## “For My Thoughts Are Not Your Thoughts, Nor Are Your Ways My Ways, Says The Lord.”

So true...so true! If only God would follow our rules and behavioral patterns, it would be a lot easier to put up with God. We can understand: “do good and I’ll save you.” That sort of fits into our human, conceptual frame-work: “You be nice and keep the rules and I’ll be nice to you.” Easy enough, no?

But then we find God saying through Isaiah: “As high as the heavens are above the earth, so high are my ways above your ways and my thoughts above your thoughts.” Now what’s that supposed to mean?!

I must have been 15-16 years old when this incident occurred. The members of the St. Ignatius dance band, the Melody Knights (vintage around 1956), were gathered at our band director’s home in Tinley Park for a picnic. Jack and his wife Mat opened their home to us every year for an end of the year romp. Jack and Mat had 6 kids, all pre-pre-teens. A sweet lot of fun and mischief.

Well, one of the kids (his, not us!!) was really acting up and interfering with our ‘pre-adult goings on. At one point, I had had enough from him, so I said: “You know Brian, if you keep acting up like that, your Mom is going to punish you!” Mat was nearby in the kitchen and overheard my remark. She immediately said to me: “Bob, don’t threaten him that way. I’m not going to punish him. Don’t use me to frighten him.” That’s all said, just that matter-of-factly.

Now to what purpose has a “domestic” event like that stayed in my memory? I can’t exactly recall what feelings I had when Mat said that. Embarrassment? Irritation? Anger at Brian? Probably a mixture of all of those. Over the years, Mat’s reaction has, in its own way, helped shape my experience of God. Oh, there could be endless discussions about the proper way to discipline kids, but in the end, Mat’s: “Bob, don’t tell him I’m going to punish him...don’t use me to frighten him” has a lot of the divine in it, doesn’t it?

An interesting discussion ensued in my dentist’s office the other day. Another patient had asked my dentist friend and fellow-musician if God heard the prayers of atheists. The matter was referred to “Father Bob” in the waiting room. My first reaction was to why would an atheist want to pray in the first place?! But, as I reflected on it, it seemed obvious: Why wouldn’t God hear the prayer of an atheist? Prayers come in so many different forms: tears, sighs, groans of pain, laughter, deep silences, hugs, kisses, worry about kids, compassion with a friend suffering from cancer. God hears far more than the protestation: “God, I don’t believe in you!”

“Can you hear me now?” is more than a telephone ad. It’s the primordial human cry directed to “the One out there.” What a joy to discover: “You **CAN** hear me everywhere and in every breath I take!”

“Take what is yours and go. What if I wish to give this last one the same as you? Or am I not free to do as I wish with my own money? Are you envious because I am generous?”

And Jesus said: “Thus, the last will be first, and the first will be last.”

And some humans say: “Hey! That’s not fair! C’mon! Follow the rules!”

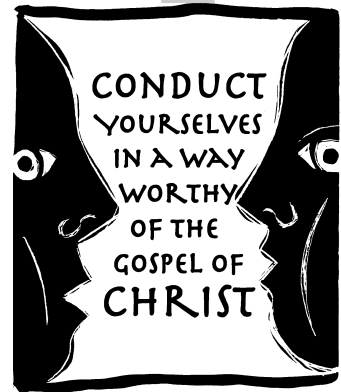

# THE CURSILLO IS COMING!!!!

## IS GOD CALLING YOU AS SAMUEL WAS CALLED?

Do You feel emptiness, a void or a longing to feel closer to God? Are you like so many of us who attend church, say prayers and have great intentions to someday really getting to know Jesus. Five million folks, including myself, have been right where you are and have done something positive about it.

It all starts with a Catholic movement called Cursillo, which means "Short Course in Christianity." Cursillo begins with a dynamic three-day weekend, separate for men and women. On the weekend, you will hear and participate in a series of presentations from ordinary folks who were where you are today. These ordinary folks have learned to succeed in improving their relation with the Lord. What is unique about the weekend is that you are given tools to help you to continue to maintain and improve your relationship with the Lord and your community in Christ for the rest of you life.

Since the first Cursillo weekend in 1940's, the Cursillo movement has spread across the world and is now present in 60 countries with some 5 million Catholics having lived the three days. Most of those who have attended asked themselves why they waited so long.
