a personal or even national tragedy; or any other movement of the spirit of god Who "broods over the world" in loving compassion.

Fifteen Years' Wages vs. Three Months' Wages

The eyes of the disciples of Jesus would have popped wide open in disbelief when they heard this story of their Guru. Some of them might have stifled laughter. Imagine a servant who owed his employer about \$10,000,000, according to some calculation of the currency of the time! Big bucks, no?

That compared with three months' wages of a day-laborer (scholars calculate a denarius as a day's wage). You can imagine the varied reactions to the story of Jesus: disbelief, guffaws, raised eyebrows, behind-the-hand whispers, etc.

"Lord, if my brother sins against me, how often must I forgive? As many as seven times?" Jesus answered, "I say to you, not seven times but seventy times seven times!" There is the same hyperbole in Jesus' direct response to Peter as there is in the story of the "unforgiving servant." When Jesus wants to make a point, He's not afraid to use spiritual hyperbole. Remember His statement: "If your hand causes you to sin, cut it off! Better to go into heaven handless than to burn in hell with both hands!"

The dictionary tells us that one meaning of "hyperbole" is: "an obvious and intentional exaggeration." You know, when you stop to think about it - and that's just what we're doing, isn't it? - God, in a profound way, is a "Hyperbole!" Jesus doesn't go around saying: "Two plus two equals four...what goes up must come down...the sun's rays are warm...if you don't eat, you feel hungry...an eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth."

GOD IS ONE GREAT BIG HYPERBOLE!!!

Sez God: "You want love? I'll show you love! Pressed down, shaken together, over-flowing!" "You want power? I'll show you power! Lazarus, come on down!" "You want mystery? I'll show you mystery! Peter, get out here and walk on this water with me!" **"YOU WANT FORGIVENESS? I'LL SHOW YOU FORGIVENESS! CAIPHAS, PONTIUS PILATE, JUDAS, PETER, I FORGIVE YOU!"**

Oh, c'mon, Guru-ji, isn't that a bit much? There's no need to be so extravagant...so, so "hyperbolic." But, then again, that is the way you do things, isn't it? You live outside of our categories; your love for the world cannot even be imagined by us. Compared to you, we are like "nit-pickers" when it comes to forgiving and forgetting hurts, real or imagined.

Many of us live with a belief that God will, in the end, "settle the score" for us regarding our enemies, the people who have hurt us - be they personal or familial or national. The problem is that God's love is notorious, positively "hyperbolic," intentionally exaggerated. It causes us to go: "Whoooooeeee!" If we didn't have the life of Jesus Christ to witness to that Divine Love, we would surely limit God's love to what we can comprehend. Often, that's of the "two plus two equals four" variety. But God's love is the BIG BANG, not in theory but in reality.

Maybe it's good to remind ourselves of that on September 11th, and as we recover from the recent disaster and continue to pray for peace in the Middle East.

"You wicked servant! I forgave you your entire debt (\$10,000,000) simply because you begged me to. Should you not have pity on your fellow servant (\$300), as I had pity on you."

Sometimes, forgiveness seems like "hyperbole."

Please return the bottles before any of the Masses on the weekend of October 29th & 30th.

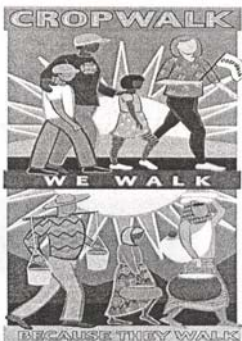
Archdiocese to Implement New Child Safety Program
